This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 minutes to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 *minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing*. The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

SUMMARY: Kimberly Dugger was a candidate for State Representative, District 19, in the 2020 elections. James M. Stege was her treasurer.

Kimberly Dugger is appealing the fine. According to the treasurer, Mr. Stege, they were issued a \$50 fine for the late G6 report, which he initially paid from his personal funds. He claims he was unaware that the fine had to be paid by the candidate. Upon receipt of a second notice, they paid the fine from Ms. Dugger's personal account. Mr. Stege states they received a letter on November 23, 2020, showing a \$500 fine for the G6 report. Mr. Stege claims he was contacted by Ms. Sheena Baker on December 8, 2020, and told that their payment of \$50 was accepted. They were also advised to write a letter explaining their position. He notes that the "\$500 fine at this point in time and after an unsuccessful campaign, places undue hardship on Ms. Dugger for a one-day (actually about 12 hours) delay (over a weekend when your office was closed)." Mr. Stege asks the Commission to accept their \$50 payment as payment in full.

- The 2020 G6 Original Report covers the period from 10/17/20-10/29/20; it was due on 10/30/20.
- The 2020 G6 Queued Transaction Report shows that it was created and filed on 10/31/20 at approximately 10:42 am. The report was also amended on 11/10/20 and 12/28/20.
- Kimberly Dugger reported receiving 21 contributions while making 3 expenditures.
- The Division of Elections provided one note that pertains to Kimberly Dugger's 2020 G6 report. On 12/08/20, Ms. Baker from the Division spoke with Ms. Dugger and Mr. Stege regarding the \$50 payment and explained the corrected fine amount \$500. The Division also sent a letter dated 12/30/20 stating that the \$50 check was returned to Ms. Dugger due to the "appeal of the corrected fine amount of \$500 for the G6 report."

Ms. Willis:

As Campaign Treasurer for Ms. Dugger, I would like to explain the circumstances surrounding Ms. Dugger's payment of \$50 for our late submission of report G6. This payment has been made – twice actually.

As Campaign Treasurer, I initially paid the \$50 fine with a personal check, since your letter stated **the \$50** fine must be paid from 'personal funds', but not specifically from the Candidate's personal funds. It does say that the Campaign may not use Campaign Funds for such a fine, but it does not indicate that I, as Treasurer, could not pay the fine with my own personal check. I do now note that the Florida Statutes requires the candidate to personally pay.

Indeed, I attempted to call your office on Monday November 11 to determine if I could pay the amount, but was placed on hold for over 45 minutes before realizing it was Veterans Day. I was doing what I could to make the payment in a timely fashion. Please review the language of your Division's letter in detail to help understand why I would have made this presumption of payment.

On November 18, 2020, your office sent another letter to Ms. Dugger and to myself indicating the need for a payment of the **\$50 fine**, 'such fine shall be paid only from the personal funds of the candidate.' Upon receipt of this letter, we forwarded in short order a check from Ms. Dugger's personal account to your office.

Sometime after Thanksgiving, we received a letter dated November 23, 2020 from your office indicating a fine of \$500 was now required by your office for the one day late payment of our G6 report. Since we had paid the \$50 amount on time and according to your Division's request, our notice of the additional amount requested was not realized until we were contacted by your agent, Ms. Sheena Baker, by phone call on December 8, 2020. Ms. Baker accepted our \$50 payment, noted that in your files, and advised that we might want to write a letter to explain our position.

Please note the following:

- We have paid the \$50 fine as requested by your Department via two separate letters. We have closed out our campaign's account.
- We used no corporate or PAC funding for the campaign the Candidate, Ms. Dugger, depleted nearly \$8000 of her own funds as a retired school teacher to finance the campaign.
- 3) The \$500 fine at this point in time and after an unsuccessful campaign, places undue hardship on Ms. Dugger for a one-day (actually about 12 hour) delay (over a weekend when your office was closed) for late payment.

- 4) Our Revenue for G6 was only \$110.41 and our Expenses were \$1814.36.
- 5) Under the caption <u>Penalty for Late Filing</u>, your instructions to candidates which you distributed to all candidates upon qualification only mentions a \$50 fine for the first three days of tardiness and after that \$500 or the 25% amount, whicher is greater.

Please favorably consider this appeal for relief from the \$500 fine value for the minimal effect on the election system of this late filing and **accept our \$50 payment by Ms Dugger as payment in full**. We tried hard throughout the entire campaign to meet your requirements, we did as your instruction mandated, and we truly apologize for this error.

Because individuals seeking a publicly elected position on a political party executive file termination committee are not "candidates," such individuals are not required to file termination reports. **Termination Reports Not Required**

Penalty for Late Filing

Any reporting individual who fails to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater. (Section 106.0702(7), Fla. Stat.)

Incomplete Reports

Although the Division's Electronic Filing System will allow a candidate to file an incomplete report, an incomplete report is not in compliance with the Florida Statutes.

