You are required to prove your case. CONSENT ORDER

Respondent, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections, and the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) agree that this Consent Order resolves all of the issues between the parties in this case. The parties jointly stipulate to the following facts, conclusions of law, and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On July 10, 2015, the staff of the Commission issued a Staff Recommendation, recommending to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. On August 26, 2015, the Commission entered an Order of Probable Cause finding that there was probable cause to charge the Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

On or about August 8, 2014, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections violated Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes, when it failed to include required information on its Statement of Organization of Political Committee form.

Count 2:

(. . .

On or about August 8, 2014, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when it deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

3. For matters of administrative convenience and to minimize the use of additional

time and resources, Respondent expressed a desire to enter into negotiations directed toward

reaching a consent agreement.

4. Respondent and staff stipulate to the following facts:

- A. Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections.
- B. Respondent disputed material issues of fact and elected to pursue a formal hearing before the Division of Administrative Hearings.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this

cause, pursuant to Section 106.26, Florida Statutes.

6. Respondent neither admits nor denies that it violated the Florida Election Code.

ORDER

7. Respondent and the staff of the Commission have entered into this Consent Order voluntarily and upon advice of counsel.

8. Respondent shall bear its own attorney's fees and costs that are in anyway associated with this case.

9. The Commission will consider the Consent Order at its next available meeting.

10. Respondent voluntarily waives the right to any further proceedings under Chapters 104, 106, and 120, Florida Statutes, and the right to appeal the Consent Order.

11. This Consent Order is enforceable under Sections 106.265 and 120.69, Florida

Statutes. Respondent expressly waives any venue privileges and agrees that if enforcement of this Consent Order is necessary, venue shall be in Leon County, Florida, and Respondent shall be responsible for all fees and costs associated with enforcement.

If the Commission does not receive the signed Consent Order by September 13,
 2016, the staff withdraws this offer of settlement and will proceed with the case.

13. Payment of the civil penalty is due within two weeks from the date of Respondent's execution of the Consent Order.

14. Payment of the civil penalty by cashier's check, or money order, good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check, is a condition precedent to the Commission's consideration of the Consent Order.

PENALTY

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission finds that the Respondent has violated Sections 106.03(2), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, and imposes a fine of \$400.

Therefore it is

. 25

ORDERED that the Respondent shall remit to the Commission a civil penalty in the amount of \$400, inclusive of fees and costs. The civil penalty shall be paid cashier's check or money order, good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check. The civil penalty shall be payable to the Florida Elections Commission, 107 West Gaines Street, Collins Building, Suite 224, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-1050.

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RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS

Respondent, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections (FEJE or Respondent), hereby files this Motion to Dismiss, and in support says:

FEJE is an active political committee (PC) registered with the Division of Elections. It files regular campaign treasurer's reports disclosing all of its political activity. FEJE filed its *Statement of Organization of Political Committee*, Form DS-DE-5 (*Statement of Organization*) on August 8, 2014, with the Division of Elections. Miguel Diaz de la Portilla is listed as FEJE's Chairman on the *Statement of Organization*.

The Complainant alleged that FEJE did not list any candidates on its Form DS-DE-5, and because of this FEJE could not support any specific candidates in the 2014 election. Where it was asked what candidate(s) it would be supporting in Box 7 of the form, FEJE listed "To be determined."

At its August 26, 2015, meeting, the Commission found probable cause to believe that Respondent violated sections 106.03(2), 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, by willfully failing to include information on its *Statement of Organization*.

The Commission should dismiss this matter for any of the following three reasons.

I. SECTION 106.03(6), FLORIDA STATUTES, REQUIRES THE DIVISION OF ELECTIONS TO REVIEW AN ENTITY'S STATEMENT OF ORGANIZATION AND ACCEPT THE STATEMENT IF IT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 106.03(2), FLORIDA STATUTES.

Section 106.03(6), Florida Statutes, provides:

(6) If the filing officer finds that a political committee has filed its statement of organization consistent with the requirements of subsection (2),¹ it shall notify the committee in writing that it has been registered as a political committee. If the filing officer finds that a political committee's statement of organization does not meet the requirements of subsection (2), it shall notify the committee of such finding and shall state in writing the reasons for rejection of the statement of organization.

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As the filing officer, the Division of Elections found FEJE's *Statement of Organization* to comply with the requirements of subsection 106 03(2) and accordingly registered it as a political committee. Attached for consideration is an affidavit from Kristi Reid Bronson, which outlines the process for review of *Statements of Organization* filed with the Division of Elections Ms. Bronson states in the affidavit that FEJE's *Statement of Organization* was reviewed by the Division and accepted as compliant. Ms. Bronson notified FEJE by letter, dated August 12, 2014, that it was registered as an active political committee. *See attached*.

The Division of Elections has the exclusive jurisdiction to make the determination as to whether a political committee's *Statement of Organization* complies with section 106.03, Florida Statutes. The Commission has no authority to determine whether a political committee's *Statement of Organization* complies with section 106.03, Florida Statutes, and it certainly cannot go back in time and prosecute the Respondent for filing a form that the Division has already determined to comply with section 106.03, Florida Statutes.

