If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. 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**ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE**

**THIS MATTER** was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 28, 2017, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On August 29, 2017, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

**Count 1:**

On or about September 29, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file an addendum to her 2016 P1 Report within seven days of receiving notice from the filing officer that her 2016 P1 Report was incomplete.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING**

First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. 

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION**

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on August 11, 2017, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On October 18, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Division of Elections (“Division”) alleging Mary Estime-Irvin (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a candidate for State Representative, District 107, in the 2016 election. Respondent's Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form ("DS-DE 9") was filed with the Division on October 2, 2015. Respondent appointed herself as her campaign treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 1)<sup>1</sup>

3. By letter dated May 25, 2017, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following alleged violation:

**Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2016 candidate for the office of State Representative, acting as her own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer’s report, as alleged in the complaint.

4. By letter dated October 5, 2015, Kristi Reid Bronson, Division of Elections, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Respondent that her name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates who file reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (“EFS”) and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to access the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1)<sup>2</sup>

5. Ms. Bronson's October 5, 2015 letter further advised Respondent that all the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on the Division's website and directed Respondent to print a copy of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 3)

6. Respondent's 2016 P1 Report covering the dates of June 1, 2016, through June 24, 2016, was due on July 1, 2016. Respondent filed a 2016 P1 Report on July 11, 2016, however, it was incomplete. (Attachments A and B)

7. On July 28, 2016, the Division sent notification to Respondent that her 2016 P1 Report was incomplete and Respondent had seven days from receipt of the notice to correct the errors on the attached Error Report and file an amended 2016 P1 Report. The letter also stated that if the information was reported accurately, Respondent should provide a written explanation to the Division addressing the issues noted in the Error Report. (ROI Exhibit 3)<sup>3</sup>

8. On August 15, 2016, the Division sent notification to Respondent that her 2016 P1 Report was incomplete and Respondent had seven days from receipt of the notice to correct the errors on the attached Error Report and file an amended 2016 P1 Report. (ROI Exhibit 4)

9. On September 20, 2016, the Division sent a "Final Notice" to Respondent notifying her that her 2016 P1 Report remained incomplete and Respondent had seven days from receipt of the notice to correct the errors on the attached Error Report and file an amended 2016 P1 Report. The letter also stated that if the information was reported accurately, Respondent should provide a written explanation to the Division addressing the issues noted in the Error Report. The Division's September 20, 2016 letter was confirmed delivered on September 22, 2016. (ROI Exhibit 5)

10. As of August 7, 2017, Respondent has failed to correct the errors identified by the Division and file an amended 2016 P1 Report. (ROI Exhibit 6)

11. Investigator Spore attempted to contact Respondent three times at the phone number Respondent listed on her DS-DE-9. On two occasions, Investigator Spore received a message that the phone number was not accepting incoming calls. On the third occasion, Investigator Spore began to leave a message and before she could finish, she heard a beep and click that sounded like the voicemail had stopped recording. (Attachment C)

12. Based upon the information above, it appears Respondent failed to file an amended 2016 P1 Report correcting errors identified by the Division on her 2016 P1 Report within seven days of receiving notification that the report was incomplete.

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<sup>3</sup> Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Fla. Stat. does not require a campaign treasurer to provide a written explanation to the Division addressing the issues noted in an Error Report if the information was reported accurately.

13. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1<sup>st</sup> DCA 1995).

14. The above facts show Respondent was a candidate for State Representative, District 107, in the 2016 election. Respondent filed her 2016 P1 Report on July 11, 2016, however, it was incomplete. On July 28, 2016, August 15, 2016, and September 20, 2016, the Division sent a letter notifying Respondent that her 2016 P1 Report was incomplete and that she had seven days from receipt of the notification to correct the errors and file an amended 2016 P1 Report. The Division's September 20, 2016 notification was confirmed delivered on September 22, 2016. As of August 7, 2017, Respondent has failed to file an amended 2016 P1 Report correcting the errors identified by the Division.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following:

**Count 1:**

On or about September 29, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file an addendum to her 2016 P1 Report within seven days of receiving notice from the filing officer that her 2016 P1 Report was incomplete.



