ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on December 1, 2020, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On June 8, 2020, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about December 10, 2018, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2018 M11 Report.

Count 2:

On or about January 10, 2019, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2018 M12 Report.

Count 3:

On or about March 11, 2019, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2019 M2 Report.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by <u>consent order</u> where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an <u>informal hearing</u> held before the Commission, if you <u>do not</u> dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a <u>formal hearing</u> held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, **Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on April 13, 2020, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

- 1. On August 5, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division"), alleging that Javier Estevez ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent is a candidate for State Representative, District 105, in the 2020 election, acting as his own treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 1)¹
- 3. On November 21, 2019, the Executive Director notified Respondent by mail that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for State Representative, District 105, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods: 2018 M11, 2018 M12, 2019 M2.

- 4. On November 27, 2018, the Division sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received Respondent's Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for the office of State Representative and placed his name on the 2020 active candidate list. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 1)
- 5. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, Calendar of Reporting Dates as well as other relevant documents, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The letter also stated, "An online instruction guide is available to you on the EFS to assist with navigation, data entry, and

submission of reports" and provided the telephone number for the Division's EFS Help Desk. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2)

- 6. Pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, in any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate is required to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.
- 7. The Candidate & Campaign Treasurer Handbook references the statutory requirement regarding written notification and directs candidates to notify the Division by way of the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 2) The Candidate EFS User's Guide shows the process through which to notify the Division. The user's guide instructs candidates to select the relevant reporting period and place a checkmark in a box titled "Waiver" to indicate the lack of reportable financial activity. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 3, 4)
- 8. Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for the following reporting periods, as set forth in the table below. (ROI Exhibit 6)

- 9. Respondent did not respond in writing or otherwise to the Complaint, the Legal Sufficiency letter, the Report of Investigation and any accompanying letters Commission staff mailed to him with those documents. In addition, investigations sent Respondent a questionnaire-affidavit which he did not return. Investigations also attempted to contact Respondent via voicemail and email but were unsuccessful. (ROI Exhibit 7)
- 10. On November 27, 2018, as stated previously, when the Division acknowledged receipt of Respondent's Statement of Organization and Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository, Respondent was advised where all the Division's publications and reporting forms were available.
- 11. Respondent was also directed to print out *Chapter 106, Florida Statutes*, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other relevant documents.
- 12. The Division further informed Respondent: "It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws."

- 13. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 14. The facts set forth above show that Respondent is a candidate for State Representative, District 105, in the 2020 election and he failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for the following reporting periods: 2018 M11, 2018 M12, 2019 M2.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about December 10, 2018, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2018 M11 Report.

Count 2:

On or about January 10, 2019, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2018 M11 Report.

Count 3:

On or about March 11, 2019, Javier Estevez violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2019 M2 Report.

Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, failure of the treasurer for a candidate or political committee to file an addendum to an incomplete report after receiving notice from the filing officer.

Respondent: Javier Estevez

Division of Elections (Division)

Referral Filed: February 11, 2019

Respondent Type: Treasurer for Candidate

I. Preliminary Information:

1. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to file amended reports for the following campaign treasurer's reports after receiving notice from the filing officer: 2018 G5, G6, G7.

- 2. An appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on September 6, 2017. Respondent was named as the treasurer for his campaign for State Representative, District 105. To review the DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 1.
- 3. On September 7, 2017, the Division sent Respondent a letter acknowledging his appointment as the campaign treasurer for his campaign for State Representative. The letter advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter further advised Respondent that it was his responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To review a copy of the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 2.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(2)(b)(1)., Florida Statutes:

- 4. On October 22, 2018, October 29, 2018 and November 15, 2018¹, the Division sent correspondence to Respondent informing him that one or more campaign reports were incomplete. The correspondence was sent to Respondent's address provided on the DS-DE 9 and included an error report referencing the following reports: 2018 G5 and G6. To review the correspondence and error report, refer to Exhibit 3.
- 5. On December 19, 2018, the Division sent Respondent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation informing him that one or more campaign reports were incomplete. The letter was sent to Respondent's address provided on the DS-DE 9 and included an error report referencing the following reports: 2018 G5 and G6. It was confirmed delivered on December 22, 2018. To review the Final Notice letter, error report and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 4.
- 6. On November 5, 2018 and December 6, 2018, the Division sent correspondence to Respondent informing him that one or more campaign reports were incomplete. The correspondence was sent to Respondent's address provided on the DS-DE 9 and included an error report referencing the following reports: 2018 G7. To review the correspondence and error report, refer to Exhibit 5.

¹ The 2018 G5 and G6 notifications were combined in the second letter on November 15, 2018.

- 7. On January 30, 2019, the Division sent Respondent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation informing him that one or more campaign reports were incomplete. The letter was sent to Respondent's address provided on the DS-DE 9 and included an error report referencing the following report: 2018 G7. It was confirmed delivered on February 1, 2019. To review the Final Notice letter, error report and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 6.
- 8. In an email dated March 27, 2020, Division staff confirmed that Respondent has not correctly amended any of the reports at issue. To review the email from Division staff, refer to Exhibit 7.
 - 9. Respondent did not respond to the referral.
- 10. Respondent did not respond to a questionnaire-affidavit. Because the affidavit has not been returned, I am unable to ascertain whether he has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*.
- 11. I attempted to contact Respondent on three occasions to give him an opportunity to discuss the allegations made in the referral. As of the date of this report, Respondent has not returned my telephone call, email, or the affidavit-questionnaire. To review a copy of the phone log and email sent to Respondent, refer to Exhibit 8.



All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight

Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

On August 5, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violation(s):

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for State Representative, District 105, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2018 M11
- 2018 M12
- 2019 M2

However, prior to an investigation, you have the option to <u>resolve your case now by</u> signing a minor violation consent order and <u>paying a fine of \$150</u>, per Rule 2B-1.003, Florida Administrative Code, <u>rather than the potential \$1,000 per violation</u> provided for in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes.

If you sign the consent order, you would not be required to admit or deny the allegation(s) in the complaint, but you would be required to immediately correct the violation, if feasible.

The signed consent order would then be considered by the Commission at its next available meeting and would constitute final action by the Commission once it is accepted and approved by the Commission. You and the Complainant will receive notice at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.