II. THE RESPONDENT IS ENTITLED TO RELY ON QUALIFIED LEGAL COUNSEL TO PREPARE AND FILE FEJE'S STATEMENT OF ORGANIZATION.

FEJE relied on undersigned counsel to prepare and file its *Statement of Organization*. Undersigned counsel prepared FEJE's *Statement of Organization* using guidance provided by the Division of Elections, and in accordance with the way he has prepared countless *Statements* for other political committees Undersigned counsel used the verbiage "To be determined." in Box 7 of the form.

Undersigned counsel presented several *Statements of Organization* filed by various political committees with the Division of Elections over the past few years. Each one used the verbiage, "To be determined" in Box 7 of the *Statement of Organization* where it was asked what candidates the entity would be supporting - none were rejected by the Division of Elections. At the Division's recommendation, undersigned counsel continues to form new political committees using this verbiage.

¹ Subsection (2) of section 106.03, Florida Statutes, list the items to be included in a *Statement of Organization*.

FEJE and its Chairman, Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, in good faith, sought and relied upon the advice of qualified legal counsel in setting up FEJE, which he is entitled to do *Florida Elections Commission v. Harris*, FEC Case No. 98-087, DOAH Case 99-4766. FEJE cannot be penalized now for relying on the advice of that qualified legal counsel.

Further, there is no evidence that the *Statement of Organization* filed by FEJE was "illegal" and certainly no evidence that FEJE or its Chairman believed that completing FEJE's formation documents in this manner was illegal. As such, the Florida Elections Commission will be unable to prove by clear and convincing evidence that FEJE *willfully* violated section $106.03(2)^2$ or $106.19(1)(c)^3$, Florida Statutes. s. 106.25(3), Fla. Stat.

III. THE PUBLIC INTEREST WOULD NOT BE SERVED BY PROCEEDING FURTHER IN THIS MATTER.

It makes no sense to punish FEJE for not specifically identifying the candidates it would support when it filed its *Statement of Organization* in 2014. No other political committee has ever been prosecuted for using similar information on its forms Furthermore, the Respondent has provided ample evidence that the Division routinely accepts *Statements of Organization* with precisely the same verbiage that is the subject of the alleged violation in this case. FEJE's *Statement of Organization* clearly was not prepared in an attempt to avoid compliance with section 106.03, or in a deliberate effort to exclude information required by chapter 106. Quite the opposite - FEJE filed its formation documents with the Division of Elections and the Division accepted those documents, including FEJE's *Statement of Organization*, as compliant

Section 106.25(4)(j), Florida Statutes, provides in part:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the commission may, at its discretion, dismiss any complaint at any stage of disposition if it determines that the public interest would not be served by proceeding further, in which case the commission shall issue a public report stating with particularity its reasons for the dismissal

If the Senator Diaz de la Portilla had somehow wanted to avoid disclosure, he would not have named himself as Chairman of the entity and would not have included conspicuous FEJE disclaimers on the mail pieces FEJE published. Under these circumstances, it is difficult to conceive how prosecuting FEJE in this matter would not be a waste of time and resources of

this Commission, or how it somehow would serve the public interest. As such, the Commission should dismiss this complaint under section 106.25(4)(j), Florida Statutes.

IV. CONCLUSION.

For the foregoing reasons, Respondent, FEIE, respectfully requests that the Florida Elections Commission consider this Motion to Dismiss at its next regularly scheduled meeting and dismiss this Complaint under section 106 25(4)(j), Florida Statutes.

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report to the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the chairperson and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Respondent, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections (FEJE or Respondent), hereby files this Response to Staff Recommendation and in support, says:

FEJE filed its Statement of Organization as a political committee on August 8, 2014, with the Division of Elections Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla is listed as FEJE's Chairman on the *Statement of Organization of Political Committee*, Form DS-DE-5. FEJE remains an active political committee (PC)

The Complainant alleged that FEJE did not list any specific candidates on its Form DS-DE-5 Instead, FEJE listed "To be determined" where asked what candidate(s) it would be supporting (Box 7) The Complainant alleged that because FEJE's *Statement of Organization* listed "To be determined" relative to the candidates it would be supporting, it "was not allowed to send a mail piece supporting" a judicial candidate, Renier Diaz de la Portilla Staff has taken the Complainant's allegation and turned it into a reporting violation, recommending probable cause for a violation of section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes, failing to include information in its *Statement of Organization*.

I. SECTION 106.03(6), FLORIDA STATUTES, REQUIRES THE DIVISION OF ELECTIONS TO REVIEW AN ENTITY'S STATEMENT OF ORGANIZATION, AND ACCEPT THE STATEMENT IF IT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 106.03(2).

Section 106.03(6), Florida Statutes, provides:

(6) If the filing officer finds that a political committee has filed its statement of organization consistent with the requirements of subsection (2),¹ it shall notify the committee in writing that it has been registered as a political committee. If the filing officer finds that a political committee's statement of organization does not meet the requirements of subsection (2), it shall notify the committee of such

finding and shall state in writing the reasons for rejection of the statement of organization.

