ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on August 25, 2020, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On December 30, 2019, Staff recommended to the Commission there was probable cause to believe the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Referral, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements, if any, made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

On or about July 13, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 13, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2:

On or about July 27, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 27, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3:

On or about August 3, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 3, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4:

On or about August 10, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 10, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5:

On or about August 24, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 24, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6:

On or about September 7, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 7, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 G1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7:

On or about January 22, 2019, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before January 22, 2019, that Respondent would not be filing a 2019 Termination Report on the prescribed due date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, **Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on November 22, 2019, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation.

- 1. On June 11, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that Jose Vazquez ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was a candidate for State Representative, District 62, in the 2018 election. Respondent's Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form was filed with the Division on June 21, 2018. Respondent appointed himself as his campaign treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 1)¹ Respondent withdrew from the race on October 24, 2018. (Attachments A and B)
- 3. By letter dated June 22, 2018, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, Division of Elections, sent a letter to Respondent notifying him that his name had been placed on file in the Division's office as a 2018 active candidate for State Representative. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system ("EFS") and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to access the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1)
- 4. Ms. Willis' June 22, 2018 letter also stated that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were on the Division's website and directed Respondent to print a copy of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* ("Handbook"), and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 2)
- 5. On September 4, 2019, the Executive Director sent Respondent notification that Commission staff would investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 62,

failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2018 P2
- 2018 P3
- 2018 P4
- 2018 P5
- 2018 P7
- 2018 G1
- 2019 TR
- 6. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date. (Emphasis added)

7. Page 47 of the Handbook states:

In any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds or made any expenditures, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate must notify the filing officer in writing on or before the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date. (A notice of no activity filed with the Division must be filed electronically using the EFS.) (Emphasis in original)

(Section 106.07, F.S.)

(ROI Exhibit 3, pages 1 and 5)

8. Pages 12, 13, 44, and 45 of the Candidate EFS User's Guide ("Guide") explain the steps a candidate should take to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed for the reporting period using the EFS. Specifically, at the top of page 13, the Guide instructs the user to click the box next to "Waiver" if there is no financial activity to report. (ROI Exhibit 4)

- 10. In his response to the Complaint, Respondent stated that his reports may have been late because he may have had the wrong calendar of reporting dates and there was a misunderstanding about the filing dates. (ROI Exhibit 6)
- 11. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 12. The above facts show Respondent was a candidate for State Representative, District 62, in the 2018 election. Respondent withdrew from the race on October 24, 2018. Respondent failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed due date for the 2018 P2, 2018 P3, 2018 P4, 2018 P5, 2018 P7, 2018 G1, and 2019 Termination Report that he had no reportable financial activity and would not be filing a report for the applicable reporting period.

Based on the foregoing, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

On or about July 13, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 13, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2:

On or about July 27, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before July 27, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3:

On or about August 3, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 3, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4:

On or about August 10, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 10, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5:

On or about August 24, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before August 24, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 P7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6:

On or about September 7, 2018, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 7, 2018, that Respondent would not be filing a 2018 G1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7:

On or about January 22, 2019, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before January 22, 2019, that Respondent would not be filing a 2019 Termination Report on the prescribed due date.

I. Preliminary Information:

- 1. An appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on June 21, 2018. (Ex. 1)
- 2. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on Respondent's DS-DE 9 on June 22, 2018 advising Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. (Ex. 2)
- 3. The acknowledgement letter also states, "An online instruction guide is available to you on the EFS to assist with navigation, data entry, and submission of reports" and provides the telephone number for the Division's EFS Help Desk.
- 4. The Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook discusses filing a notice-of-no-activity when there is no activity to disclose on page 47. (Ex. 3)
- 5. Pages 12, 13, 44, and 45 of the Candidate EFS User's Guide discuss how to notify the Division on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed using the EFS. Specifically, page 13 instructs the user to click the box next to "waiver" if there is no activity to disclose. (Ex. 4)
- 6. In a telephone interview on April 2, 2014, Kristi Reid-Bronson clarified that once the waiver box is chosen and a new report is opened as shown on page 12, the only available option on the report summary screen will be "Go To File Report" as shown on page 13. Choosing "Go To File Report" will take the user directly to the screens where the candidate/treasurer PINS are entered as shown on pages 44 and 45.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

