This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

**If you are the Respondent**, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are the Complainant**, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are an Appellant**, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

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**ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE**

**THIS MATTER** was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 18, 2016, in Tallahassee, Florida

Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

**Count 2:**

On or about November 12, 2013, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before November 12, 2013, that Respondent would not be filing a 2013 M10 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 3:**

On or about December 10, 2013, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before December 10, 2013, that Respondent would not be filing a 2013 M11 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 4:**

On or about January 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before January 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2013 M12 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 11:**

On or about July 18, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 18, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 P2A Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 12:**

On or about July 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 P3 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 13:**

On or about August 15, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 15, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 P6 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 14:**

On or about August 22, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 22, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 P7 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 15:**

On or about August 29, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 29, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 P7A Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 16:**

On or about September 5, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 5, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G1 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 17:**

On or about September 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G2A Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 18:**

On or about October 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G4 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 19:**

On or about October 17, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 17, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G5 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 20:**

On or about October 24, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 24, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G6 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 21:**

On or about October 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D1 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 22:**

On or about October 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D2 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 23:**

On or about October 27, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 27, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D3 Report on the prescribed due date.

**Count 24:**

On or about October 28, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 28, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D4 Report on the prescribed due date.

### NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION**

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 4, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation.

1. On January 28, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from Division of Elections (“Division”) alleging that Ax the Tax (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections.<sup>1</sup> On February 23, 2004, Respondent filed its Statement of Organization of Political Committee (“DS-DE 5”) naming Doug Guetzloe as its chairman. On February 26, 2004, Respondent filed its Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form (“DS-DE 6”) appointing Doug Guetzloe as its treasurer (ROI Exhibit 1 and Attachment A)<sup>2</sup>

3. On August 19, 2015, the Executive Director sent Respondent notification that Commission staff would investigate the following section of law:

**Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:** As alleged in the complaint, for each of the following reporting periods, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the reporting periods:

- 2013 Q3
- 2013 M10
- 2013 M11
- 2013 M12
- 2014 M1

4. By letter dated February 28, 2004, Phyllis Hampton, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Mr. Guetzloe that the Division had received Respondent's Statement of Organization and DS-DE 6 and that the information was placed on file in the Division's office on February 26, 2004, as a committee that supports issues. Ms. Hampton also enclosed several campaign resources with her letter including a copy of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, a *Handbook for Committees*, a *Handbook for Treasurers*, and a 2004 Election Calendar of Reporting Dates. Additionally, Ms Hampton provided the name of a person at the Division that Mr. Guetzloe could call for further assistance (ROI Exhibit 2)

5. Investigator Oliver attempted to contact Respondent's chairman on five occasions and left a voice message each time requesting Mr. Guetzloe return his call. However, Mr. Guetzloe failed to return any of Investigator Oliver's calls. (Attachment B)

6. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter **shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.** (Emphasis added)<sup>4</sup>

7. Additionally, page 29 of the 2012 *Political Committee Handbook* (“Handbook”) states:

When there has been no activity in the campaign account during a reporting period (no funds expended or received) the filing of the report may be waived by notifying the filing office in writing that no activity has occurred. This notification must be made on the prescribed reporting date. (Section 106 07, F.S.)

All waivers filed with the Division of Elections must be filed electronically using the Division’s electronic filing system. (Section 106 0705, F.S.) (Attachment C)

8. Pages 12, 13, 44, and 45 of the January 2011 *Candidate EFS User’s Guide* (“Guide”) explains the steps a candidate should take to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed for the reporting period using the EFS. Specifically, at the top of page 13, the Guide instructs the user to click the box next to “Waiver” if there is no financial activity to report. (ROI Exhibit 3, pages 3-6)

10. “Probable Cause” is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has

committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1<sup>st</sup> DCA 1995).

11. The facts above show that Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division. Doug Guetzloe is Respondent's chairman and treasurer. Respondent was required to notify its filing officer in writing on the prescribed due dates that the Committee would not be filing a report for the 2013 Q3, 2013 M10, 2013 M11, 2013 M12, 2014 M1, 2014 M4, 2014 M5, 2014 P1, 2014 P1A, 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, 2014 P3, 2014 P6, 2014 P7, 2014 P7A, 2014 G1, 2014 G2A, 2014 G4, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, 2014 M11, and 2014 M12 reporting periods, but failed to do so

Based on the foregoing, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following provisions of law:



