However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are the Complainant**, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are an Appellant**, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

**SUMMARY:** Cristhian Mancera Mejia was a candidate for County Commission, District 11 in the 2020 elections. Mr. Mejia was his own treasurer.

Cristhian Mancera Mejia is appealing the fine claiming that he filed the 20TRF report late due to "coping with the challenges of Covid-19". According to Mr. Mejia, the filing deadline "just passed his mind and schedule". In a related appeal, he states that he is unable to finance the fees and requests that the fine be waived.

- The 2020 TRF Original Report covers the period from 08/14/20-11/16/20; it was due on 11/16/20.
- The 2020 TRF Original Report shows that it was filed on 11/25/20 at approximately 12:19pm.
- Cristhian Mancera Mejia reported receiving 2 contributions, while making 7 expenditures.
- The Miami Dade County Supervisor of Elections office does not have any notes that pertain to Cristhian Mancera Mejia's 2020 TRF report.

**Reference: Appeal to fines applied to campaign Cristhian Mancera Commissioner for District 11 356 on the Ballot for primary election cycle. Report 20TRF #1240097/Report 20P7 #1226728/**

**To The Florida Elections Commission:**

I recently sent an appeal for charges regarding late filing fees. I have received more charges regarding the reports referenced above. The late filings were due in part for the reasons already expressed before detailed as follows: Delays on the reporting cycles were due to excessive work on the campaign trail. Since I was both candidate and campaign manager, I had to do both jobs requiring additional time from me. This is not an excuse, but it was a reason to have filed these reports after the due date. The delay was always measured in the hours after the due date at midnight, and I must confess during those last days of campaigning I was worn out due to the exposure to the sun, given out flyers to voters at the early voting sites and just came home after campaigning, took a shower and laid down to rest before submitting the reports and as a result I just woke up 2 hours passed the time to submit it. My campaign was a transparent and honest campaign that I mostly financed on my own due to lack of backers and support due to the coronavirus pandemic. On the last Report 20TRF #1240097, I filed late because I have been coping with the challenges of Covid-19 and it just passed my mind and schedule. Nevertheless, I know it is my duty, and I complied. Just not in time. Therefore, these additional funds added as fines to my campaign are almost impossible to pay at this time and I am requesting formally to have these fees waived as I spent all my savings in my campaign and it this point, I am unable to finance these fees.

I know the rules and that we are supposed to follow them, and I did all I could to do so, nevertheless, my delay in submitting the reports was not due to negligence or lack of attention, I was just exhausted and added stress with Covid-19 related consequences to time and income. This overcame me at that stage of the campaign, and I failed to report before midnight. I request that I be given the opportunity to not be subjected to these fees with the compromise of not allowing this to happen again.

I look forward to your answer and understanding with this matter. Your collaboration will be appreciated and I wish you and your families happy holidays.

Dear Mr. Mejia,

The 20TRF Campaign Treasurer's Report filed with our office was submitted on 11/25/2020 (#1240097). Since this report was not filed by the appropriate filing date, a fine is being assessed for each late day pursuant to Florida Statute 106.07(8)(b).

As such, for reports as required by F.S. 106.141(7), the fine is \$50.00 per day for each late day. These fines are not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. Therefore, since the report was 9 days late, the fine is \$242.75, which is 25% of your Total Contributions of \$971.00. Said fine must be received by our office at 2700 NW 87th Avenue, Miami, FL 33172 within twenty (20) days of your receipt of this notice. The check should be made payable to Miami-Dade County paid only from candidate's personal funds.

Florida Statute 106.07(8)(b) goes on to say that the fine may be appealed or disputed based upon unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file by the designated due date. A hearing before the Florida Elections Commission may be requested, which shall have the authority to waive the fine in part or whole. Any such request must be submitted in writing and must be received by the Florida Elections Commission within 20 days of your receipt of this notice. To request an appeal, please write to the Florida Elections Commission, 107 West Gaines Street, Collins Building, Suite 224, Tallahassee, FL 32399-1050. Our office must also be notified of the intent to bring this matter before the Commission.

I urge you to promptly resolve this matter. If not, in accordance with Florida Statute 106.07(8)(d), we will be required to notify the Florida Elections Commission of this late filing and failure to pay the imposed fine.

