This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 *minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 *minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failer, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on August 14, 2018, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On July 9, 2018, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation:

Count 1:

On or about August 10, 2017, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed include information on his 2017 M7 Report required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a 2017 M7 Report.

The Commission also finds there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by <u>consent order</u> where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s)s and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an <u>informal hearing</u> held before the Commission, if you <u>do not</u> dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a <u>formal hearing</u> held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper righthand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you. If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.19(1)(c)**, Florida Statutes, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, Florida Statutes. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on June 15, 2018, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation.

1. On October 6, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections ("Division") alleging Daniel Sohn ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a candidate for Commissioner of Agriculture in the 2018 election. Respondent withdrew his candidacy on August 22, 2017. (Attachment A)

3. Respondent's initial Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form ("DS-DE 9") was filed with the Division on April 19, 2017. Respondent filed a second DS-DE 9 on August 22, 2017. (ROI Exhibit 1)¹

4. By letter dated November 20, 2017, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting period:

• 2017 M7

The Report of Investigation shall be referred to herein as "ROI."

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a report on the prescribed reporting date for the following reporting period:

• 2017 M7

5. By letter dated April 20, 2017, Kristi Reid Bronson, Division of Elections, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Respondent that his name had been placed on the 2018 active candidate list. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates who file reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system ("EFS") and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to access the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1)²

6. Ms. Bronson's April 20, 2017 letter further advised Respondent that all the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on the Division's website and directed Respondent to print a copy of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 3)

7. Respondent's 2017 M7 Report covering the dates of July 1, 2017, through July 31, 2017, was due on August 10, 2017. However, Respondent failed to file a 2017 M7 Report or notice of no reportable activity for the 2017 M7 reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 7 and Attachment B)

8. On August 11, 2017, the Division sent Respondent notification that he had not filed a 2017 M7 Report or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2017 M7 reporting period, whichever was applicable. (ROI Exhibit 3)

9. On September 7, 2017, the Division sent Respondent notification that he had not filed a 2017 M7 Report or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2017 M7 reporting period, whichever was applicable. (ROI Exhibit 4)

10. On September 18, 2017, the Division sent a letter to Respondent marked "Final Notice." The notification stated that the Division had not yet received Respondent's 2017 M7 Report or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2017 M7 reporting period, whichever was applicable. The Division's September 18, 2017 letter was confirmed delivered on September 20, 2017. (ROI Exhibit 5)

11. Investigator Spore subpoenaed copies of Respondent's campaign account records from BankUnited. Respondent's campaign account records show that Respondent had reportable financial activity during the 2017 M7 reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 1)

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² Kristi Reid Bronson is now known as Kristi Reid Willis.

12. Because Respondent had financial activity during the 2017 M7 reporting period, Respondent was not required to file a notice of no reportable activity with the filing officer. However, Respondent was required to file a 2017 M7 Report listing his campaign's financial transactions during the 2017 M7 reporting period, which he failed to do. As of June 15, 2018, Respondent has failed to file a 2017 M7 Report. (ROI Exhibit 7, page 1)

13. During the investigation, Respondent told Investigator Spore that he was very sick in 2017 and had to undergo six months of treatment for a medical condition. Respondent also stated that he wanted to clear up any issues remaining from his campaign. (Attachment C, Phone Log Entries 1 and 3)

14. Based on the information above, it appears Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer on the prescribed due date for the 2017 M7 Report that no report would be filed because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2017 M7 reporting period. It also appears that Respondent may have deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106 when he failed to file a 2017 M7 Report.

15. "Probable Cause" is defined as a reasonable ground of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

16. The above facts show Respondent was a candidate for Commissioner of Agriculture in the 2018 election. Respondent withdrew his candidacy on August 22, 2017. Respondent's 2017 M7 Report covering the dates of July 1, 2017, through July 31, 2017, was due on August 10, 2017. However, Respondent failed to file a 2017 M7 Report or notice that no reportable activity occurred during the 2017 M7 reporting period.

17. Respondent's campaign bank account records show that Respondent had reportable financial activity during the 2017 M7 reporting period. Therefore, while Respondent was not required to file a notice of no reportable activity for the 2017 M7 reporting period, Respondent was required to file a 2017 M7 Report listing the campaign's financial transactions, during the 2017 M7 reporting period, which he failed to do. As of June 15, 2018, Respondent has failed to file a 2017 M7 Report.

Based on the foregoing, I recommend the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following violation:

Count 1:

On or about August 10, 2017, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed include information on his 2017 M7 Report required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a 2017 M7 Report.

I further recommend the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

Dear Mr. Sohn:

This will acknowledge receipt of the letter informing us of your withdrawal as a 2018 candidate for the office of Commissioner of Agriculture. This information was placed on file in our office on August 22, 2017.