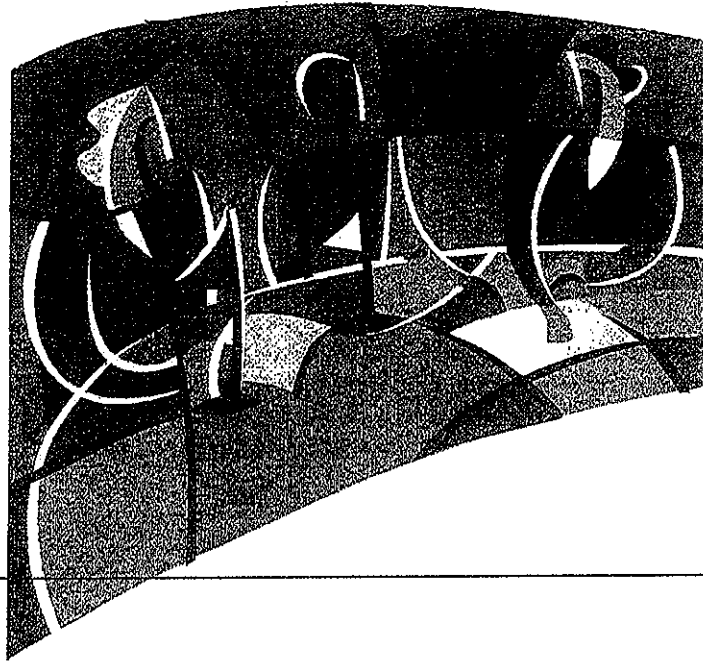

the filing officer within 5 days after the designated due date that was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service is deemed timely filed unless it has a postmark indicating the report was mailed after the designated due date. A certificate of mailing obtained from and dated by the U.S. Postal Service at the time of mailing or a receipt from an established courier company, which bears a date on or before the date on which the report is due; is proof of mailing in a timely manner. **Reports filed with the Division of Elections through the Electronic Filing System (EFS) are due no later than midnight, Eastern Time, of the due date.** (See Chapter 12, *Electronic Filing of Campaign Reports*.)

(Sections 106.07, 106.0705 and 106.141, F.S.)

## Penalty for Late Filing

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports due immediately prior to the primary and general elections, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

(Section 106.07(8), F.S.)

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## Waiver of Report

When there has been no activity in the campaign account during a reporting period (no funds expended or received) the filing of the report may be waived by notifying the filing officer in writing that no activity has occurred. This notification must be made on the prescribed reporting date.

(Section 106.07, F.S.)

All waivers filed with the Division of Elections must be filed electronically using the Division's electronic filing system.

(Section 106.0705, F.S.)

## Special Election Reports

When a special election is called to fill a vacancy in office, all political committees and committees of continuous existence making contributions or expenditures to influence the results of the special election shall file campaign treasurers' reports with the filing officer on the dates set by the Department of State pursuant to Section 100.111, F.S.

When an election is called for an issue to appear on the ballot at a time when no candidates are scheduled to appear on the ballot, all political committees and committees of continuous existence making contributions or expenditures in support of or in opposition to such issue shall file reports on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> days prior to such election.

Committees are to include on the special election campaign treasurer's reports only expenditures related to the special election made by the committee during the special election reporting periods. All contributions received and all expenditures made not related to the special election during the current quarter should be filed on the next quarterly report. Once a committee has participated in the special election and has filed a special election campaign report, all other special election reports remaining must also be filed by the committee, even if there is no further special election activity.

(Section 106.07(1), F.S.)


8. Respondent has had prior cases before the Commission.

### Conclusion:

9 I attempted to contact Respondent on several occasions to give him an opportunity to discuss the allegations in the referral. Additionally, a questionnaire-affidavit was mailed to Respondent on August 20, 2015. As of the date of this report, Respondent has not returned my calls, nor has he returned the questionnaire.

10 Because Respondent has not contacted the Commission or returned the questionnaire, I am unable to ascertain whether Respondent has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes and/or the *Political Committee Handbook*<sup>1</sup>.



However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine is \$500 per day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. A report which is postmarked by midnight of the due date is considered timely filed.

