A hearing will be held in this case before the Florida Elections Commission on, **May 18, 2016 at 9:00 am**, *or as soon thereafter as the parties can be heard*, at the following location: **Senate Office Building, 404 South Monroe Street, Room 110-S, Tallahassee, Florida 32399**

Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

**If you are the Respondent**, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are the Complainant**, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are an Appellant**, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

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**MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

COMES NOW, staff, and files its Motion for Reconsideration ("Motion") in the above entitled matter. In support of its Motion, staff states as follows:

1. Respondent was a political committee registered with the Division of Elections ("Division").
2. On June 26, 2013, Respondent filed a Statement of Organization of Political Committee form, an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form, and a Registered Agent Statement of Appointment form with the Division. (Exhibit A)
3. On February 17, 2016, the Commission conducted an Informal Hearing and took final agency action in this case.
4. After the Commission took final agency action, but prior to the entry of a Final Order, the Commission learned that Respondent's registration as a political committee may have been revoked.

5. On August 20, 2015, the Division sent Respondent's chairman an Initial Notice of Intent to Revoke Respondent's registration as a political committee. (Exhibit B)

6. On September 23, 2015, the Division sent Respondent's Registered Agent a Final Notice of Intent to Revoke Respondent's registration as a political committee. A copy of the Division's August 20, 2015 correspondence and Rule 1S-2.021, Florida Administrative Code, were included in the letter. (Exhibit C)

7. On October 27, 2015, the Division entered a Final Order revoking Respondent's registration as a political committee. Copies of the Division's prior correspondence sent to Respondent's chairman and Respondent's Registered Agent were attached to the Final Order. A copy of the Division's Final Order was confirmed delivered to Respondent's Registered Agent on November 2, 2015. (Exhibit D)

8. As of April 15, 2016, the Respondent's registration as a political committee remains "revoked." (Exhibit E)

**WHEREFORE**, staff, requests the Commission reconsider its final agency action in this case because Respondent's registration as a political committee has been revoked.



**1S-2.021 Revocation of Registration of Political Committees and Electioneering Communications Organizations.**

(1) Definition: "Most recent address on file" means, as applicable, the last address provided in a written statement of change to the filing officer for the registered agent pursuant to Section 106.022, F.S., or the last address provided to the filing officer for the committee's chairperson or organization's top-ranking official as contained in the statement of organization or in any written statement of change to the statement of organization made pursuant to Section 106.03, F.S.

(2) Conduct warranting revocation. The filing officer shall revoke the registration of a political committee (hereinafter committee) or an electioneering communications organization (hereinafter organization) for one or more of the following reasons:

(a) The committee or organization fails to maintain a registered office and a registered agent as required by Section 106.022, F.S.;

(b) The committee or organization fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of its treasurer;

(c) The committee fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of its chairperson;

(d) The committee or organization fails to file treasurers' reports for more than 6 months;

(e) The committee's aggregate reported financial activity during the calendar year of an even-numbered year is less than \$500 unless the committee is only registered and required to report as the sponsor of a proposed constitutional amendment by initiative who intended to seek the signatures of registered voters;

(f) The organization's aggregate reported financial activity during the calendar year of an even-numbered year is \$5000 or less;

(g) The organization fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of its top-ranking principal officer; or

(h) The committee or organization has an unpaid fine or civil penalty imposed under Chapter 106, F.S., which has become final, meaning all appeals regarding the imposition of the fine or civil penalty have been exhausted or the time for such appeals has passed.

(3) Revocation procedures.

(a) Initial notice of intent to revoke. The filing officer shall notify the committee's chairperson or organization's top-ranking principal officer and its registered agent of the intent to revoke the registration and include the facts and conduct which warrant the intended revocation. The notice shall be sent to the most recent address on file for both the chairperson or top-ranking principal officer, as applicable, and registered agent. The initial notice shall state that all future notifications regarding revocation of the committee's or organization's registration shall be sent only to the most recent address on file for the registered agent. The committee or organization has 30 days from the date of the initial notice to provide additional documentation to the filing officer showing that the committee's or organization's registration should not be revoked.

(b) Final notice of intent to revoke. After receiving the documentation under paragraph (a) from the committee or organization or after the 30-day deadline to provide additional information, whichever occurs first, the filing officer shall review all information and determine whether the registration should still be revoked.

1. If the filing officer determines that the registration should not be revoked, then the filing officer shall send notification to the most recent address on file for the registered agent.

