If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on January 24, 2023, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On October 3, 2022, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about March 14, 2022, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely file an addendum to the campaign's 2022 M1 Report within seven days after receiving notice from the Department of State, Division of Elections, that the report required amendment.

Count 2:

On or about January 6, 2022, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes, when he accepted a cash contribution in excess of \$50.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH

or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.07(2)(b)1., and 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 12, 2022, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On March 14, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections (“Division”), alleging that Kyle Gibson (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor. Respondent’s Statement of Candidate form (“DS-DE 84”) was filed on October 16, 2018. (ROI Exhibit 3)¹

3. By letter dated June 15, 2022, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, acting as his own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2022 M1 campaign treasurer’s report, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, may have certified the 2022 M1 campaign treasurer’s report was true, correct, and complete when it was not, based on a reported cash contribution in excess of the \$50 per campaign limit, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, may have accepted a cash contribution in excess of the \$50 per campaign limit, based upon a contribution reported during the 2022 M1 reporting period, as alleged in the complaint.

¹ The Report of Investigation is referred to herein as “ROI.”

4. On October 16, 2018, Respondent filed his Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form (“DS-DE 9”) appointing himself as treasurer for his campaign. (ROI Exhibit 2)

5. By letter dated October 18, 2018, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received his DS-DE 9 and that his name was placed on the 2022 active candidate list. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 1)

6. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (“EFS”) and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 1) The letter further advised Respondent that all of the Division’s publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the *Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 2)

Alleged Violation: Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes

7. Complaint alleged that Respondent violated Florida’s election laws by failing to timely file the required amendment to the campaign’s 2022 M1 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from the Division that the report was incomplete and required amendment.

8. The campaign’s 2022 M1 Report was filed on February 10, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 8, page 1) The report was incomplete when filed. *See Compl.*

9. The Division sent three letters notifying Respondent that the campaign’s report was incomplete and that Respondent was required to amend the report within 7 days of receipt of the notification. An Error Report showing why the report was incomplete was attached to each notification. (ROI Exhibits 5 & 6) The final notification was confirmed delivered. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 3)

10. Respondent was given multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff’s investigation but failed to do so. (ROI, p. 3, ¶¶15-16; ROI Exhibit 10) Respondent was not a first-time candidate. (ROI, p. 1, ¶1)

11. Respondent failed to timely file the required amendment to the campaign’s 2022 M1 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from the Division that the report was incomplete and required amendment.

Alleged Violation: Section 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes

12. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida’s election laws by accepting a cash contribution in excess of \$50. More specifically, Complainant alleged that Respondent accepted an excessive cash contribution from himself. (*See Compl.*, p. 3)

13. Respondent’s 2022 M1 Report shows one cash contribution in the amount of \$100.10 received from Kyle Gibson on January 6, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 7, page 2)

14. A subpoena was issued to Respondent's designated campaign depository to ascertain whether Respondent's campaign received an excessive cash contribution. Respondent's bank records show a cash deposit in the amount of \$100.10 received on January 6, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 9)

15. Respondent has not amended the report regarding the excessive cash contribution. (ROI Exhibit 7, page 6)

16. Respondent accepted a cash contribution in excess of \$50.

Alleged Violation: Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes

17. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by certifying that the campaign's 2022 M1 Report was true, correct, and complete when it was not, based on a reported cash contribution in excess of the \$50 per campaign limit.

18. Based on the above analysis, it appears that the excessive cash contribution was reported correctly as it was supported by Respondent's bank records. Therefore, it does not appear that Respondent certified that the campaign's 2022 M1 Report was true, correct, and complete when it was not.

19. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

20. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor and was acting as his own treasurer. Respondent failed to timely file the required amendment to the campaign's 2022 M1 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from the Division that the report was incomplete and required amendment. Respondent accepted a cash contribution in excess of \$50. It does not appear that Respondent certified that the campaign's 2022 M1 Report was true, correct, and complete when it was not.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes**, and find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about March 14, 2022, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely file an addendum to the campaign's 2022 M1 Report within seven days

after receiving notice from the Department of State, Division of Elections, that the report required amendment.