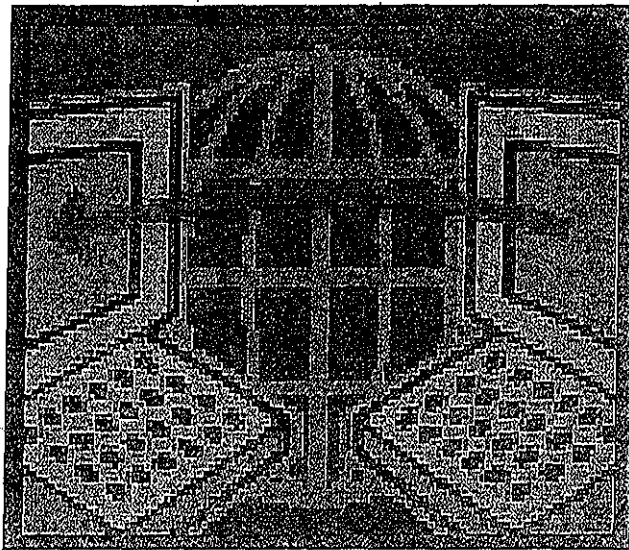

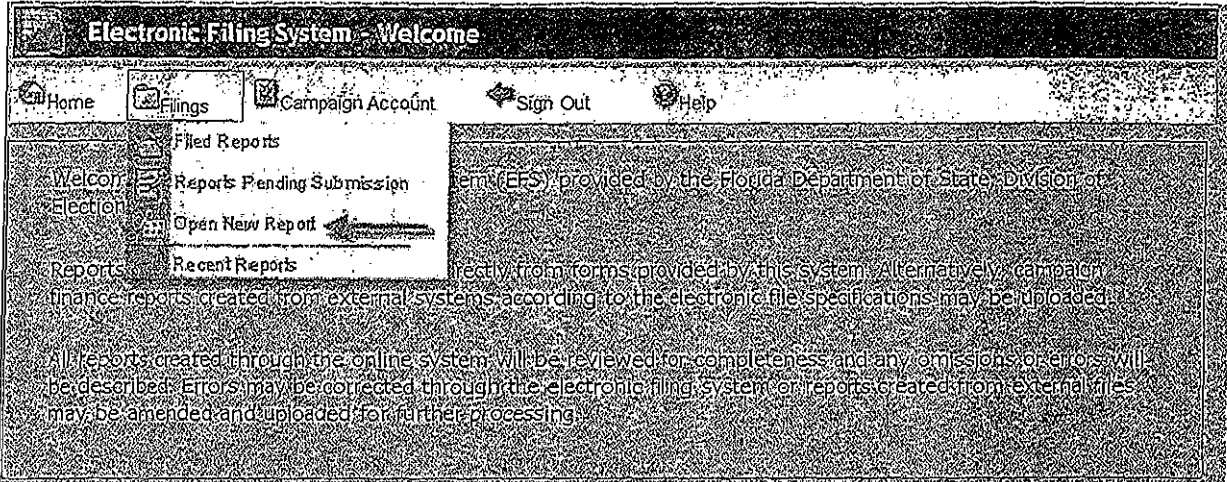

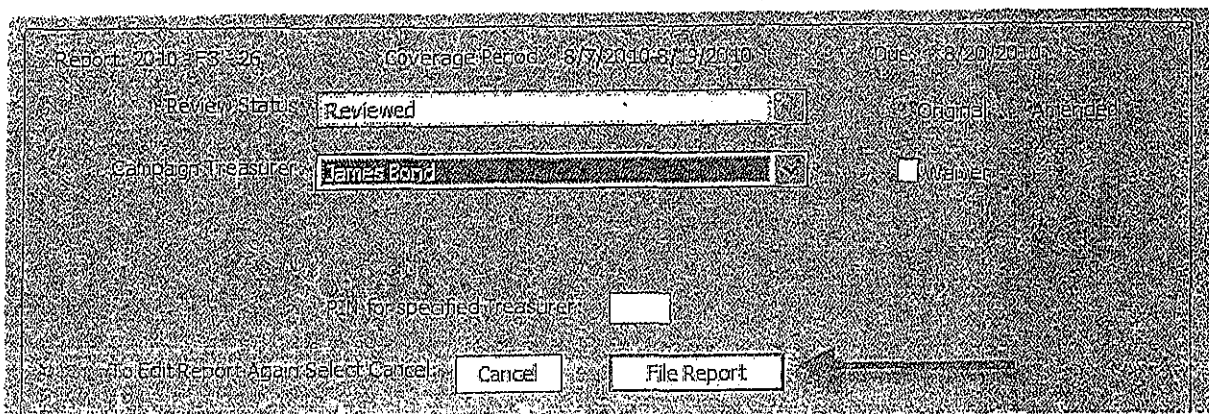

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation will be mailed to you at the above address. You may file a response to the report within 14 days from the date the report is mailed to you. Based on the results of the investigation, legal staff will make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapter 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. A copy of the Staff Recommendation will be mailed to you and you may file a response within 14 days from the date the recommendation is mailed to you. Your timely filed response(s) will be considered by the Commission when determining probable cause.

The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing. The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing. You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence.

At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement.


**The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.**

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida

Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint. However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.