The Division of Elections found the *Statement of Organization* filed by FEJE to be compliant with subsection (2) and registered it as a political committee. The Division of Elections regularly accepts such forms with "To be Determined," clearly acknowledging that it is simply not always practical for a political committee to identify who it may support in an upcoming election or elections. Unfortunately, the investigator in this matter did not contact the Division of Elections to confirm this, nor did she examine *Statements of Organization* filed by other political committees.

Attached to this response are several *Statements of Organization* filed by various entities with the Division of Elections over the past few years. Note that each one used the verbiage, "To be determined" in Box 7 of the *Statement of Organization* where asked what candidates the entity was supporting - none were rejected by the Division of Elections Additionally, none of the other similarly situated entities have ever been fined by the Florida Elections Commission for using "To be determined" in Box 7 of their *Statement of Organization*

II. THE RESPONDENT RELIED ON LEGAL COUNSEL WHEN FEJE'S STATEMENT OF ORGANIZATION WAS PREPARED.

As noted in the Report of Investigation, FEJE relied on undersigned counsel to prepare and file its "Statement of Organization" using the words "To be determined" in Box 7. (Para. 14, 16, ROI) FEJE and its Chairman, Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, in good faith, sought and followed the advice of qualified legal counsel in setting up FEJE *Florida Elections Commission v Harris*, FEC Case No. 98-087, DOAH Case 99-4766. It cannot be penalized for relying on that counsel now

III. THE PUBLIC INTEREST WOULD NOT BE SERVED BY PROCEEDING FURTHER IN THIS MATTER.

It makes no sense to punish the Respondent for not specifically identifying the candidates it would support when it filed its Statement of Organization in 2014 The candidate supported by FEJE in the 2014 election is no longer a candidate and FEJE is back in the position of being an active political committee but not knowing what candidates it may support in the future. Most elections in Florida will not be held until 2016. Additionally, it is clear that FEJE's *Statement of Organization* wasn't prepared in an attempt to avoid compliance with section 106.03, or in a deliberate effort to exclude information required by chapter 106. On the contrary, FEJE filed the required organizational documents with the Division of Elections and the Division accepted those documents, along with FEJE's *Statement of Organization*, as compliant. Section 106 25(4)(j), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the commission may, at its discretion, dismiss any complaint at any stage of disposition if it determines that the public interest would not be served by proceeding further, in which case the commission shall issue a public report stating with particularity its reasons for the dismissal.

As such, the Commission should dismiss this matter as the public interest would not be served by proceeding further

IV. CONCLUSION.

For the foregoing reasons, Respondent, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections, respectfully requests that the Commission reject the Staff Recommendation made in this proceeding and find no probable cause that a violation of section 106.03(2) or 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, occurred, or in the alternative, simply dismiss this action under section 106.25(4)(j), Florida Statutes

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the sworn complaint in this case recommending that there is probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Sections 106.03(2), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, and that there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Sections 106.11(4), and 106.19(1)(d), Florida Statutes Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on May 13, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1 On August 27, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a sworn complaint from Heather L Gray ("Complainant"), alleging that Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections ("Respondent" or "Committee") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

2. Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, filed its Statement of Organization of Political Committee form ("DS-DE 5") on August 8, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 1, page 1)¹

3 By letter dated November 12, 2014, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, failed to include required information in its Statement of Organization of Political Committee, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, incurred one or more expenses for the purchase of goods or services, without sufficient funds on deposit in its primary depository account.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, as alleged in the complaint.

The Report of Investigation is referred to herein as "ROL"

Section 106.19(1)(d), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, made or authorized one or more expenditures prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

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4 Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by failing to include required information in the Committee's DS-DE 5, and by incurring an expense for the purchase of political mailers without sufficient funds on deposit in the Committee's primary depository account to pay the full amount of the expense (ROI Exhibits 1 & 3)

Alleged Violation: Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes

5. Under Section 106 03(2)(f), Florida Statutes, political committees are required to include the name, address, office sought, and party affiliation of each candidate whom the committee is supporting in the committee's DS-DE 5.

6. On August 8, 2014, Respondent filed its DS-DE 5. Respondent's DS-DE 5 does not provide the name, address, office sought, or party affiliation of the candidate(s) it is supporting but rather includes the language "To be determined". (ROI Exhibit 1, page 2) On August 11, 2014, three days later, Respondent ordered political mailers supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla for Circuit Court Judge, Group 70 (ROI Exhibits 3, 7, & 12, page 1)

7. Respondent stated that it listed "To be determined" on its DS-DE 5 because it is a routine practice by political committees to do so when organizing if they do not know which candidates they will support or oppose Respondent stated that the Division of Elections regularly accepts DS-DE 5 forms containing the phrase "To be determined" (ROI Exhibit 5, page 1) Respondent also stated that it supported Renier Diaz de la Portilla during the 2014 election (ROI Exhibit 12, page 1)

8 Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, chairperson for Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections, stated that the Committee's DS-DE 5 was completed by Bucky Mitchell and Noreen Fenner of Coates Law Firm, PL (ROI Exhibit 6, page 2) Mr Diaz de la Portilla stated that he relied upon his attorneys to complete the Committee's DS-DE 5 (ROI Exhibit 6, page 3)

9. It appears that Respondent knew that it would be supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla when it filed its DS-DE 5 on August 8, 2014. Three days after filing its DS-DE 5, Respondent ordered a political mailer supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla. The Committee was organized only 18 days before the August 26th primary election and chose a name including the phrase "judicial elections" thereby showing its intent to support or oppose judicial candidates in the upcoming elections Further, the candidate that was supported is the brother of the chairperson of the Committee. These facts tend to suggest that the Committee may have been organized for the sole purpose of supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla as a candidate in the 2014 elections.