2. If the filing officer determines that the registration should be revoked, then the filing officer shall send a final notice of intent to revoke to the most recent address on file for the registered agent.

(c) Notice returned as undeliverable. If the initial notices of intent to revoke are returned as undeliverable, and the committee or organization's most recent address on file has not changed since the filing officer sent the initial notices, then the filing officer need not send a final notice of intent to revoke and shall instead send the final order of revocation. If the initial notices of intent to revoke are returned as undeliverable, but the committee or organization's most recent address on file has changed since the filing officer sent the initial notices, then the filing officer will provide an initial notice of the intent to revoke to that updated address; thereafter, the filing officer shall follow the procedures in this rule.

(d) Final order of revocation. The final order of revocation shall be sent to the most recent address on file for the registered agent, notwithstanding that the final order may be returned as undeliverable due to previous undelivered notices.

(4) Appeals.

(a) Appeal of Final Notice of Intent to Revoke. A committee or organization may appeal a final notice of intent to revoke within 30 days of the date of such final notice. The appeal may be accompanied by any documentation or evidence supporting the claim.

The appeal must be filed with the filing officer. The filing officer will forward the appeal to the Florida Elections Commission.

1. Failure to timely file an appeal shall constitute a waiver of any such entitlement.
2. A committee or organization desiring a hearing before the Florida Elections Commission must include in the appeal a separate request for hearing.
3. Appeals to the Florida Elections Commission under this rule are exempt from the confidentiality provisions of Section 106.25, F.S.

(b) Appeal of Final Order. A committee or organization may appeal the Division of Elections' final order of revocation to the District Court of Appeal within 30 days of the date that the final order is filed in the official records of the Department of State as indicated in the Certificate of Service on the final order.

FINAL ORDER

The Division of Elections, Florida Department of State (the "Division") having jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 106.03(7), Florida Statutes, and rules promulgated thereunder, hereby enters its Final Order of Revocation revoking the registration of Equal Marriage Florida (the "Respondent") as a political committee in the State of Florida. The Division, being fully advised as to the premises, finds and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a registered political committee. The Respondent's registration number is 60477.
2. On August 20, 2015, the Division mailed an Initial Notice of Intent to Revoke (attached and incorporated by reference) to the most recent address on file for both the Respondent's chairperson and the Registered Agent. The notice stated that Respondent had failed to file campaign reports for more than six months. The notice informed Respondent

of the opportunity to provide documentation to the Division to show why the Respondent's registration should not be revoked.

3. The Notice of Intent was not returned as being undeliverable and the Respondent did not respond to the Notice of Intent to Revoke.

4. On September 23, 2015, the Division mailed Respondent's registered agent a Final Notice of Revocation (attached and incorporated by reference). The notice informed Respondent of the right to a hearing and advised Respondent that if a request for hearing was not made within 30 days of the date of the notice, the right to hearing would be waived and final action taken by the Division.

5. Respondent did not respond to the Final Notice of Revocation or otherwise timely request a hearing.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. As provided in Section 106.03, Florida Statutes, the Division is the agency having jurisdiction to administer and enforce the provisions of the section.

7. Rule 1S-2.021, Florida Administrative Code, establishes procedures for the Division to dissolve and cancel the registration of a political committee. Subsection (2)(d) mandates the filing officer to revoke the registration when "the committee fails to file campaign treasurer's reports for more than six months."


#### CONCLUSION



**1S-2.021 Revocation of Registration of Political Committees and Electioneering Communications Organizations.**

(1) Definition: "Most recent address on file" means, as applicable, the last address provided in a written statement of change to the filing officer for the registered agent pursuant to Section 106.022, F.S., or the last address provided to the filing officer for committee's chairperson or organization's top-ranking official as contained in the statement of organization or in any written statement of change to the statement of organization made pursuant to Section 106.03, F.S.

(2) Conduct warranting revocation. The filing officer shall revoke the registration of a political committee (hereinafter committee) or an electioneering communications organization (hereinafter organization) for one or more of the following reasons:

(a) The committee or organization fails to maintain a registered office and a registered agent as required by Section 106.03, F.S.;

(b) The committee or organization fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of its treasurer;

(c) The committee fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of chairperson;

(d) The committee or organization fails to file treasurers' reports for more than 6 months;

(e) The committee's aggregate reported financial activity during the calendar year of an even-numbered year is less than \$5000 unless the committee is only registered and required to report as the sponsor of a proposed constitutional amendment by initiative who intended to seek the signatures of registered voters;

(f) The organization's aggregate reported financial activity during the calendar year of an even-numbered year is \$5000 or less;

(g) The organization fails to file the appointment of a successor within 10 days after the death, resignation or removal of its top-ranking principal officer; or

(h) The committee or organization has an unpaid fine or civil penalty imposed under Chapter 106, F.S., which has become final and meaning all appeals regarding the imposition of the fine or civil penalty have been exhausted or the time for such appeals has passed.

