If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources at the hearing. # ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

**THIS MATTER** was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on August 16, 2017, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On July 5, 2017, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

# Count 1:

On or about August 26, 2016, Emmanuel G. Morel violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, by failing to disclose the campaign's reportable financial activity attributable to his 2016 P7 Report.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by <u>consent order</u> where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an <u>informal hearing</u> held before the Commission, if you <u>do not</u> dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a <u>formal hearing</u> held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or

informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

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# STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, and that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on June 14, 2017, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

- 1. On October 5, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division"), alleging that Emmanuel G. Morel ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Senator, District 31. He was formerly running in District 27 but changed his designation on May 9, 2016. (ROI Exhibit 1)<sup>1</sup>
- 3. By letter dated January 27, 2017, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, for the following reporting period, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the reporting period:

2016 P7

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a report on the prescribed reporting date for the following reporting period:

2016 P7

- 4. By letter dated May 11, 2016, Kristi Reid Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received his amended Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form designating himself as treasurer for his campaign. (ROI Exhibit 2)
- 5. The acknowledgment letter provided Respondent with a pin number to grant access to the EFS. The letter further advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the Calendar of Reporting Dates as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 2)
- 6. Respondent's 2016 P7 Report was due to be filed by August 26, 2016; however, Respondent failed to timely file the report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. (ROI Exhibit 8, page 2) By letters dated August 29, 2016, September 14, 2016, and September 23, 2016, the Division notified Respondent that his 2016 P7 Report had not been received. The letters also notified Respondent that he was still required to notify the Division if he had no reportable financial activity. (ROI Exhibits 3-5) The September 23, 2016 letter was confirmed delivered. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 2)
- 7. A subpoena was issued to Respondent's designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the relevant reporting period, i.e., August 13, 2016 August 25, 2016. The campaign's bank records show an unknown number of contributions totaling \$96.80. The total number of contributions and amount of each contribution are unknown as the deposit was a transfer from PayPal. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 2)
- 8. Respondent stated that his filings were untimely because his mother was terminally ill and later passed away. (See ROI, page 3, ¶ 20) Respondent provided a death certificate showing that Marie Claude Williams passed away on July 9, 2015. (ROI Exhibit 9) Respondent's 2016 P7 Report was due over one year later. (ROI Exhibit 8, page 2)
- 9. As it appears that the campaign had financial activity during the relevant reporting period, Respondent deliberately failed to include information in his 2016 P7 Report in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Therewith, Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer that he would not be filing his 2016 P7 Report because the campaign had reportable financial activity.
- 10. On February 15, 2017, Respondent notified his filing officer that he had no reportable financial activity during the 2016 P7 reporting period despite his bank records showing otherwise. (ROI Exhibit 7) The notification was submitted 173 days after due date of the report. (ROI Exhibit 8)
- 11. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an

offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

12. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Senator, District 31. Respondent failed to timely file his 2016 P7 Report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. The campaign's bank records show that the campaign had financial activity during the relevant reporting period, and therefore, Respondent deliberately failed to include information in his 2016 P7 Report in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Therewith, Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer that he would not be filing his 2016 P7 Report because the campaign had reportable financial activity.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, and find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following:

# Count 1:

On or about August 26, 2016, Emmanuel G. Morel violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, by failing to disclose the campaign's reportable financial activity attributable to his 2016 P7 Report.

# FLORIDA ELECTIONS COMMISSION REPORT OF INVESTIGATION Case No.: FEC 16-552

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, on October 5, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission received information from the Division of Elections that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The Division's referral was mandated pursuant to Section 106.22(7), Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate who did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

# I. Preliminary Information:

- 1. Respondent was a candidate for the office of State Senate, District 31 in the 2016 election<sup>1</sup>. Respondent was a first-time candidate. Respondent was defeated in his election bid.
  - 2. Complainant is the Division of Elections.
- 3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid-Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.
- 4. On May 9, 2016, Respondent filed his current Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) with his filing officer. Respondent appointed himself as his own campaign treasurer. To view a copy of Respondent's DS-DE 9 form, refer to exhibit 1.
- 5. On May 11, 2016, Ms. Bronson sent Respondent a letter acknowledging receipt of his DS-DE 9 (Exhibit 1) form. This letter also informed Respondent of his confidential "PIN" number to access the Division of Election's electronic filing system (EFS) for submitting campaign

treasurer's reports and waivers. To review a copy of this May 11, 2016 acknowledgement letter, refer to exhibit 2.

