If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on January 24, 2023, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On October 12, 2022, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about October 8, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely file an addendum to the campaign's 2020 M5 Report within seven days after receiving notice from his filing officer that the report required amendment.

Count 2:

On or around July 10, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 M6 Report.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH

or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the sworn complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.07(2)(b)1.**, and **106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 16, 2022, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On August 27, 2020, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a sworn complaint from Jeffrey Modarelli (“Complainant”), alleging that Kyle Gibson (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2. Respondent’s Statement of Candidate form (“DS-DE 84”) was filed on February 13, 2020. (ROI Exhibit 2)¹

3. By letter dated June 15, 2022, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, acting as his own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2020 M5 campaign treasurer’s report, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2020 M6 reporting period.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, may have falsely reported or deliberately

failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the 2020 M6 reporting period.

4. On January 6, 2020, Respondent's filing officer provided Respondent with a weblink to Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2) On February 1, 2020, Respondent acknowledged that he had been provided access to read the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. (ROI Exhibit 2)

5. On February 13, 2020, Respondent filed his Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form ("DS-DE 9") appointing himself as treasurer for his campaign. (ROI Exhibit 1)

Alleged Violation: Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes

6. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by failing to timely file the required amendment to the campaign's 2020 M5 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from the filing officer that the report was incomplete and required amendment.

7. The campaign's 2020 M5 Report was filed on June 10, 2020. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 3) The report was incomplete when filed. *See Compl.*

8. On July 17, 2020, Respondent's filing officer sent a letter via certified mail notifying Respondent that the campaign's report was incomplete, and that Respondent was required to amend the report within 7 days of receipt of the notification. The letter set forth the reasons why the report was incomplete. Additionally, the filing officer emailed Respondent a prior copy of the letter dated June 29, 2020. (ROI Exhibits 4 & 5)

9. Respondent was given multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff's investigation but failed to do so. (ROI, pp. 2-3, ¶¶9, 13-14; ROI Exhibit 9)

10. Respondent failed to timely file the required amendment to the campaign's 2020 M5 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from his filing officer that the report was incomplete and required amendment.

Alleged Violation: Sections 106.07(7), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes

11. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed or by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the 2020 M6 reporting period.

12. Respondent's 2020 M6 Report was due to be filed by July 10, 2020; however, Respondent failed to timely file the report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. Respondent's filing officer sent two letters notifying Respondent that his report had not been received. (ROI Exhibit 7)

13. A subpoena was issued to Respondent's designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the relevant reporting period, i.e., June 1, 2020 – June 30, 2020. (ROI, p. 3, ¶12) Respondent's bank records show reportable financial activity during the relevant reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 8)

14. Respondent failed to include information in his 2020 M6 Report in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. As Respondent had financial activity during the relevant reporting period, Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer that he would not be filing his report. Respondent was not a first-time candidate. (ROI, p.1, ¶1)

15. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

16. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2. Respondent failed to timely file the required amendment to the campaign's 2020 M5 Report within 7 days of receiving notification from his filing officer that the report was incomplete and required amendment. Respondent failed to timely file his 2020 M6 Report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. As it appears that Respondent had financial activity during the relevant reporting period, Respondent failed to include information in his 2020 M6 Report in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Therefore, Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer that he would not be filing his report because Respondent had reportable financial activity.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**, and find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about October 8, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely file an addendum to the campaign's 2020 M5 Report within seven days after receiving notice from his filing officer that the report required amendment.

Count 2:

On or around July 10, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 M6 Report.

On August 27, 2020, the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) received a sworn complaint alleging that Respondent violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statute(s):

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, failure of the treasurer for a candidate to file an addendum to an incomplete report after receiving notice from the filing officer; and

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent was a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2; he was defeated in the general election held on November 3, 2020. Respondent was not a first-time candidate.

2. An Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on February 13, 2020. Respondent was appointed as campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 1.

3. Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate with the City Clerk of Fort Lauderdale (City Clerk) on February 13, 2020, in which Respondent certified he had been provided access to read and understand Chapter 106, F.S. To review the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 2.

4. On January 6, 2020, the City Clerk sent Respondent an email with the subject "Requirement for running for office." The email referenced, attached, and provided a link to the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* and a list of publications available on the Division of Elections' website. Respondent was advised to become familiar with the Florida Election Code,

a copy of which was attached to the email. To review the City Clerk's email, refer to Exhibit 3.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(2)(b)(1), Florida Statutes:

5. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to file amended report(s) for the following campaign treasurer report(s) after receiving notice from the filing officer: 2020 M5.