(3) Revocation procedures.

(a) Initial notice of intent to revoke. The filing officer shall notify the committee's chairperson or organization's top-ranking principal officer and its registered agent of the intent to revoke the registration and include the facts and conduct which warrant the intended revocation. The notice shall be sent to the most recent address on file for both the chairperson or top-ranking principal officer, as applicable, and registered agent. The initial notice shall state that all future notifications regarding revocation of the committee's or organization's registration shall be sent only to the most recent address on file for the registered agent. The committee or organization has 30 days from the date of the initial notice to provide additional documentation to the filing officer showing that the committee's or organization's registration should not be revoked.

(b) Final notice of intent to revoke. After receiving the documentation under paragraph (a) from the committee or organization or after the 30-day deadline to provide additional information, whichever occurs first, the filing officer shall review all information and determine whether the registration should still be revoked.

1. If the filing officer determines that the registration should not be revoked, then the filing officer shall send notification to the most recent address on file for the registered agent.

2. If the filing officer determines that the registration should be revoked, then the filing officer shall send a final notice of intent to revoke to the most recent address on file for the registered agent.

(c) Notice returned as undeliverable. If the initial notices of intent to revoke are returned as undeliverable, and the committee or organization's most recent address on file has not changed since the filing officer sent the initial notices, then the filing officer need not send a final notice of intent to revoke and shall instead send the final order of revocation. If the initial notices of intent to revoke are returned as undeliverable, but the committee or organization's most recent address on file has changed since the filing officer sent the initial notices, then the filing officer will provide an initial notice of the intent to revoke to that updated address; thereafter the filing officer shall follow the procedures in this rule.

(d) Final order of revocation. The final order of revocation shall be sent to the most recent address on file for the registered agent, notwithstanding that the final order may be returned as undeliverable due to previous undelivered notices.

(4) Appeals.

(a) Appeal of Final Notice of Intent to Revoke. A committee or organization may appeal a final notice of intent to revoke within 30 days of the date of such final notice. The appeal may be accompanied by any documentation or evidence supporting the claim.

The appeal must be filed with the filing officer. The filing officer will forward the appeal to the Florida Elections Commission.

1. Failure to timely file an appeal shall constitute a waiver of any such entitlement.

2. A committee or organization desiring a hearing before the Florida Elections Commission must include in the appeal separate request for hearing.

3. Appeals to the Florida Elections Commission under this rule are exempt from the confidentiality provisions of Section 106.25, F.S.

(b) Appeal of Final Order. A committee or organization may appeal the Division of Elections' final order of revocation to the District Court of Appeal within 30 days of the date that the final order is filed in the official records of the Department of State as indicated in the Certificate of Service on the final order.

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.



The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. **STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION**

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.19(1)(c) Florida Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on June 8, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On September 3, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that Equal Marriage Florida ("Respondent" or "Committee") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

2. Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections.<sup>1</sup> The Committee filed its Statement of Organization of Political Committee form ("DS- DE 5") with the Division on June 26, 2013. Vanessa Brito was identified as Respondent's chairperson and treasurer. On October 16, 2013, Respondent filed an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form ("DS-DE 6") with the Division re-appointing Ms Brito as the Committee's treasurer (ROI Exhibits 1 and 2)<sup>2</sup>

3. On or about April 29, 2015, the Executive Director sent Respondent notification that Commission staff would investigate the following sections of law:

**Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:** As alleged in the complaint, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed on those dates because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2014 M4
- 2014 M5
- 2014 P1
- 2014 P1A

<sup>2</sup> The Report of Investigation shall be referred to herein as "ROI."

**Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:** As alleged in the complaint, Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file reports on the prescribed reporting dates for the following reporting periods:

- 2014 M4
- 2014 M5
- 2014 P1
- 2014 P1A

4. By letter dated June 27, 2013, Kristi Reid Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Ms. Brito that the name of the Committee had been placed on the Division's active committee list as a political committee that supports issues. The letter advised Ms. Brito that all political committees filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system ("EFS") and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 1)

5. Ms. Bronson's June 27, 2013 letter further advised Ms. Brito that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were on its website. Additionally, the letter directed Ms. Brito to print a copy of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Political Committee Handbook* ("Handbook"), and the *2013 Calendar of Reporting Dates* (ROI Exhibit 3, page 3)

6. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter **shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.**

(Emphasis added)

#### **2014 M4 Report**

7. Respondent's 2014 M4 Report covering the dates of April 1, 2014 through April 30, 2014, was due on May 12, 2014. However, Respondent failed to file its 2014 M4 Report (Attachment A and ROI Exhibit 15)

8. Respondent's April 1, 2014, through April 30, 2014 campaign account bank statement reflects an April 28, 2014 debit and an April 25, 2014 credit during the 2014 M4 reporting period (ROI Exhibit 9)

9. Although Respondent was not required to inform the filing officer that it would not be submitting a 2014 M4 Report, Respondent was required to, and should have filed a 2014 M4 Report listing the April 28, 2014 debit and April 25, 2014 credit.

10. By letters dated May 14, 2014, and May 20, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito notification that the Committee's 2014 M4 Report had not been received. (ROI Exhibit 4)

11. By letter dated July 8, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito a Final Notice that the Committee's 2014 M4 Report had not been filed. The July 8, 2014 letter was confirmed delivered on July 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 8)

12. As of June 5, 2015, Respondent's 2014 M4 Report had not been filed. (ROI Exhibit 15)

13. Based upon the foregoing, it appears that Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 M4 Report.

#### **2014 M5 Report**

14. Respondent's 2014 M5 Report covering the dates of May 1, 2014 through May 31, 2014, was due on June 10, 2014. However, Respondent failed to file its 2014 M5 Report. (Attachment A and ROI Exhibit 15)

15. Respondent's May 1, 2014, through May 31, 2014 campaign account bank statement reflects a May 27, 2014 debit and a May 14, 2014 credit during the 2014 M5 reporting period (ROI Exhibit 10)

16. Although Respondent was not required to inform the filing officer that it would not be submitting a 2014 M5 Report, Respondent was required to, and should have filed a 2014 M5 Report listing the May 27, 2014 debit and May 14, 2014 credit.

17. By letter dated June 11, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito notification that the Committee's 2014 M5 Report had not been received. (ROI Exhibit 5)

18. By letter dated July 8, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito a Final Notice that the Committee's 2014 M5 Report had not been filed. The July 8, 2014 letter was confirmed delivered on July 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 8)

19. As of June 5, 2015, Respondent's 2014 M5 Report had not been filed (ROI Exhibit 15)

20. Based upon the foregoing, it appears that Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 M5 Report.

### **2014 P1 Report**

21. Respondent's 2014 P1 Report covering the dates of June 1, 2014, through June 20, 2014 was due on June 27, 2014. However, Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1 Report. (Attachment A and ROI Exhibit 15)

22. Respondent's June 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014 campaign account bank statement reflects a June 2, 2014 credit during the 2014 P1 reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 11)

23. Although Respondent was not required to inform the filing officer that it would not be submitting a 2014 P1 Report, Respondent was required to, and should have filed a 2014 P1 Report listing the June 2, 2014 credit.

24. By letter dated June 30, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito notification that the Committee's 2014 P1 Report had not been received. (ROI Exhibit 6)

25. By letter dated July 8, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito a Final Notice that the Committee's 2014 P1 Report had not been filed. The July 8, 2014 letter was confirmed delivered on July 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 8)

26. As of June 5, 2015, Respondent's 2014 P1 Report had not been filed. (ROI Exhibit 15)

27. Based upon the foregoing, it appears that Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1 Report.

### **2014 P1A Report**

28. Respondent's 2014 P1A Report covering the dates of June 21, 2014, through June 27, 2014 was due on July 4, 2014. However, Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1A Report. (Attachment A and ROI Exhibit 15)

29. Respondent's June 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014 campaign account bank statement reflects a June 23, 2014 debit and a June 25, 2014 credit during the 2014 P1A reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 11)

30. Although Respondent was not required to inform the filing officer that it would not be submitting a 2014 P1A Report, Respondent was required to, and should have filed a 2014 P1A Report listing the June 23, 2014 debit and June 25, 2014 credit.

31. By letter dated July 7, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito notification that the Committee's 2014 P1A Report had not been received. (ROI Exhibit 7)

32. By letter dated July 8, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito a Final Notice that the Committee's 2014 P1A Report had not been filed. The July 8, 2014 letter was confirmed delivered on July 11, 2014. (ROI Exhibit 8)

33. As of June 5, 2015, Respondent's 2014 P1A Report had not been filed. (ROI Exhibit 15)

34. Based upon the foregoing, it appears that Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1A Report.

35. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1<sup>st</sup> DCA 1995).