If a candidate or campaign treasurer files a report that is deemed incomplete, they will be notified by the filing officer by certified mail, or by another method using a common carrie that provides a proof of delivery as to why the report is incomplete. The candidate o campaign treasurer must file an addendum to the incomplete report within seven days c notification. The addendum must include all necessary information to complete the report

•, 12. The amount and nature of any separate interest-bearing accounts or certificates of deposit and identification of the financial institution in which such accounts or certificates of deposit are located.

13. The primary purposes of an expenditure made indirectly through a campaign treasurer pursuant to s. <u>106.021(3)</u> for goods and services such as communications media placement or procurement services, campaign signs, insurance, and other expenditures that include multiple components as part of the expenditure. The primary purpose of an expenditure shall be that purpose, including integral and directly related components, that comprises 80 percent of such expenditure.

(b) Multiple uniform contributions from the same person, aggregating no more than \$250 per calendar year, collected by an organization that is the affiliated sponsor of a political committee, may be reported by the political committee in an aggregate amount listing the number of contributors together with the amount contributed by each and the total amount contributed during the reporting period. The identity of each person making such uniform contribution must be reported to the filing officer as provided in subparagraph (a)1. by July 1 of each calendar year, or, in a general election year, no later than the 60th day immediately preceding the primary election.

(c) The filing officer shall make available to any candidate or committee a reporting form which the candidate or committee may use to indicate contributions received by the candidate or committee but returned to the contributor before deposit.

(5) The candidate and his or her campaign treasurer, in the case of a candidate, or the political committee chair and campaign treasurer of the committee, in the case of a political committee, shall certify as to the correctness of each report; and each person-so-certifying shall bear the responsibility for the accuracy and veracity of each report. Any campaign treasurer, candidate, or political committee chair who willfully certifies the correctness of any report while knowing that such report is incorrect, false, or incomplete commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. <u>775.082</u> or s. <u>775.083</u>.

(6) The records maintained by the campaign depository with respect to any campaign account regulated by this chapter are subject to inspection by an agent of the Division of Elections or the Florida Elections Commission at any time during normal banking hours, and such depository shall furnish certified copies of any of such records to the Division of Elections or Florida Elections Commission upon request.

(7) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

(8)(a) Any candidate or political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine as provided in paragraph (b) for each late day, and, in the case of a candidate, such fine shall be paid only from personal funds of the candidate. The fine shall be assessed by the filing officer and the moneys collected shall be deposited:

1. In the General Revenue Fund, in the case of a candidate for state office or a political committee that registers with the Division of Elections; or

2. In the general revenue fund of the political subdivision, in the case of a candidate for an office of a political subdivision or a political committee that registers with an officer of a political subdivision.

No separate fine shall be assessed for failure to file a copy of any report required by this section.

(b) Upon determining that a report is late, the filing officer shall immediately notify the candidate or chair of the political committee as to the failure to file a report by the designated due date and that a fine is being assessed for each late day. The fine is \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each special primary election, special election, primary election, and general election, the fine is \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the fine is \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. For reports required under s. <u>106.141</u>(8), the fine is \$50 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. Upon receipt of the report, the filing officer shall determine the amount of the fine which is due and shall notify the candidate or chair or registered agent of the political committee. The filing officer shall determine the amount of the fine due based upon the earliest of the following:

1. When the report is actually received by such officer.

- 2. When the report is postmarked.
- 3. When the certificate of mailing is dated.
- 4. When the receipt from an established courier company is dated.

5. When the electronic receipt issued pursuant to s. <u>106.0705</u> or other electronic filing system authorized in this section is dated.

Such fine shall be paid to the filing officer within 20 days after receipt of the notice of payment due, unless appeal is made to the Florida Elections Commission pursuant to paragraph (c). Notice is deemed complete upon proof of delivery of written notice to the mailing or street address on record with the filing officer. In the case of a candidate, such fine is not an allowable campaign expenditure and shall be paid only from personal funds of the candidate. An officer or member of a political committee is not personally liable for such fine.

(c) Any candidate or chair of a political committee may appeal or dispute the fine, based upon, but not limited to, unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file on the designated due date, and may request and shall be entitled to a hearing before the Florida Elections Commission, which shall have the authority to waive the fine in whole or in part. The Florida Elections Commission must consider the mitigating and aggravating circumstances contained in s. <u>106.265(2)</u> when determining the amount of a fine, if any, to be waived. Any such request shall be made within 20 days after receipt of the notice of payment due. In such case, the candidate or chair of the political committee shall, within the 20-day period, notify the filing officer in writing of his or her intention to bring the matter before the commission.

(d) The appropriate filing officer shall notify the Florida Elections Commission of the repeated late filing by a candidate or political committee, the failure of a candidate or political committee to file a report after notice, or the failure to pay the fine imposed. The commission shall investigate only those alleged late filing violations specifically identified by the filing officer and as set forth in the notification. Any other alleged violations must be separately stated and reported by the division to the commission under s. <u>106.25</u>(2).