Count 2:



Pursuant to Section 106.25(2), Florida Statutes, on March 14, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) received information from the Division of Elections (Division) that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statute(s):

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, failure of the treasurer for a candidate or political committee to file an addendum to an incomplete report after receiving notice from the filing officer;

Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes: may have certified a campaign treasurer's report was true, correct, and complete when it was not; and

Section 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes: may have accepted a cash contribution in excess of the \$50.00 per campaign limit.

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent was a 2022 candidate for Governor. He withdrew his candidacy on September 1, 2022. Respondent was not a first-time candidate. To review the withdrawal letter and the Division's acknowledgment, refer to Exhibit 1.

2. An Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on October 16, 2018. Respondent was appointed as campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 2.

3. Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate with the Division on October 16, 2018, in which Respondent certified he had been provided access to read and understand Chapter 106, F.S. To review the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 3.

4. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 on October 18, 2018, advising Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to file by means of the Division's electronic filing system (EFS). Respondent was provided with a user identification number and initial password allowing access to the EFS.

5. The acknowledgement letter also advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida

Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter further advised that it was Respondent's responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To review the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 4.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(2)(b)(1), Florida Statutes:

6. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to file an amended report for the following campaign treasurer report after receiving notice from the filing officer: 2022 M1.

7. The Division sent correspondence to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 notifying Respondent that one or more campaign treasurer reports were incomplete. The correspondence included error reports referencing the following report: 2022 M1. To review the correspondence and error reports, refer to Exhibit 5.

8. On March 3, 2022, the Division sent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 notifying Respondent that one or more campaign treasurer reports were incomplete. The letter included an error report referencing the following report: 2022 M1. It was confirmed delivered on March 7, 2022. To review the "Final Notice," error report and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 6.

9. As noted above, the "Final Notice" was confirmed delivered on March 7, 2022. The Division filed the referral on March 14, 2022. By filing the referral, the Division affirmed that as of that date, the report at issue had not been amended to correct all errors identified by the Division. To review the report at issue, refer to Exhibit 7.

10. Respondent did not respond to the referral.

III. Alleged Violation of Sections 106.07(5) and 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes:

11. I investigated whether Respondent violated these sections of the election laws by certifying that the 2022 M1 report was true, correct, and complete when it was not or by accepting a cash contribution in excess of the \$50.00 per contributor, per campaign limit during the 2022 M1 reporting period.

12. The 2022 M1 report was due on February 10, 2022. Respondent filed it on February 10, 2022. By filing the report, Respondent certified that it was true, correct, and complete. To review the 2022 M1 report, refer to Exhibit 7. To review Respondent's filing history, refer to Exhibit 8.

13. In the 2022 M1 report, Respondent disclosed a cash contribution from himself in the amount of \$100.10 on January 6, 2022. The report has not been amended to change the amount or type of contribution. To review the pertinent part of the 2022 M1 report, refer to Exhibit 7, page 2.

14. I subpoenaed bank records from the designated campaign account depository. The records show that a \$100.10 cash deposit was made on January 6, 2022, as reported by

Respondent. There were no checks deposited into the account in the amount of \$100.10 during the relevant time period. To review the bank records, refer to Exhibit 9.

15. Respondent did not respond to the referral.

16. I attempted to contact Respondent on four occasions for the purpose of providing an opportunity to discuss the allegations made in the referral. As of the date of this report, neither my telephone calls nor emails have been returned. Therefore, I am unable to ascertain whether Respondent has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. To review the phone log and emails, refer to Exhibit 10.





On March 14, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, acting as his own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2022 M1 campaign treasurer's report, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, may have certified the 2022 M1 campaign treasurer's report was true, correct, and complete when it was not, based on a reported cash contribution in excess of the \$50 per campaign limit, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.09(1)(b), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2022 candidate for the office of Governor, may have accepted a cash contribution in excess of the \$50 per campaign limit, based upon a contribution reported during the 2022 M1 reporting period, as alleged in the complaint.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will prepare and present a written Staff Recommendation (SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge you, the Respondent, with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed upon you. Notice will be mailed to you and the Complainant at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.