36. The facts above show that Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections. At all times relevant to the issues in this case, Vanessa Brito was Respondent's chairman and treasurer. Respondent's bank account statements reveal that Respondent had reportable financial activity during the 2014 M4, 2014 M5, 2014 P1 and 2014 P1A reporting periods and that Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 M4, 2014 M5, 2014 P1 and 2014 P1A Reports.

Based on the foregoing, I recommend the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following violations:

**Count 1:**

On or about May 12, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, by deliberately failing to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 M4 Report.

**Count 2:**

On or about June 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, by deliberately failing to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 M5 Report.

**Count 3:**

On or about June 27, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, by deliberately failing to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1 Report.

**Count 4:**

On or about July 4, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, by deliberately failing to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file its 2014 P1A Report.

I also recommend that the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes



Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, on September 3, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission received information from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The Division's referral was mandated pursuant to Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

**I. Preliminary Information:**

1. Respondent, Equal Marriage Florida, is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections.
2. Complainant is the Division of Elections (Division).
3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid-Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.
4. On June 26, 2013, a Statement of Organization of Political Committee form (DS-DE 5) was filed with the Division. The committee's area, scope and jurisdiction are "Constitutional Amendment Initiative." Vanessa Brito was named as Respondent's chairperson. To review a copy of DS-DE 5 form, refer to Exhibit 1.
5. On October 16, 2013, an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository form (DS-DE 6) was filed with the Division<sup>1</sup>. Ms. Brito was appointed as campaign treasurer. To review a copy of the DS-DE 6 form, refer to Exhibit 2.

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<sup>1</sup> Initially, a DS-DE 6 form was filed on June 27, 2013 and Wells Fargo was designated as the campaign depository. In the October 16, 2013 filing of the DS-DE 6 form, US Century was designated as the campaign depository.

6. On June 27, 2013, Ms. Bronson sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's chairperson—a letter acknowledging that Respondent had been placed on the Division's active committee list as a political committee that supports issues. The letter advised Ms. Brito that all committees filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (EFS). Ms. Brito was provided a user identification number and initial password allowing access to the EFS.

7. The letter also advised Ms. Brito that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the Political Committee Handbook, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. The letter further advised Ms. Brito that it was her responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To review a copy of the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 3.

8. On May 14, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's treasurer—a letter informing her that the committee's report due May 12, 2014 (2014 M4 report) had not been received; a second failure-to-file letter dated May 20, 2014, was mailed to Ms. Brito. Both letters were mailed to Ms. Brito at the address provided on the committee's DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). To review copies of the letters relative to the 2014 M4 report, refer to Exhibit 4.

9. On June 11, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's treasurer—a letter informing her that the committee's report due June 10, 2014 (2014 M5 report) had not been received. The letter was mailed to Ms. Brito at the address provided on the committee's DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). To review a copy of the letter, refer to Exhibit 5.

10. On June 30, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's treasurer—a letter informing her that the committee's report due June 27, 2014 (2014 P1 report) had not been received. The letter was mailed to Ms. Brito at the address provided on the committee's DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). To review a copy of the letter, refer to Exhibit 6.

11. On July 7, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's treasurer—a letter informing her that the committee's report due July 4, 2014 (2014 P1A report) had not been received. The letter was mailed to Ms. Brito at the address provided on the committee's DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). To review a copy of the letter, refer to Exhibit 7.

12. On July 8, 2014, the Division sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's treasurer—a letter marked "Final Notice" stating that the committee's 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reports had not been filed. Copies of the failure-to-file letters previously provided (Exhibits 4 through 7) were included with the Final Notice. The Final Notice was mailed to Ms. Brito at the address provided on the committee's DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1) and was delivered on July 11, 2014. To review copies of the Final Notice and, without attachments, and the delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 8.

13. On September 3, 2014, the Commission received a referral from the Division alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity during the 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reporting periods, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. The allegations will be discussed in the paragraphs that follow.

## II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

14. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to notify their filing officer, in writing, that no reports would be filed for the 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reporting periods.

15. Respondent's campaign account records were secured from Respondent's designated campaign depository, US Century Bank. Review of the records reflects a credit to the account on April 25, 2014, in the amount of \$9.21<sup>2</sup> and a debit from the account on April 28, 2014, in the amount of \$9.99<sup>3</sup>. The two transactions occurred during the 2014 M4 report cover period of April 1 to April 30, 2014. To review the bank records relative to the 2014 M4 report cover period, refer to Exhibit 9.