**Guidelines to Successful Campaign Treasurer's Reports**  
(Per Chapter 106, Florida Statutes)

**Contributions**

1. Contributions entered must fall within the time period covered by the report.
2. All Contributions must have complete itemized information including the date, name, complete address, contribution type, occupation (if over \$100) and dollar amount.
3. Occupation needs to be specific. Do not use "Businessman/woman, Business Owner, Salesman/woman, Sales," etc. Examples of acceptable occupations include Car Sales, Printing Shop Owner, Bank Manager, Attorney, etc.
4. There is no contribution limit to a political committee.
5. The maximum cash contribution per election is \$50. A cashier's check is considered as cash.
6. The contribution limit to a candidate is \$1,000 per election. For reporting purposes, a credit card, debit card, money order, or Paypal contribution is considered a check.
7. Contributions collected via Paypal or a third-party vendor to collect contributions must be reported in full (transaction fees are not deducted from the contribution amount, but rather reflected as an expenditure).
8. The person signing the check is the contributor, except for a company check that is a "Business" entity.
9. In-kind contributions are subject to contribution limitations (\$1,000 per election, per contributor).
10. Candidates cannot accept contributions from an Electioneering Communications Organization (ECO).

**Expenditures**

1. Expenditures entered must fall within the time period covered by the report.
2. All expenditures must have complete itemized information including the date, name, complete address, purpose of expenditure, and dollar amount.
3. A reimbursement from the campaign account is allowable directly to an individual/organization that has incurred approved expenses on behalf of the campaign. The report must include the full name, full address, specific purpose, and amount of reimbursement.
4. Campaign accounts may not provide a direct payment to the credit card of an individual/organization as a form of reimbursement.
5. Poll workers should be paid with a campaign check and each poll worker paid should be itemized.
6. Bank fees and fees assessed by Paypal or a third-party vendor to collect contributions must be reported as expenditures (not deducted from the contribution amount).
7. ECOs are limited to electioneering communications and may not make contributions to candidates or political parties.

**Petty Cash**

1. The Petty Cash Withdrawn limit is \$500 per calendar quarter prior to the end of qualifying. Thereafter, \$100 per week.
2. It shall be spent only in amounts less than \$100 and only for office supplies, transportation expenses and other necessities.
3. Petty Cash may not be used for time, space, or services from communications media.

4. The Petty Cash Withdrawn must be reported in the period that it was withdrawn from the bank.
5. The Petty Cash Spent must also be reported in the period that it was spent. Petty Cash Spent does not impact the Total Expenditures for the period, only when it is withdrawn.
6. Petty Cash Withdrawn and Petty Cash Spent must equal at the end of the campaign.

**Notices**

1. You will be notified of any deficiencies or violations.
2. Typical violations include late filing, fine due, and incomplete information on a campaign report.
3. ***Following these guidelines will reduce notices sent to you and thus the number of amendment reports that will need to be filed.***

**Amending a Report**

1. To make any changes to a submitted report, click on the "amend" button of the Original Report to create an Amendment Report.
2. In the Amendment Report, first click on the type of transaction to amend (i.e. "Enter Contributions", etc):
  - To add new item, add a new sequence.
  - To amend existing item, click "Amend Item from Orig Report" to view list of all items previously submitted. Click on desired sequence, enter edits, and click submit. This will display two transactions (one to "delete" original item and one to "add" new item).
  - To delete existing item, click "Amend Item from Orig Report", click on desired sequence, and just click submit. This will display two transactions (one to "delete" original item and one to "add" new item). Delete the "add" sequence, leaving only the "delete" sequence.

**Fines**

1. **Fines assessed to candidates must be paid from candidate's personal funds.**
2. Fines assessed to political parties, political action committees, electioneering communication organizations, and "independent expenditures over \$5,000" are to be paid from their campaign account.
3. Fines must be paid to the filing officer within 20 days after receipt of the notice of payment due, unless an appeal is made to the Florida Elections Commission within 20 days after receipt of the notice of payment due.
4. If fine was appealed to the Florida Elections Commission, and the fine is upheld, payment is due to the Elections Department as stated in the Final Order.
5. Reference Florida Statute 106.07(8)(b) for fine amounts.

**Termination Report**

1. At the end of the campaign, or when closing out a political committee, the "Total Contributions to Date" and the "Total Expenditures to Date" on the Termination Report must equal; and, the campaign account must be closed.
2. Prior to closing the campaign account, any remaining funds must be disposed of according to F.S. 106.141 (for candidates) and F.S. 106.03 (for political committees).