6. On June 29, 2020, the City Clerk sent Respondent an email to the email address provided on the DS-DE 9. Attached to the email was a letter notifying Respondent that the 2020 M5 report was incomplete and required amendment within seven days. The letter explained the issue with the 2020 M5 and included a copy of Respondent's 2020 M5 report. There is no record of delivery confirmation or reply to the email. Although the City Clerk stated in the email that the letter would be sent certified mail, the letter did not include a certified number, and the current City Clerk was unable to locate certified mail related to the letter. To review the emails and letter, refer to Exhibit 4.

7. On July 17, 2020, the City Clerk sent Respondent a letter notifying him that the 2020 M5 report was incomplete and required amendment within seven days. The letter was sent via certified mail to the address specified on Respondent's DS-DE 9. The letter was returned to the City Clerk undelivered. To review the letter and returned envelopes, refer to Exhibit 5.¹

8. The City Clerk filed the complaint on August 27, 2020. By filing the complaint, the City Clerk affirmed that as of that date, the report had not been satisfactorily amended. There are no records on the City Clerk's website that an amended 2020 M5 was ever filed by Respondent. The current City Clerk did not provide any record of an amended 2020 M5 with the filing officer affidavit. To review Respondent's filing history, refer to Exhibit 6.

9. Respondent did not respond to the complaint.

III. Alleged Violation of Sections 106.07(7), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

10. I investigated whether Respondent violated these sections of the election laws either by not notifying the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making expenditures during the 2020 M6 reporting period or by not filing a 2020 M6 campaign report to reflect financial activity for the reporting period.

11. The 2020 M6 report was due by July 10, 2020. On July 17, 2020, the City Clerk sent Respondent a letter notifying him that the 2020 M6 report had not been filed. The letter specified the due date for the report and was sent to the address specified on Respondent's DS-DE 9 and a second address listed on Respondent's Candidate Oath.² To review the letters, refer to Exhibit 7.

¹ Two returned certified envelopes postmarked July 17, 2020, and apparently addressed to Respondent's P.O. Box were attached to the letter with documents provided by the current City Clerk. Notations indicate the envelopes related to the 2020 M5 amendment issue.

² Although the City Clerk claimed the letters were sent via certified mail, no certified numbers were included with the letters.

12. I subpoenaed campaign account records from the designated campaign depository. The records showed reportable financial transactions that occurred during the 2020 M6 reporting period, which covered from June 1, 2020, through June 30, 2020. Respondent's filing history does not include the 2020 M6 report. To review Respondent's filing history, refer to Exhibit 6. To review the bank records, refer to Exhibit 8.

13. Respondent did not respond to the complaint.

14. I attempted to contact Respondent on five occasions for the purpose of providing an opportunity to discuss the allegations made in the complaint. As of the date of this report, neither my telephone calls nor emails have been returned. Therefore, I am unable to ascertain whether he has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. To review the phone log and emails, refer to Exhibit 9.



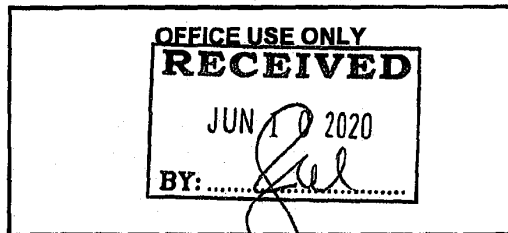

On August 27, 2020, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes: Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, acting as his own treasurer, failed to timely make necessary amendments to the 2020 M5 campaign treasurer's reports, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2020 M6 reporting period.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the 2020 M6 reporting period.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will prepare and present a written Staff Recommendation (SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge you, the Respondent, with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. 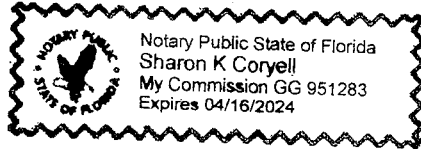

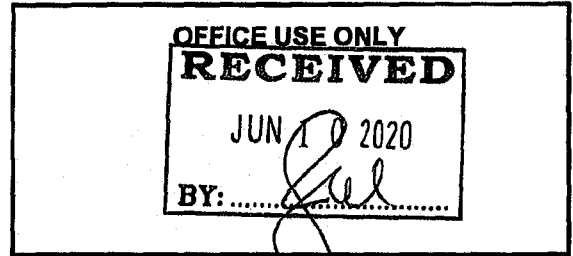

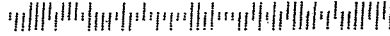