10. Respondent was required to include the name, address, office sought, and party affiliation of each candidate whom the Committee was supporting on the Committee's DS-DE 5, but failed to do so.

Alleged Violation: Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes

11. Under Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, political committees are prohibited from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include any information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

12 Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, requires political committees to include the name, address, office sought, and party affiliation of each candidate whom the committee is supporting on the committee's DS-DE 5 Respondent ordered political mailers supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla three days after filing its DS-DE 5 Respondent's DS-DE 5 did not disclose that it was supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla (ROI Exhibits 1, 3, 7, & 12, page 1) For the reasons stated in paragraph nine above, Respondent knew that it would be supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla when it filed its DS-DE 5 on August 8, 2014, but deliberately failed to include that information which was required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

Alleged Violation: Section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes

13. Under Section 106 11(4), Florida Statutes, political committees are prohibited from incurring an expense for the purchase of goods or services without sufficient funds on deposit in the primary depository account the pay the full amount of the incurred expense.

14 Complainant stated that " On or about August 11, 2014, [Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections] sent a campaign mail piece supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla, a candidate for Circuit Court Judge in Miami-Dade County from the campaign reports filed, [Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections] had no money in which to send a mail piece on August 8th Accordingly, the mail piece was sent without any funds being collected." (Attachment A, page 3) An exhibit attached to the complaint shows no reportable financial activity during the Committee's initial reporting period (2014 P6) which covered the period of August 2-8, 2014. (Attachment B, page 3)

15 Respondent stated that the Committee reported receiving multiple contributions during the period ending August 21, 2014, and making an expenditure on August 11, 2014 (ROI Exhibit 5, page 2) Respondent stated that the mailer was ordered on August 11, 2014, and that a check was issued to the vendor, Cornerstone Management Partners, and sent by FedEx overnight mail on August 11, 2014 (ROI Exhibit 12, page 1) Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, chairperson for Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections, stated that he believes the mailer was distributed on or about August 12, 2014 (ROI Exhibit 6, page 3)

16. The Committee's 2014 P7 Report, which covered the reporting period of August 9-21, 2014, shows a contribution from Foundation for Conservative Values PC in the amount of \$40,000 on August 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 9, page 2) The report also shows an expenditure to Cornerstone Management Partners, LLC for "Direct Mail Services" in the amount of \$35,750 on August 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 9, page 3) 17. The Committee's August 2014 bank statement shows a transfer by telephone on August 11, 2014 in the amount of \$40,000 (ROI Exhibit 10, page 2) The bank records show Check #1001 was issued to Cornerstone Management Partners in the amount of \$35,750 on August 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 11) The check cleared the bank on August 14, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 10, page 2) Respondent provided an invoice from Cornerstone Management Partners dated August 11, 2014 in the amount of \$35,750. (ROI Exhibit 7)

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18 On December 22, 2014, an affidavit was mailed to Complainant to ascertain whether she personally received the mailer and on what date the mailer was received (Attachment C, page 2) Complainant failed to respond Between April 15, 2015 and May 12, 2015, Commission staff made seven attempts to contact Complainant by telephone at several different telephone numbers in an effort to obtain further information regarding Complainant's allegation, but Complainant failed to respond (Attachment D, Phone Log Entries 7-13)

19 Complainant bases her allegation on the Committee's initial campaign treasurer's report which shows no reportable financial activity as of August 8, 2014, and her belief that the mailer was sent by the Committee "[o]n or about August 11, 2014." Complainant does not allege or provide any evidence to show that the mailer was received by her on or prior to August 11, 2014, when the expense appears to have been incurred according to the vendor's invoice and the Committee's 2014 P7 Report. Complainant did not provide any evidence to demonstrate that she has personal knowledge that the Committee incurred the expense prior to August 11, 2014 or that the vendor distributed the mailer prior to August 11, 2014, but rather alleges that three days prior to the mailer being distributed there were no funds in the Committee's primary depository account. Therefore, it does not appear that Respondent incurred an expense for the purchase of goods without sufficient funds on deposit in the Committee's primary depository

Alleged Violation: Section 106.19(1)(d), Florida Statutes

20. Under Section 106.19(1)(d), Florida Statutes, political committees are prohibited from making or authorizing expenditures prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

21. Complainant's allegation that Respondent violated this section of law is based solely upon Complainant's contention that Respondent incurred an expense for the purchase of political mailers without sufficient funds on deposit in the Committee's primary depository account to pay the full amount of the expense. Therefore, based upon the above analysis, it does not appear that Respondent made or authorized one or more expenditures prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

22 "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v State, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v Favino, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

23. The facts set forth above show that Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections. Respondent was required to include the name, address, office sought, and party affiliation of each candidate whom the Committee was supporting on the Committee's DS-DE 5, but failed to do so Respondent also deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to disclose Renier Diaz de la Portilla as a candidate it was supporting.