Pursuant to Section 106.141, Florida Statutes, all candidates must, within 90 days of withdrawing their candidacy, dispose of all funds on deposit in the campaign account. You are required to file a 90-day termination report no later than November 20, 2017. You are not required to close the campaign prior to the due date; however, you must have written checks disposing of all surplus funds by this date.

You may file your report in the Electronic Filing System (EFS) at any time prior to the deadline once you have disposed of all funds. In order to file your termination report prior to the due date, you will need to change the cover period, which has been defaulted to an ending period of November 20, 2017, in the EFS (see attached example).

Complainant: Division of Elections

On October 6, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the reporting period; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent was a 2018 candidate for the office of Commissioner of Agriculture. He withdrew his candidacy from the 2018 election on August 22, 2017. Respondent previously ran for Dania Beach City Commission in 2014 and 2016, however, he did not complete the candidate-qualifying process in either race.

2. Complainant is the Division of Elections.

3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

4. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not notifying the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2017 M7 reporting period.

5. On April 19, 2017, Respondent filed the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9 form) with the Division¹. Respondent appointed

¹ On July 21, 2017, Mr. Wells resigned as campaign treasurer to Respondent's campaign. Respondent filed an updated DS-DE 9 form on August 22, 2017 appointing himself as treasurer.

William Wells as his campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9 form, refer to Exhibit 1.

6. On April 20, 2017, Complainant mailed Respondent a letter acknowledging receipt of the DS-DE 9 form and informing him that his name had been placed on the 2018 active candidate list. To review the April 20, 2017 acknowledgment letter, refer to Exhibit 2.

7. The 2017 M7 campaign treasurer's report was due on August 10, 2017. On August 11, 2017, the Division mailed Respondent notification that the 2017 M7 treasurer's report had not been filed. To review a copy of the August 11, 2017 notification, refer to Exhibit 3.

8. On September 7, 2017, the Division mailed Respondent a second notification that the 2017 M7 treasurer's report had not been filed. To review a copy of the September 7, 2017 notification, refer to Exhibit 4.

9. On September 18, 2017, the Division mailed Respondent final notification with delivery confirmation that the 2017 M7 treasurer's report had not been filed. To review the September 18, 2017 final notification with delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 5.

10. On February 23, 2018, Respondent's campaign account records were received as a result of a subpoena to BankUnited, Respondent's campaign depository listed on his most recent DS-DE 9 form filed on April 19, 2017; Exhibit 1. A review of these records reflects there were two service charges made on the account during the 2017 M7 reporting period. To review the campaign bank account records, refer to Exhibit 6.

11. A review of Respondent's filing history indicates there were three reporting periods before the 2017 M7 reporting period. Of the 3 previous reporting periods, the 2017 M4 campaign treasurer's report was filed one day late, the 2017 M5 campaign treasurer's report was filed 29 days late, and a notice-of-no-activity was filed one day late, for the 2017 M6 reporting period. To review Respondent's filing history, refer to Exhibit 7.

12. As of the date of this report, there is no record that Respondent has filed a 2017 M7 campaign treasurer's report.

13. There is no record that Respondent has previously violated this section of the election laws.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

14. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

15. As previously discussed in paragraphs 7 through 9, the Division mailed Respondent notifications on August 11, 2017, September 7, 2017, and September 18, 2017 that the 2017 M7 campaign treasurer's report had not been filed.

16. As previously discussed in paragraph 10, Respondent's campaign bank account records were received as a result from a subpoena to BankUnited. The bank account records reflect two charges to the account, totaling \$1.19.

17. As previously discussed in paragraph 11, there is no record that Respondent has filed a 2017 M7 campaign treasurer's report.

18. There is no record that Respondent has previously violated this section of the election laws.

IV. FEC History:

19. Respondent has had no prior history.

Conclusion:

20. Respondent was offered an opportunity to make comments regarding the findings of this investigation, however, he did not return telephone calls. I am unable to ascertain whether he has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/o the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*.

21. In the April 20, 2017 acknowledgment letter, Respondent was informed that all of the Division's publications were available online at the Division's website. In the letter, Respondent was admonished as follows: It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, Calendar of Reporting Dates, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida Administrative Code: Exhibit 2.

22. On April 19, 2017, Respondent filed his Statement of Candidate for Commissioner of Agriculture acknowledging that he had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter, 106 Florida Statutes. To view a copy of the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 8.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update personal information. The enclosed sealed envelope contains confidential pin numbers for you. By copy of this letter, a confidential pin number to access the EFS was sent to your treasurer.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event this password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.



Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The file date was August 10, 2017.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
 - o \$50 for the first 3 days late
 - \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late







I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

- 2. This affidavit is made upon my personal knowledge, including information obtained from review of the attached records, of which I am the custodian.
- 3. I am of legal age and competent to testify to the matters stated herein.
- 4. Daniel Sohn (69766) was a 2018 candidate for the office of Commissioner of Agriculture.

- 11. Mr. Sohn did not notify the Division of Elections prior to or on the prescribed reporting date for the 2017 M7 report that no report was to be filed.
