NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by <u>consent order</u> where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, Florida Statutes. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 23, 2019, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On April 1, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division"), alleging that Valion Joyce ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 61. (ROI Exhibit 10)¹

3. By letter dated June 4, 2019, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provision:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 61, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2018 termination reporting period.

4. By letter dated June 6, 2018, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received his Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1)

5. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the *Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 2)

6. Pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, in any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable

funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate is required to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

7. The Candidate & Campaign Treasurer Handbook references the statutory requirement regarding written notification and directs candidates to notify the Division by way of the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2) The Candidate EFS User's Guide shows the process through which to notify the Division. The user's guide instructs candidates to select the relevant reporting period and place a checkmark in a box titled "Waiver" to indicate the lack of reportable financial activity. 9. Respondent stated that he was a full-time college student at the time of the campaign. (ROI Exhibit 11, page 1)

10. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

11. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 61. Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed for the 2018 Termination reporting period.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about February 4, 2019, Valion Joyce violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2018 Termination Report.

L. Preliminary Information:

1. An appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository form DS-DE 9 was filed on June 5, 2018. (Exhibit 1)

2. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on Respondent's DS-DE 9 on June 6, 2018 advising Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. (Exhibit 2)

3. The acknowledgement letter also states, "An online instruction guide is available to you on the EFS to assist with navigation, data entry, and submission of reports" and provides the telephone number for the Division's EFS Help Desk.

4. The Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, discusses filing a notice-of-no-activity when there is no activity to disclose on page 45. (Exhibit 3)

5. Pages 12, 13, 45 and 46 of the *Candidate EFS User's Guide* discuss how to notify the Division on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed using the EFS. Specifically, page 13 instructs the user to click the box next to "waiver" if there is no activity to disclose. (Exhibit 4)

6. In a telephone interview on April 2, 2014, Kristi Reid-Bronson clarified that once the waiver box is chosen and a new report is opened as shown on page 12, the only available option on the report summary screen will be "Go To File Report" as shown on page 13. Choosing "Go To File Report" will take the user directly to the screens where the candidate/treasurer PINS are entered as shown on pages 45 and 46.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

7. Respondent's filing history reflects the untimely filed notification summarized below. (Exhibit 5)

8. Respondent was interviewed by telephone on July 25, 2019. During the phone interview, Respondent did not provide a specific reason or circumstance for filing his 2018 TR notice late. He said that he was a full-time student at FSU at the time of this campaign. Respondent was aware of publications for chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes. (Exhibit 7)

9. On July 29, 2019 I called Respondent to verify his e-mail address and mailing address. I then e-mailed the letter of Legal Sufficiency and the complaint from the Division for his records. Respondent did not respond to the emails. I mailed a questionnaire-affidavit on August 2, 2019 to the confirmed mailing address. (Exhibit 8)

10. On September 4, 2019 Respondent called. During the phone call he notified me of his new address in Tallahassee. I resent the questionnaire to Respondent's new confirmed address on September 5, 2019. As of September 23, 2019, the questionnaire has not been returned. (Exhibit 9)

III. FEC History:

11. Respondent has no history with the commission prior to this case.

Conclusion:

12. Respondent was a write-in candidate. On July 25, 2019 he acknowledged he was aware of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and the *Candidate & Treasurer Handbook*. The Statement of Candidate form was filed on June 5, 2018 by Respondent (Exhibit 10).



An individual seeking a publicly elected position on a political party executive committee who receives a contribution or makes an expenditure must file a single report of all contributions and expenditures on the 4th day immediately preceding the primary election. (See <u>Chapter 18, Reporting</u> for Individuals Seeking a Publicly Elected Position on a Party Executive Committee.)

Unless the electronic filing requirements of Section 106.0705, Florida Statutes, apply, reports shall be filed no later than 5 p.m. of the day designated. A report postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than midnight of the day designated is deemed timely filed. A report received by the filing officer within 5 days after the designated due date that was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service is deemed timely filed unless it has a postmark indicating the report was mailed after the designated due date. A certificate of mailing obtained from and dated by the U.S. Postal Service at the time of mailing or a receipt from an established courier company, which bears a date on or before the date on which the report is due, is proof of mailing in a timely manner.

Reports filed with the Division through the <u>Electronic Filing System (EFS)</u> are due no later than midnight, Eastern Time, of the due date.

(Sections <u>106.07</u>, <u>106.0705</u> and <u>106.141</u>, F.S.; <u>Chapter 19, Electronic Filing of</u> <u>Campaign Reports</u>)

Penalty for Late Filing

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late

and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding the primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

For a candidate's termination report, the fine shall be \$50 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater for the period covered by the late report. All fines must be paid from the candidate's **personal** funds – not campaign funds.

(Section 106.07(2) and (8), F.S.)

Notice of No Activity

In any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds or made any expenditures, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate must notify the filing officer in writing on or before the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date. (A notice of no activity filed with the Division must be filed electronically using the <u>EFS</u>.) The next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed.







Summary: I reached out to Respondent via phone. Respondent answered and stated he was not aware of any case or investigation to his campaign. He said that when he filed his termination report there was no issue with the Division, and he was not notified of any problems. Respondent states he was a full-time student with "one of his hardest semesters at FSU [at the time of the campaign]" and could not keep up with everything needed. Caller was interested but did not decide on the MVCO (Minor Violation Consent Order). I went over MVCO letter. Respondent states this letter was never seen as the mailing address is to his family's home. He asked to know if there were any more cases to his name at the Commission. On April 1, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more legally sufficient allegations. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violation(s):

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 61, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2018 termination reporting period.

However, prior to an investigation, you have the option to <u>resolve your case now by</u> signing a minor violation consent order and <u>paying a fine of \$50</u>, per Rule 2B-1.003, Florida Administrative Code, <u>rather than the potential \$1,000 per violation</u> provided for in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes.

If you sign the consent order, <u>you would not be required to admit or deny the allegation(s)</u> in the complaint, but you would be required to immediately correct the violation, if feasible.

The signed consent order would then be considered by the Commission at its next available meeting, and would constitute final action by the Commission once it is accepted and approved by the Commission.