24 Respondent provided evidence that appears to show that an expense for a political mailer was incurred on August 11, 2014 in the amount of \$35,750, the same day that a contribution was deposited into the Committee's primary depository account in the amount of \$40,000 Complainant failed to respond to Commission staff's investigation. Complainant did not provide evidence to show that Complainant received the mailer on or prior to August 11, 2014, or that she has personal knowledge of when the Committee incurred the expense or when the vendor distributed the mailer. Therefore, it does not appear that Respondent incurred an expense for the purchase of goods without sufficient funds on deposit in the Committee's primary depository. Therewith, it does not appear that Respondent made or authorized one or more expenditures prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find no probable cause that the Respondent violated Sections $106 \, 11(4)$, and $106 \, 19(1)(d)$, Florida Statutes, and find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about August 8, 2014, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections violated Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes, when it failed to include required information on its Statement of Organization of Political Committee form.

Count 2:

On or about August 8, 2014, Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections violated Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when it deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

<u>COMPLAINT AGAINST</u> "FLORIDIANS FOR ETHICS IN JUDICIAL ELECTIONS"

The Political Committee "Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections" ("FEJE") has violated the Florida Campaign Finance laws in several ways. FEJE was formed as a Political Committee under §106.03. In their form DS-DE 5, Statement of Organization (See Exhibit "A"), FEJE states that it is both an issues and candidate based Political Committee but does not list any candidate it is supporting in its organizational documents. The statute states that any political committee that conducts either electioneering communications or political advertising for a candidate must list the name and address of the candidate on the DS-DE 5.

On or about August 11, 2014, FEJE sent a campaign mail piece supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla, a candidate for Circuit Court Judge in Miami-Dade County (See Exhibit "B"). While the piece stated that it was "electioneering communication" the content was more akin to "Political Advertising" Either way, without naming Diaz de la Portilla in the DS-DE 5, FEJE was not allowed to send a piece supporting him.

Additionally, from the campaign reports filed, FEJE had no money in which to send a mail piece on August 8th (See Exhibit "C"). Because the Chairman of FEJE is Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, FEJE was prevented from raising any contributions between August 7th and August 12, 2014 while the Florida Legislature was in special session. Accordingly, the mail piece was sent without any funds being collected.

Even more troublesome is that of the date of this complaint, FEJE has still not reported any contributions which could have paid for the mail piece. FS §106.0701 requires any committee who's chair is a member of the Florida Legislature to disclose all contributions and expenditures within 5 days of receipt on a specifically designated website. As of the date this complaint, the website: <u>http://floridajudicialelectionsethics.com/</u> has reported no contributions or expenditures (See Exhibit "D", Blank pages indicating no contributions or expenditures reported) This is a logical impossibility considering that FEJE sent the attached mail piece.

FEJE has obviously violated Chapter 106 of the Florida Statutes.

On August 27, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission received a sworn complaint alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106 03(2), Florida Statutes, failure of a political committee that filed a statement of organization form to include the required information on the statement of organization;

Section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a political committee from incurring an expense for the purchase of goods or services without sufficient funds on deposit in the primary depository account;

Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes; and

Section 106 19(1)(d), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from making or authorizing any expenditure prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

I. Preliminary Information:

1 Respondent is a statewide political committee A Statement of Organization of Political Committee was filed with the Division of Elections (DOE) on August 8, 2014 The Statement of Organization discloses the "area, scope and jurisdiction" of the committee was "Statewide political committee to support or oppose candidates for statewide, multi-county legislative, county and municipal office and other activities not prohibited by Chapter 106, FS." Miguel Diaz de la Portilla was named as the chairman To review the Statement of Organization, refer to Exhibit 1

2 Two Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committee form (DS-DE 6) were filed with the DOE on August 8, 2014. Nancy Watkins was listed as treasurer and Robert Watkins was named deputy treasurer. To review the DS-DE 6 forms, refer to Exhibit 2.

3. Emmett Mitchell, IV represented Respondent during this investigation

4. Complainant is a resident of Miami-Dade County. Complainant is listed as the president of Myami Marketing, Inc; however, the Division of Corporations indicates that the corporation is currently "inactive." She is also listed as the chairman of a statewide political committee, Equal Marriage Florida

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II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes:

5. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not listing the candidates that Respondent was supporting on the statement of organization.

6. According to Complainant, Respondent filed its statement of organization with the DOE-but did not include as a part of that statement the name, address, office sought, and party affiliation for each candidate whom the committee was supporting. Complainant provided a copy of Respondent's statement of organization. The statement of organization was filed with the DOE on August 8, 2014. To review the statement of organization, refer to Exhibit 1.

