**FINAL ORDER**

**THIS CAUSE** came on to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting held on November 7 and 8, 2001, in Tallahassee, Florida.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Commission is charged with enforcing Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the campaign financing law.
2. The Respondent's campaign treasurer's report was not filed with the filing officer on the designated due date.
3. The filing officer fined the Respondent for the late filing of the report. The Respondent timely appealed, claiming unusual circumstances.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**


4. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this case, pursuant to Section 106.04 or 106.07, Florida Statutes.
5. The Respondent's claim of unusual circumstances, as defined in Rule 2B-1.0055, Florida Administrative Code, does not justify the Respondent's failure to timely file the report.

**ORDER**

Based on the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission finds that the Respondent failed to file the report on the designated due date. Therefore, it is

**ORDERED** that the assessed fine of \$500.00 is affirmed. The fine shall be paid to the filing officer within 30 days of the date this Final Order is received by the Respondent.
