ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 26, 2019, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On December 18, 2018, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Count 2:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information on a report that was required to be reported when he failed to file a 2016 Termination Report.

The Commission further finds there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by <u>consent order</u> where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an <u>informal hearing</u> held before the Commission, if you <u>do not</u> dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Sections 106.141(1) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, and no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on November 21, 2018, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation.

- 1. On March 14, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that David Wayne Bunk ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was an unsuccessful candidate for the Florida House of Representatives, District 11, in the 2016 primary election. Respondent's Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form was filed with the Division on March 14, 2016. (ROI Exhibit 1)¹
- 3. On August 9, 2018, the Executive Director sent Respondent notification that Commission staff would investigate the following sections of law:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.

¹ The Report of Investigation shall be referred to herein as "ROI."

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, failed to timely file his 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in his 2016 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

- 4. By letter dated March 16, 2016, Kristi Reid Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, Division of Elections, notified Respondent that his name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates who file reports with the Division are required to use the Division's Electronic Filing System ("EFS") and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to access the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1)²
- 5. Ms. Bronson's March 16, 2016 letter further advised Respondent that all the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on the Division's website, and directed Respondent to print a copy of the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other documents. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 3)

Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes.

- 6. The Division's referral alleged that Respondent failed to timely file his 2016 TR or file a notice of no activity because Respondent had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.
 - 7. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date. (Emphasis added)

² Kristi Reid Bronson is now known as Kristi Reid Willis.

- 8. Respondent's 2016 Termination Report ("TR") was due on November 28, 2016. Respondent failed to file a 2016 TR or notice of no activity on the due date. (Attachments A and B)
- 9. Investigator Spore subpoenaed copies of Respondent's campaign account records. Respondent's campaign account records show that Respondent had financial activity during the 2016 termination reporting period that he was required to report. (ROI Exhibit 6)
- 10. Based on the above information, it appears that Respondent was not required to file a notice of no activity with the filing officer for the 2016 termination reporting period. However, it also appears that Respondent was required to file a 2016 TR because he had reportable financial activity during the 2016 termination reporting period.

Sections 106.141(1), Florida Statutes.

- 11. Investigator Spore also investigated whether Respondent failed to timely file his 2016 TR reflecting the disposition of all campaign funds within 90 days of being defeated.
- 12. As noted above, Respondent's 2016 TR was due on November 28, 2016; however, Respondent failed to timely file a 2016 TR or notice of no activity. (Attachments A and B)
- 13. On November 29, 2016, the Division sent Respondent notification that he had not filed a 2016 TR, or notice that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable. (ROI Exhibit 3)
- 14. On January 12, 2017, the Division sent a letter to Respondent marked "Final Notice." The notification stated that the Division had not yet received Respondent's 2016 TR or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2016 termination reporting period, whichever was applicable. The Division's January 12, 2017 letter was confirmed delivered on January 13, 2017. (ROI Exhibit 4)³
- 15. On February 2, 2017, the Division sent a letter to Respondent marked "Final Notice." The notification stated that the Division had not yet received Respondent's 2016 TR or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2016 termination reporting period, whichever was applicable. The Division's February 2, 2017 letter was confirmed delivered on February 4, 2017. (ROI Exhibit 5)
- 16. As stated above, Respondent's campaign account records show that Respondent had reportable financial activity during the 2016 termination reporting period. Therefore, Respondent was required to timely file a 2016 TR showing the disposition of all remaining funds in his campaign account. (ROI Exhibit 6)

³ Even though the Division's January 12, 2017 letter was marked "Final Notice," it appears the letter was the second of three notifications the Division sent to Respondent.

- 17. During a September 6, 2018 telephone conversation, Respondent told Investigator Spore that during the campaign his treasurer was sick and had to be hospitalized, and Respondent had to take over the campaign treasurer's duties. Respondent added that he is not good with computers, does not own a computer, and had difficulty filing his campaign reports online. Respondent also told Investigator Spore that he filed reports using a computer at the library, and he called the Division's Help Desk for assistance almost every time he tried to file a report. (ROI Exhibit 8, Phone Log Entry 4)
- 18. As of December 12, 2018, Respondent has not filed a 2016 TR with the Division. (Attachment B)
- 19. Based on the information above, it appears Respondent was required to file a 2016 TR within 90 days of being defeated showing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds, but failed to do so. As of December 12, 2018, Respondent has failed to file a 2016 TR.
- 20. "Probable Cause" is defined as a reasonable ground of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 21. The above facts show Respondent was an unsuccessful candidate for the Florida House of Representatives, District 11, in the 2016 primary election. Respondent's 2016 Termination Report was due on November 28, 2016; however, Respondent failed to file a 2016 Termination Report or a notice of no activity on the due date. Because Respondent had reportable financial transactions during the 2016 termination reporting period, he was required to file a 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds. However, as of December 12, 2018, Respondent has failed to file his 2016 Termination Report.

Based on the foregoing, I recommend the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Count 2:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information on a report that was required to be reported when he failed to file a 2016 Termination Report.

I further recommend that the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

FLORIDA ELECTIONS COMMISSION REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

Case No.: FEC 17-108

Respondent: Wayne Bunk

Complainant: Division of Elections

On March 14, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period;

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, failing to timely file a 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information in a 2016 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

I. Preliminary Information:

- 1. Respondent was a candidate in 2016 for the office of Florida State Representative, District 11. He received 4.56% of the vote and came in fourth of four candidates in the primary election on August 30, 2016.
 - 2. Complainant is the Division of Elections (Division).
 - 3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

4. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not notifying the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.