7. Question #7 on the statement of organization asks for the name, address, office sought and party affiliation of each candidate that this committee is supporting Respondent answered, "To be determined." To review the statement of organization, refer to Exhibit 1

8. Complainant stated, "on or about August 11, 2014, FEJE [Respondent] sent a campaign mail piece supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla, a candidate for Circuit Court Judge in Miami-Dade County. Candidate Renier Diaz de la Portilla is the brother of Respondent's chairman. Complainant argues that Respondent knew or should have known when the statement of organization was filed that the committee was supporting the brother of Respondent's chairman.

9 Complainant provided a copy of the mailer published by Respondent. The mailer reads, "Circuit Court Judge Group 70 Candidate Renier Diaz De La Portilla Honest. Fair Qualified." The other side of the mailer reads, "The Miami Herald recommends, Renier Diaz De La Portilla."¹ To review a copy of the mailer, refer to Exhibit 3

11. I mailed a questionnaire affidavit to Complainant on December 22, 2014, to query whether she personally received the mailer. Complainant did not return the questionnaire affidavit. I made numerous attempts to contact Complainant by telephone; however, all attempts

¹ The primary election was August 26, 2014. Mr Renier Diaz de la Portilla was not successful; he received 43.32% of the vote. His challenger, Veronica Diaz, was elected.

were unsuccessful.

12. Mr. Mitchell, Respondent's attorney, filed a response to the complaint on October 1, 2014. The statement reads, "The Division of Elections regularly accepts such forms (with "To be Determined") acknowledging that it is simply not practical for a political committee to identify who may be a candidate in an upcoming election or who it may support." To review the written response, refer to Exhibit 5

13 The response also states, "Simply because a specific candidate(s) was not mentioned on the political committee's DS-DE-5 does not prevent it from conducting an electioneering communication on behalf of that candidate. A political committee is not required to amend or file a new DS-DE-5 each time it produces an electioneering communication for a different candidate." To review the written response, refer to Exhibit 5.

14 I sent a questionnaire affidavit to Respondent's attorney on January 12, 2015 The questionnaire was returned on January 30, 2015 When asked who completed the DS-DE-5, Respondent replied, "Bucky Mitchell [Respondent's attorney] and Noreen Fenner [the paralegal for the law firm] completed the statement of organization." To review the questionnaire affidavit, refer to Exhibit 6

15 When asked who reviewed the statement of organization before the form was submitted to the filing officer, Respondent's chairman replied, "Bucky Mitchell." To review the questionnaire affidavit, refer to Exhibit 6.

16. When asked why the name of the candidate the committee was supporting did not appear on the statement of organization, Respondent's chairman replied, "I relied on my attorneys to complete the statement of organization …" To review the questionnaire affidavit, refer to Exhibit 6.

17. When asked the date the mailer was published, Respondent's chairman replied, "It is my understanding that the mailer was sent out on or about August 12, 2014." Respondent's attorney provided a copy of the invoice for the mailer The invoice is dated August 11, 2014 To review the invoice, refer to Exhibit 7.

18. According to records from the DOE, the last apparent reported campaign activity for Respondent was during the 2014 G1 reporting period which covers August 23, 2014 through August 29, 2014. To review the printout from the DOE website, refer to Exhibit 8.

19. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes:

20. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not having sufficient funds on deposit when the committee incurred an expense; specifically, it was alleged that Respondent published a mailer before receiving any contributions.

As previously discussed, Respondent published a mailer to support Renier Diaz de la Portilla for Circuit Judge in the August 26, 2014 primary According to Complainant, the mailer was published on or about August 11, 2014. Complainant argues that Respondent incurred the cost of the mailer without sufficient funds because Respondent did not receive its first contribution until August 11, 2014. To review the mailer, refer to Exhibit 3. To review Respondent's CTR, refer to Exhibit 9. To review the monthly bank statement, refer to Exhibit 10. 22. Respondent's attorney filed a written response. The response reads, "Complainant fails to mention that FEJE [Respondent] received multiple contributions during the period ending on August 21, 2014, and that FEJE reported an expenditure for an electioneering communication on August 11, 2014, in the amount of \$35,750.00." To review the written response, refer to Exhibit 5.

23 Respondent provided an invoice dated August 11, 2014. The invoice is from Cornerstone Management Partners, Teaneck, New Jersey. The invoice shows 70,000 mail pieces were ordered. The total cost was \$35,750. To review the invoice, refer to Exhibit 7.

24. Respondent's chairman stated in a questionnaire affidavit, that it was his understanding that the mailer was sent out on or about August 12, 2014 The table below shows the sequence of events

Respondent's attorney stated that the mailers were ordered on August 11, 2014, "after it was approved by the chairman and after review by and with the advise (sic) of FEJE's legal counsel, the Coates Law Firm..." The attorney added that "Nancy Watkins issued the check to Cornerstone from FEJE's Bank of Tampa account and sent the check by FedEx overnight mail..." He acknowledged that Mr. Renier Diaz de la Portilla was the only candidate the committee supported during the 2014 election. To review Mr. Mitchell's email, refer to Exhibit 12.

26. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found

IV. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

27 I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

28. As previously stated, Respondent did not list the name, mailing address, office sought and the party affiliation of each candidate the committee will support.