- 8. According to Respondent's filing history, a notification-of-no-activity was filed timely for the 2018 P1 reporting period as well as the 2018 P6 reporting period. (Ex. 5)
- 9. Respondent provided a written response to the referral dated August 26, 2019. Respondent stated, "I recognize reports are not file on time due to a misunderstanding on the dates." Respondent added, "It's possible I have a wrong calendar." (Ex. 6)

III. FEC History:

- 11. Respondent stated during a telephone interview, relative to another matter, that he did not fully read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. Respondent signed his Statement of Candidate form on June 20, 2018. (Ex. 7)

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Chapter 16: Filing Campaign Reports

Each campaign treasurer designated by a candidate shall file regular reports of all contributions received and all expenditures made by or on behalf of such candidate.

The candidate and his or her campaign treasurer shall certify as to the correctness of each report. Each person so certifying shall bear the responsibility for the accuracy and veracity of each report. Any campaign treasurer or candidate who willfully certifies the correctness of any report while knowing that such report is incorrect, false or incomplete commits a misdemeanor of the first degree.

(Section 106.07, F.S.)

Where to File

A campaign treasurer is required to file campaign treasurer's reports with the officer with whom the candidate registers.

Candidates filing reports with the Division are required to file by means of the <u>Electronic Filing System</u>. If the candidate's filing officer is other than the Division, contact the appropriate filing officer to find out the requirements.

The web address for filing online with the Division is: https://efs.dos.state.fl.us/ (Section 106.07(2), F.S.)

When to File

Reports must be filed on the 10th day following the end of each calendar month from the time the candidate registers, except that if the 10th day occurs on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the report shall be filed on the next business day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.

A statewide candidate must file reports:

- On the 60th day immediately preceding the primary election, and each week thereafter, with the last weekly report being filed on the 4th day immediately preceding the general election.
- .2. On the 10th day immediately preceding the general election, and each day thereafter, with the last daily report being filed the 5th day immediately preceding the general election.

All other candidates must file reports on the 60th day immediately preceding the primary election and bi-weekly on each Friday thereafter through and including the 4th day immediately preceding the general election, with additional reports due on the 25th and 11th days before the primary election and the general election.

For candidates that file with the Division, see the "Reporting Dates Calendar" at:

http://dos.myflorida.com/elections/formspublications/publications/ An individual seeking a publicly elected position on a political party executive committee who receives a contribution or makes an expenditure must file a single report of all contributions and expenditures on the 4th day immediately preceding the primary election. (See Chapter 18, Reporting for Individuals Seeking a Publicly Elected Position on a Party Executive Committee.)

Unless the electronic filing requirements of Section 106.0705, Florida Statutes, apply, reports shall be filed no later than 5 p.m. of the day designated. A report postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than midnight of the day designated is deemed timely filed. A report received by the filing officer within 5 days after the designated due date that was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service is deemed timely filed unless it has a postmark indicating the report was mailed after the designated due date. A certificate of mailing obtained from and dated by the U.S. Postal Service at the time of mailing or a receipt from an established courier company, which bears a date on or before the date on which the report is due, is proof of mailing in a timely manner. Reports filed with the Division through the Electronic Filing System (EFS) are due no later than midnight, Eastern Time, of the due date.

> (Sections <u>106.07</u>, <u>106.0705</u> and <u>106.141</u>, F.S.)

Penalty for Late Filing

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is

greater, for the period covered by the late However, for the reports immediately preceding the primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. For a candidate's termination report, the fine shall be \$50 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater for the period covered by the late report. All fines must be paid from the candidate's personal funds - not campaign funds.