16. Bank records also reflect a credit to the account on May 14, 2014, in the amount of \$12.89<sup>4</sup> and a debit from the account of May 27, 2014, in the amount of \$9.99<sup>5</sup>. The two transactions occurred during the 2014 M5 report cover period of May 1 to May 30, 2014. To review the bank records relative to the 2014 M5 report cover period, refer to Exhibit 10.

17. Bank records also reflect a credit to the account on June 2, 2014, in the amount of \$9.21<sup>6</sup>; the transaction occurred during the 2014 P1 report cover period of June 1 to June 20, 2014. To review bank records relative to the 2014 P1 report cover period, refer to Exhibit 11.

18. Further review of the records reflects a debit from the account on June 23, 2014, in the amount of \$9.99<sup>7</sup> and a credit to the account on June 25, 2014, in the amount of \$9.21<sup>8</sup>. The two transactions occurred during the 2014 P1A report cover period of June 21 to June 27, 2014. To review bank records relative to the 2014 P1A report cover period, refer to Exhibit 12.

19. Based upon Respondent's campaign account records, it appears Respondent was not required to notify their filing officer in writing that no reports would be filed for the 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reporting periods; rather, it appears Respondent was required to disclose these transactions by filing a 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A report.

20. Respondent has been found to have previously violated this section of the election laws. Additional information will be addressed under the section of this report titled, "FEC History."

## III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

21. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to report campaign activity during the 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reporting periods.

22. To review the circumstances relative to the committee's campaign activity, please refer to paragraphs 15 through 18 of this report.

23. Based on Respondent's campaign account records (Exhibits 9-12), it appears Respondent was required to file a 2014 M4 report disclosing two transactions from the campaign account. Respondent was required to file a 2014 M5 report disclosing two transactions from the campaign account. Respondent was required to file a 2014 P1 report disclosing one transaction from the campaign account and Respondent was required to file a 2014 P1A report disclosing two transactions from the campaign account.

24. Respondent has been found to have previously violated this section of the election laws and will be addressed in the paragraphs that follow.

#### **IV: FEC History:**

25. As per paragraphs 20 and 24, Respondent has been found to have previously violated Section 106.07(7) and Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. In FEC 14-286, Respondent was found to have violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes on three occasions. In FEC 14-325, Respondent was found to have violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes on five occasions. Additionally, in FEC 14-144, Respondent was found to have violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, on two occasions.

26. Vanessa Brito, in her capacity as Respondent's chairperson and treasurer, was found to have violated Section 106.07(1), Florida Statutes, on three separate occasions, in FEC 13-332, FEC 14-035, and FEC 14-078.

#### **Conclusion:**

27. On September 4, 2014, the Commission staff sent Ms. Brito a letter via certified mail informing her that it received a referral from the Division alleging violations of Florida's election laws. The letter was eventually served on Ms. Brito via a process server on February 9, 2015. The letter advised Ms. Brito that she had 14 days to respond to the referral on behalf of Respondent; she did not provide a response on behalf of Respondent. To review a copy of the Commission staff's letter and affidavit of service of process, refer to Exhibit 13.

28. On April 29, 2015, the Commission sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent's chairperson—a letter informing her that the Division's referral was found to be legally sufficient and the Commission would be investigating Respondent's alleged failure to file the committee's 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reports, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. The letter advised Ms. Brito she could file a notarized statement providing any information regarding facts surrounding the allegation. Ms. Brito did not provide a statement of any kind on behalf of Respondent. To review a copy of the Commission staff's letter of April 29, 2015, refer to Exhibit 14.

29. On May 18, 2014, I sent Respondent an affidavit asking her to state the reason she has not filed the committee's 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reports. As of the date of this report,


Respondent has not returned the affidavit and the affidavit has not been returned by the Post Office.

30. On June 4, 2015, I left a voicemail message asking Ms. Brito to return my call so that she may have an opportunity to respond to the allegations in the Division's referral. As of the date of this report, Ms. Brito has not returned my call.

31. The committee's filing history reflects that as of the date of this report, the 2014 M4, M5, P1 and P1A reports have not been filed. To review the committee's filing history, refer to Exhibit 15.

32. Because Ms. Brito has not returned my telephone calls or an affidavit, I am unable to ascertain whether she has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Political Committee Handbook*.