29 To review information pertaining to this section of law, refer to paragraphs 6 through 18 of this report.

30. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

V. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(d), Florida Statutes:

31 I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by making an expenditure that is prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

32. To review the information pertaining to this section of law, refer to paragraphs 21 through 25 of this report.

33. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of the election laws was found.

VI. FEC History:

34 Respondent has no prior cases with the Commission.

35. Complainant also filed the complaint in FEC 14-275

Conclusion:

36 I called Mr. Mitchell on April 13, 2015. I summarized the issues addressed in the Report of Investigation I informed Mr. Mitchell that it was still not clear when the order was placed for the mailer and how payment was made Mr. Mitchell provided clarification of these issues by electronic mail. He stated that the order was placed on August 11, 2014 and a check from the committee's depository was sent to the vendor via FedEx. Mr. Mitchell also stated in an electronic mail that he did not have any additional comments.

37 According to records from the DOE, the DOE mailed Respondent's chairman a letter on August 12, 2014. The letter reads, "All of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on the Division of Elections' website at <u>http://elections.myflorida.com</u>. It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, 2014 Political Committee Handbook, 2014 Calendar of Reporting Dates, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida Administrative Code "To review a copy of the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 13

38. Respondent's chairman is a member of the Florida Senate. He was elected to the Senate in 2010. He acknowledged on a questionnaire affidavit that he had received and read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. He stated that he serves as the chairman for Respondent as well as three additional political committees He also stated that he was elected to the Miami-Dade County Commission in 1993 and 1996 Additionally, he was a candidate for Miami-Dade County Mayor in 2000 and 2004 To review the affidavit, refer to Exhibit 6

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



This firm represents Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections (FEJE or Respondent), the Respondent in the above-referenced matter. Our firm has previously filed a Notice of Appearance on its behalf.

FEJE filed its Statement of Organization as a political committee on August 8, 2014, with the Division of Elections Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla is listed as FEJE's Chairman on the *Statement of Organization of Political Committee*, Form DS-DE-5. FEJE remains an active political committee (PC).

The Complainant states that FEJE did not list any specific candidates on its DS-DE-5, and therefore could not produce a mail piece on behalf of a judicial candidate, Renier Diaz de la Portilla. In this case, FEJE listed "To be Determined" when asked what candidate(s) it would be supporting. This is a routine practice by a political committee when filing its organizational documents because it may not know at the time of filing which candidates it will be support or oppose. The Division of Elections regularly accepts such forms (with "To be Determined"), acknowledging that it is simply not practical for a political committee to identify who may be a candidate in an upcoming election or who it may support.

Simply because a specific candidate(s) was not mentioned on the political committee's DS-DE-5 does not prevent it from conducting an electioneering communication on behalf of that

candidate. A political committee is not required to amend or file a new DS-DE-5 each time it produces an electioneering communication for a different candidate.

The Complainant states that "FEJE had no money in [SIC] which to send a mail piece on August 8th," and that a mail piece was sent "[O]n or about August 11, 2014." Complainant fails to mention that FEJE received multiple contributions during the period ending on August 21, 2014, and that FEJE reported an expenditure for an electioneering communication on August 11, 2014, in the amount of \$35,750.00.

Finally, FEJE has reported all of its activity to the Division of Elections, as required by section 106.07. All of FEJE's activity can be accessed and reviewed on the Division of Elections' website.¹ And contrary to the assertions by the Complainant, FEJE's contributions and expenditures have also been reported at *http://floridajudicialelectionsethics.com*. Under section 106.0701, Florida Statutes, the Respondent is required to promptly create a website and has five days to update the website showing an associated entity's contributions and expenditures. The blank pages included as Exhibit "D" in the Complaint were printed on August 14, 2014, and FEJE's first activity was on August 11, 2014. Complaint's review of the website was apparently conducted just three days after FEJE's initially reported activity (August 11, 2014).

The Complainant would have been well advised to review and confirm FEJE's reported campaign activity on these websites before preparing her complaint on August 15, 2014 and filing the complaint on August 27, 2014. As such, the Complaint in this matter is wholly without merit.

For the above reasons, the Complaint should be found legally insufficient and dismissed immediately.

It's also my understanding that "To be determined" is used at the direction of Kristi Bronson in the Division of Elections, and is routinely accepted on forms by the Division. Attached are a host of examples from statements of organization using the Division-recommended verbiage, "To be determined."

FEJE remains an active PC and may be used in future elections.

It is my understanding that the mailer was sent out on or about August 12, 2014.

The screen shot of the web site provided by the Complainant is dated Thursday, August 14, 2014. The Complaint was filed the following day.







Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update information. The enclosed sealed envelope provides a confidential pin number for the chairperson. By copy of this letter, a confidential pin number to access the EFS was sent to the treasurer.

Each political committee chairperson is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that the password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106 07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the chairperson and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106 07(5), Florida Statutes.

Dear Mr. Mitchell:

On August 27, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that your client violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more legally sufficient allegations. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.03(2), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, failed to include required information in its Statement of Organization of Political Committee, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, incurred one or more expenses for the purchase of goods or services, without sufficient funds on deposit in its primary depository account

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, as alleged in the complaint.

