A hearing will be held in this case before the Florida Elections Commission **on February 23, 2021 at 8:30 am, EST**, or as soon thereafter as the parties can be heard.

If you wish to speak before the Commission, you will need to appear by webcam and will be sworn in remotely. Please be advised that the Commission will consider multiple cases, so you will need to wait until your case is considered. Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which motions to dismiss or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which motions to dismiss or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on December 1, 2020, in Tallahassee, Florida.


Respondent requested that the matter be continued.

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

SUMMARY: Bob Lynch is a candidate for State Representative, District 115 in the 2020 elections. Robert John Lynch, III is his treasurer.

Bob Lynch is appealing the fine claiming that he attempted to file the report on the due date but it was rejected. According to Mr. Lynch, he made multiple attempts to contact the Division for help regarding his report. He states that the Division gives a "grace period" to complete incorrect reports and notes that Division had his "complete records on June 11, 2020 and his report should have been deemed incomplete and not subject to a fine.

- The 2020 M5 Original Report covers the period from 05/21/20-05/31/20; it was due on 06/10/20.
- The 2020 M5 Queued Transaction Report shows that it was created and deleted on 06/11/20, created on 06/16/20 and filed on 06/17/20.
- Bob Lynch reported receiving 23 contributions, while making 2 expenditures.
- The Division of Elections does not have any notes that pertain to Bob Lynch's 2020 M5 report.

Dear Florida Elections Commission,

I am responding to the letter dated July 22, 2020 that I received on July 26, 2020 from Kristi Reid Willis regarding the \$1,176.25 fine I was assessed due to the late filing of my campaign treasurers report that was due on June 10, 2020.

Please consider this the formal appeal of this fine.

I attempted to file this report on the due date on the official website, <https://efs.dos.state.fl.us/CFOnlineFrmSet.Htm>. It was rejected. In my attempt to rectify the situation, I clicked on the "help" button which did not and still does not work.

On June 11, 2020, I called the Bureau of Election records seeking help. I was told that the only one who could help me was Kristi Reid Willis, the Chief of the Bureau of Election Records. When I asked for her direct number, I was told that it couldn't be given to me because they were too busy processing the candidate filing reports of the historic number of my fellow Democratic candidates for state House and Senate. I was given her email address instead.

I emailed her at 2:24PM alerting her to my situation and received a response at 4:11pm advising me to use the proper nomenclature for the upload of my file, something that is not listed anywhere on the official website.

I emailed Kristi again on June 12 at 12:07 and 12:08 AM with attached screen shots of the error messages I was receiving.

I emailed Kristi again on June 12 at 2:03PM seeking assistance and alerting her that I was not happy with potentially being fined even after following her instructions.

I emailed Kristi again on June 15 at 12:06PM asking for advice. She responded at 1:25PM asking me to send the file in question so that she could review it, which I did.

Kristi responded again on June 16 at 8:33AM alerting me to the problems with the file in question as well as referring me to instructions from a separate website, <https://dos.myflorida.com/media/694088/dsde111.pdf>

I attempted to follow the instructions and still my file was rejected, to which I alerted Kristi via email on June 16 at 10:09PM with an attached updated version of the file.

Kristi responded on June 17 at 8:36AM asking me if I considered entering the data into the system manually until I figured out what I was doing wrong.

I responded on June 17 at 8:43AM letting her know that I always prefer to automate things to eliminate errors and to build a sustainable platform going forward.

Kristi responded on June 17 at 8:52AM with further instructions on how to get the file accepted electronically and again referred me to the specs of the other website.

I attempted to follow those instructions, as well as hers, and yet the file kept getting rejected so I alerted her of this fact via email on June 17 at 8:57 AM and asked her if the file I had sent her via email had any errors.

Kristi responded on June 17 at 8:57 saying, and I quote: "I do not have the time to review your file in that detail." Which I found interesting seeing as she had the time to issue a fine to me.

I proceeded to input the data manually as she had instructed and still my file was not accepted so I called up the Bureau of Election Records and spoke with a gentleman who told me that the website did not have an actual error report that was visible to us candidates. He was quite patient and took a look at my file and alerted me to the errors which would finally rectify the situation.

I asked him for advice in how to actually get my automated file into a format that could be uploaded into the system directly and what he said next was incredibly disturbing. He told me that he couldn't give me any advice, but he could refer me to several Third Party Vendors listed on the website.

This is simply unacceptable. As a candidate and a taxpayer in Florida, state employees should not be referring me to Third Party Vendors that would charge me for simple information.

First time candidates in the State of Florida should not have to choose between inputting data manually, which is cumbersome, or using a Third Party Vendor that is cost prohibitive.

The failures in the state's Unemployment Benefits System are already widely publicized and now it is clear that we have another state website that was designed to fail and prevent Floridians from exercising their rights to run for state office.

I am happy to provide documentation that lays out all of the above but trust that this will not be necessary, and you will grant my appeal.

The Bureau of Election Records grants a grace period for Campaign Finance reports that are deemed "incomplete". The state had my complete records in their possession on June 11, 2020 and my report should have been deemed incomplete and not subject to fine.

Dear Mr. Lynch:

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was June 10, 2020.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
 - * \$50 per day for the first 3 days late
 - * \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late
 - * If the required report immediately precedes a primary and general election, the automatic fine is \$500 for each late day.


The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

- If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer, and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.