On October 18, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statute:

Section 106.07(2)(b)1, Florida Statutes, failure to timely make necessary amendments to the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer’s report.

**I. Preliminary Information:**

1. Respondent was a candidate in 2016 for the office of State Representative, District 107. Respondent received 34.76% of the vote in the Democratic primary election, to finish second in a field of two candidates.
2. Complainant is the Division of Elections (Division).
3. Respondent’s filing officer is Kristi Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.

**II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(2)(b)1, Florida Statutes:**

4. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to timely make necessary amendments to a 2016 P1 campaign treasurer’s report.
5. On October 2, 2015, Respondent filed the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9 form) with the Division. Respondent appointed herself as campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9 form, refer to Exhibit 1.
6. On October 5, 2015, Complainant mailed Respondent a letter acknowledging receipt of the DS-DE 9 form, and informing her that her name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. To view a copy of the October 5, 2015 acknowledgment letter, refer to Exhibit 2.
7. On July 28, 2016, the Division mailed Respondent notification that the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer’s report was incomplete. This letter was sent to the address Respondent provided on her DS-DE 9 form; Exhibit 1. Attached to the notification letter was a copy of the detailed error report. To review a copy of the July 28, 2016 notification letter and error report, refer to Exhibit 3.

8. On August 15, 2016, the Division mailed Respondent a second notification that the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer's report was incomplete. This letter was sent to the address Respondent provided on her DS-DE 9 form; Exhibit 1. Attached to the notification was a copy of the detailed error report. To review a copy of the August 15, 2016 notification letter and error report, refer to Exhibit 4.

9. On September 20, 2016, the Division mailed Respondent a certified letter titled "Final Notice" informing her that the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer's report was incomplete, and included a delivery confirmation receipt. This letter was also sent to the address Respondent provided on her DS-DE 9 form; Exhibit 1. Attached to the final notice letter was a copy of the detailed error report. To review a copy of the September 20, 2016 final notice letter with delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 5.

10. An e-mail was sent to the Division on August 1, 2017, asking if Respondent had satisfactorily amended the 2016 P5 campaign treasurer's report. An e-mail was sent from the Division on August 7, 2017. Ms. Kristi Willis typed "No", in the original e-mail asking if Respondent had satisfactorily amended the 2016 P5 report. To review the August 7, 2017 e-mail, refer to Exhibit 6.

#### IV. FEC History:

11. Respondent has had multiple automatic-fine cases before the Florida Elections Commission (Commission). In the matter of FEC 16-085, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$100.00, and issued a default final order. In the matter of FEC 16-175, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$50.00, and issued a default final order. In the matter of FEC 16-176, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$425.91, and issued a default final order. In the matter of FEC 16-536, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$586.25, and issued a default final order. In the matter of FEC 16-578, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$50.00, and issued a default final order. In the matter of FEC 16-600, the Commission upheld the automatic-fine of \$50.00, and issued a default final order.


12. Respondent was offered several opportunities to make comments regarding the findings of this investigation. Respondent has not returned telephone calls. A questionnaire-affidavit was returned by the post office, stating there was "no such number", however, other correspondence was successfully delivered to the address on file. I am unable to ascertain whether she has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*.

13. In the October 5, 2015 acknowledgment letter, Respondent was informed that all of the Division's publications were available online at the Division's website. In the letter, Respondent was admonished as follows: **It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, *Calendar of Reporting Dates*, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida**

**Administrative Code; Exhibit 2.**

14. On October 2, 2015, Respondent filed her Statement of Candidate for Florida State Representative, District 107 acknowledging that she had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. To view a copy of the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 7.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. ### **Timely Filing**

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

### **Electronic Receipts**

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.




**Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2016 candidate for the office of State Representative, acting as her own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2016 P1 campaign treasurer's report, as alleged in the complaint.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will make a written recommendation (Staff Recommendation or SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge respondent with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed. You and the complainant will receive notice at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.

Please note that all documents related to this matter will be mailed to the above address unless you **notify us of a new address**. Also, please remember that complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes, are **confidential** until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause.



### **Timely Filing**

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

### **Electronic Receipts**

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.