Section 106 19(1)(d), Florida Statutes: Respondent, a statewide political committee, made or authorized one or more expenditures prohibited by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

You may respond to the allegations above by filing a notarized statement providing any information regarding the facts and circumstances surrounding the allegations. Your response will be included as an attachment to the investigator's report.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation will be mailed to you at the above address. You may file a response to the report <u>within 14 days from the date the report is mailed to you</u> Based on the results of the investigation, legal staff will make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapter 104 or 106, Florida Statutes A copy of the Staff Recommendation will be mailed to you and you may file a response <u>within 14 days from the date the recommendation is mailed to you</u>. Your timely filed response(s) will be considered by the Commission when determining probable cause

The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing. The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing. You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence

At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement.

The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, are <u>confidential</u> until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint. However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.



This firm represents Floridians for Ethics in Judicial Elections (FEJE or Respondent), the Respondent in the above-referenced matter. Our firm has previously filed a Notice of Appearance on its behalf.

FEJE filed its Statement of Organization as a political committee on August 8, 2014, with the Division of Elections. Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla is listed as FEJE's Chairman on the *Statement of Organization of Political Committee*, Form DS-DE-5. FEJE remains an active political committee (PC).

The Complainant states that FEJE did not list any specific candidates on its DS-DE-5, and therefore could not produce a mail piece on behalf of a judicial candidate, Renier Diaz de la Portilla. In this case, FEJE listed "To be Determined" when asked what candidate(s) it would be supporting. This is a routine practice by a political committee when filing its organizational documents because it may not know at the time of filing which candidates it will be support or oppose. The Division of Elections regularly accepts such forms (with "To be Determined"), acknowledging that it is simply not practical for a political committee to identify who may be a candidate in an upcoming election or who it may support.

Simply because a specific candidate(s) was not mentioned on the political committee's DS-DE-5 does not prevent it from conducting an electioneering communication on behalf of that



candidate. A political committee is not required to amend or file a new DS-DE-5 each time it produces an electioneering communication for a different candidate.

The Complainant states that "FEJE had no money in [SIC] which to send a mail piece on August 8th," and that a mail piece was sent "[O]n or about August 11, 2014." Complainant fails to mention that FEJE received multiple contributions during the period ending on August 21, 2014, and that FEJE reported an expenditure for an electioneering communication on August 11, 2014, in the amount of \$35,750.00.

Finally, FEJE has reported all of its activity to the Division of Elections, as required by section 106.07. All of FEJE's activity can be accessed and reviewed on the Division of Elections' website.¹ And contrary to the assertions by the Complainant, FEJE's contributions and expenditures have also been reported at *http://floridajudicialelectionsethics.com*. Under section 106.0701, Florida Statutes, the Respondent is required to promptly create a website and has five days to update the website showing an associated entity's contributions and expenditures. The blank pages included as Exhibit "D" in the Complaint were printed on August 14, 2014, and FEJE's first activity was on August 11, 2014. Complaint's review of the website was apparently conducted just three days after FEJE's initially reported activity (August 11, 2014).

The Complainant would have been well advised to review and confirm FEJE's reported campaign activity on these websites before preparing her complaint on August 15, 2014 and filing the complaint on August 27, 2014. As such, the Complaint in this matter is wholly without merit.

For the above reasons, the Complaint should be found legally insufficient and dismissed immediately.

FEJE was formed as a Political Committee under §106.03 In their form DS-DE 5, Statement of Organization (See Exhibit "A"), FEJE states that it is both an issues and candidate based Political Committee but does not list any candidate it is supporting in its organizational documents. The statute states that any political committee that conducts either electioneering communications or political advertising for a candidate must list the name and address of the candidate on the DS-DE 5.

On or about August 11, 2014, FEJE sent a campaign mail piece supporting Renier Diaz de la Portilla, a candidate for Circuit Court Judge in Miami-Dade County. (See Exhibit "B"). While the piece stated that it was "electioneering communication" the content was more akin to "Political Advertising". Either way, without naming Diaz de la Portilla in the DS-DE 5, FEJE was not allowed to send a piece supporting him.

Additionally, from the campaign reports filed, FEJE had no money in which to send a mail piece on August 8th (See Exhibit "C"). Because the Chairman of FEJE is Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla, FEJE was prevented from raising any contributions between August 7th and August 12, 2014 while the Florida Legislature was in special session. Accordingly, the mail piece was sent without any funds being collected.

Even more troublesome is that of the date of this complaint, FEJE has still not reported any contributions which could have paid for the mail piece. F S §106.0701 requires any committee who's chair is a member of the Florida Legislature to disclose all contributions and expenditures within 5 days of receipt on a specifically designated website. As of the date this complaint, the website: <u>http://floridajudicialelectionsethics.com/</u> has reported no contributions or expenditures. (See Exhibit "D", Blank pages indicating no contributions or expenditures reported) This is a logical impossibility considering that FEJE sent the attached mail piece.

FEJE has obviously violated Chapter 106 of the Florida Statutes.