- 6. On August 29, 2016, Complainant mailed Respondent a failure-to-file letter, informing him that the 2016 P7 Report had not been filed<sup>2</sup>. This letter was sent to the address Respondent provided on his DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 1). To view a copy of the August 29, 2016 failure-to-file letter, refer to exhibit 3.
- 7. On September 14, 2016, Complainant mailed Respondent a second failure-to-file letter, informing him that the 2016 P7 Report still had not been filed. This letter was also sent to the address Respondent provided on his DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 1). To view a copy of the September 14, 2016 failure-to-file letter, refer to exhibit 4.
- 8. On September 23, 2016, Complainant mailed Respondent a "final notice" failure-to-file letter via certified mail, informing him that the 2016 P7 Report still had not been filed. This letter was sent to the address Respondent provided on his DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 1). To view a copy of the September 23, 2016 "final notice" with delivery confirmation receipt, refer to exhibit 5.
- 9. The allegations that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer in writing, that no report would be filed for the 2016 P7 reporting period will be discussed in the following paragraphs.

# II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

- 10. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to timely notify the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making any expenditures during the 2016 P7 reporting period.
- 11. On February 2, 2017, I subpoenaed Respondent's campaign account records from Wells Fargo, the campaign depository listed on Respondent's DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 1). These records reflect that Respondent had financial activity during the 2016 P7 reporting period. On August 24, 2016, account records reflect a contribution (PayPal Transfer) in the amount of \$96.80. To view a copy of the bank statement that documented this activity, refer to exhibit 6.
- 12. Based upon a review of Respondent's campaign account records, it appears Respondent was not required to notify their filing officer in writing that no report would be filed for the 2016 P7 reporting period; there was activity during this period. It appears that Respondent was required to disclose this activity by filing a 2016 P7 Report. To view a copy of the bank statements covering the 2016 P7 reporting period, refer to exhibit 6.
- 13. I have reviewed records from the Division of Elections. These records reflect that Respondent filed a waiver for the 2016 P7 reporting period on February 15, 2017. To view a copy of the waiver for the 2016 P7 reporting period, refer to exhibit 7. To view a copy of Respondent's

filing history, refer to exhibit 8.

14. There was a record found that Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

# III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

- 15. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a treasurer's report for the 2016 P7 reporting period.
- 16. Based upon Respondent's campaign account records, it appears that Respondent was required to file a 2016 P7 Report that reflected financial activity occurring during this reporting period. To view a copy of the monthly bank statement for this reporting period, refer to exhibit 6.
- 17. To review the circumstances regarding Respondent's financial activity, refer to paragraphs 11 through 13 of this report.
- 18. There was a record found that Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

# IV. FEC History:

19. Respondent is establishing a pattern of being involved in FEC investigations. FEC 15-392; no probable cause found for 106.07(7) or 106.19(1)(c); closed March 3, 2016. FEC 15-470; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$25.00/no record of payment/case closed February 24, 2016. FEC 15-471; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$202.49/no record of payment/case closed February 24, 2016. FEC 15-472; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$118.75/no record of payment/case closed February 24, 2016. FEC 15-473; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$162.50/no record of payment/case closed February 24, 2016. FEC 16-009; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$50.00/no record of payment/case closed February 24, 2016. FEC 16-086; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$50.00/no record of payment/case closed May 23, 2016. FEC 16-131; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$100.00/no record of payment/case closed August 24, 2016. FEC 16-132; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$100.00/no record of payment/case closed August 24, 2016. FEC 16-541; automatic-fine default final order in the amount of \$664.50/no record of payment/case closed November 23, 2016.

#### **Conclusion:**

20. In a final interview, Respondent advised me that he is a first-time candidate that did not intentionally violate any of the election laws. He advised me that the reason for his untimely filings was due to his mother becoming terminally ill with lymphoma cancer. He stated that he, figuratively speaking, shut down everything to be there for his mom until she died on July 9, 2015. He told me that all of his reports have since been filed; however, he admits that they were late. To view a copy of Respondent's mother's death certificate, refer to exhibit 9.

- 21. In the May 11, 2016 acknowledgment letter, Respondent was advised that all of the Division's publications and forms were available on the Division of Election's website. Respondent was admonished as follows: "It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. 

On October 5, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more legally sufficient allegations. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violation:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, for the following reporting period, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the reporting period:

• 2016 P7

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file a report on the prescribed reporting date for the following reporting period:

2016 P7

You may respond to the allegation above by filing a notarized statement providing any information regarding the facts and circumstances surrounding the allegation. Your response will be included as an attachment to the investigator's report.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation will be mailed to you at the above address. You may file a response to the report within 14 days from the date the report is mailed to you. Based on the results of the investigation, legal staff will make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapter 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. A copy of the Staff Recommendation will be mailed to you and you may file a response within 14 days from the date the recommendation is mailed to you. Your timely filed response(s) will be considered by the Commission when determining probable cause.

The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing. The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing. You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence.

At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement.

The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint. However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.





Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was August 26, 2016.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
  - \$50 for the first 3 days late
  - \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late
  - If the required report immediately precedes a primary and general election, the automatic fine is \$500 for each late day.

The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

• If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.