5. On March 14, 2016, Respondent filed the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and

Designation of Campaign Depository (DE-DE 9 form) with the Division. He appointed David E. Cook as treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9 form, refer to Exhibit 1.

- 6. On March 16, 2016, Complainant mailed Respondent a letter acknowledging receipt of the DS-DE 9 form and informing him that his name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. To view a copy of the March 16, 2016 acknowledgment letter, refer to Exhibit 2.
- 7. The 2016 TR campaign treasurer's report was due on November 28, 2016. On November 29, 2016, the Division mailed Mr. Cook, with a copy mailed to Respondent, notification that the 2016 TR treasurer's report had not been filed. To review a copy of the November 29, 2016 notification, refer to Exhibit 3.
- 8. On January 12, 2017, the Division mailed a final notification with delivery confirmation to Mr. Cook, with a copy mailed to Respondent, that the 2016 TR treasurer's report had not been filed. To review a copy of the January 12, 2017 notification with delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 4.
- 9. On February 2, 2017, the Division mailed Respondent final notification with delivery confirmation that the 2016 TR treasurer's report had not been filed. To review a copy of the February 2, 2017 final notification with delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 5.
- 10. On August 10, 2018, Respondent's campaign bank account records were received as a result of a subpoena to First Federal Bank of Florida, Respondent's campaign depository listed on his DS-DE 9 form filed on March 14, 2016; Exhibit 1. A review of these records reflects there was financial activity during the 2016 TR reporting period; therefore, Respondent was required to file a 2016 TR report, not a notice-of-no-activity. To review the campaign bank account records, refer to Exhibit 6.
- 11. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes:

- 12. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to timely file a 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.
- 13. As previously discussed in paragraphs 7 through 9, the 2016 TR campaign treasurer's report was due on November 28, 2016. The Division mailed Respondent notifications that the report had not been filed.
- 14. As previously discussed in paragraph 10, Respondent's campaign bank account records were received as a result of a subpoena to Respondent's campaign depository. These records reflect there was financial activity during the 2016 TR reporting period, and Respondent was required to file a 2016 TR report.
- 15. Respondent's campaign finance activity reflects the following three expenditures during the 2016 TR reporting period, totaling \$48.23.

- 16. As of the date of this report, a 2016 TR campaign treasurer's report has not been filed with the Division. To review Respondent's filing history, refer to Exhibit 7.
- 17. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

IV. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

- 18. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information in a 2016 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.
- 19. As previously discussed in paragraph 10, Respondent's campaign bank account records reflect there was financial activity during the 2016 TR reporting period, and Respondent was required to file a 2016 TR report.
- 20. As previously discussed in paragraph 15 and Table 1, Respondent's campaign finance activity reflects three expenditures were made during the 2016 TR reporting period, which totaled \$48.23.
- 21. As previously discussed in paragraph 16, as of the date of this report, a 2016 TR campaign treasurer's report has not been filed with the Division.
- 22. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

V. FEC History:

23. In the matter of <u>FEC 16-311</u>, the Commission, at its meeting held on November 16, 2016, upheld the automatic-fine of \$550.00, and issued a default final order. As of the date of this report, Respondent has not paid this fine. In the matter of <u>FEC 16-598</u>, the Commission, at its meeting held on November 16, 2016, upheld the automatic-fine of \$20.47, and issued a default final order. As of the date of this report, Respondent has not paid this fine.

Conclusion:

24. In a telephone interview on September 6, 2018, Respondent stated that during his campaign, his treasurer was sick and had to be hospitalized, and Respondent took up the duties of

campaign treasurer. He stated he does not own a computer, and had to use the computers at the library in order to electronically file his campaign treasurer's reports. He often called the Division of Elections help desk, as he had difficulty filing most of his reports online. To review the investigative telephone log, refer to Exhibit 8.

- 25. Respondent did not return a questionnaire-affidavit or a final interview telephone call, and I am unable to ascertain whether Respondent has reach Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*.
- 26. In the March 16, 2016 acknowledgment letter, Respondent was informed that all of the Division's publications were available online at the Division's website. In the letter, Respondent was admonished as follows: It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, Calendar of Reporting Dates, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida Administrative Code; Exhibit 2.
- 27. On March 14, 2016, Respondent's Statement of Candidate for Florida State Representative, District 11 was filed, acknowledging that he had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. To view a copy of the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 9.



Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update personal information. The enclosed sealed envelope contains confidential pin numbers for you. By copy of this letter, a confidential pin number to access the EFS was sent to your treasurer.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event this password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as What is your mother's maiden name?) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your termination report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was November 28, 2016.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

On March 14, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more legally sufficient allegations. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, failed to timely file his 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 11, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in his 2016 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will make a written recommendation (Staff Recommendation or SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge respondent with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold

one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed. You and the complainant will receive notice at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.

Also, please remember that complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes, are **confidential** until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause.





Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

The Division has previously notified you of the unfiled report or notification. Please file your report or notification. If the report or notification is not filed within 7 days of receipt of this letter, the Division will refer this matter to the Florida Elections Commission, which may impose civil penalties of up to \$1000 per violation, apart from that automatic fine provisions of s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) that are applicable only to campaign finance reports.

As we stated in the prior notices, even if you now file the report or notification, the untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.
