STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), and there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on March 10, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On September 2, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Complainant") alleging that Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections and Michael Zuniga is listed as its Chairperson, Treasurer, and Registered Agent $(ROI \text{ Exhibit } 1)^1$

3. By letter dated October 7, 2014, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

> Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities, is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections. Respondent failed to timely notify the filing officer that it had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for each of the following periods: 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, 2014 P3, 2014 P4.

> Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, or a person acting on its behalf, falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file reports on the prescribed

The Report of Investigation referred to herein as "ROI"

reporting date for each of the following periods: 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, 2014 P3, 2014 P4.

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4 On March 6, 2014, the committee filed its Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form ("DS-DE 6") and appointed Michael Zuniga as its Treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 2)

5. On March 7, 2014, Kristi Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, mailed a letter to Michael Zuniga acknowledging his appointment as treasurer, and provided him with a confidential PIN number to access the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 3)

6. Ms. Bronson's letter also advised Mr. Zuniga that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on its website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Political Committee Handbook*, and the 2014 Calendar of Reporting Dates. Id.

7. On July 11, 2014, the designated due date for the committee's 2014 P2 Report, Mr. Zuniga failed to file the report. (ROI Exhibit 4 and ROI Exhibit 15, page 1)

8 By letters dated July 14, 2014 and July 30, 2014, the Division informed Mr. Zuniga that the committee's 2014 P2 Report had not been received. The letters informed Mr. Zuniga that failure to file the report would result in a referral of the matter to the Florida Elections Commission for further action, and both letters were mailed to the address listed on Respondent's DS-DE 6 form. (ROI Exhibit 5)

9 On July 18, 2014, the designated due date for the committee's 2014 P2A Report, Mr. Zuniga failed to file the report (ROI Exhibit 4 and ROI Exhibit 15, page 1)

10. By letters dated July 21, 2014 and July 30, 2014, the Division informed Mr. Zuniga that the committee's 2014 P2A Report had not been received. The letters informed Mr. Zuniga that failure to file the report would result in a referral of the matter to the Florida Elections Commission for further action, and both letters were mailed to the address listed on Respondent's DS-DE 6 form (ROI Exhibit 6)

11. On July 25, 2014, the designated due date for the committee's 2014 P3 Report, Mr. Zuniga failed to file the report. (ROI Exhibit 4 and ROI Exhibit 15, page 1)

12. By letter dated July 28, 2014, the Division informed Mr. Zuniga that the committee's 2014 P3 Report had not been received. The letter informed Mr. Zuniga that failure to file a campaign treasurer's report may constitute a violation of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and if he failed to file the report, the Division would turn the matter over to the Florida Elections Commission (ROI Exhibit 7)

13. On August 1, 2014, the designated due date for the committee's 2014 P4 Report, Mr. Zuniga failed to file the report. (ROI Exhibit 4 and ROI Exhibit 15, page 1) 14. By letter dated August 4, 2014, the Division informed Mr. Zuniga that the committee's 2014 P4 Report had not been received. The letter informed Mr. Zuniga that failure to file a campaign treasurer's report may constitute a violation of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and if he failed to file the report, the Division would turn the matter over to the Florida Elections Commission. (ROI Exhibit 8)

15. A "Final Notice" letter dated August 8, 2014 was sent via certified mail and confirmed delivered to Mr Zuniga on August 11, 2014, and it informed Respondent that the committee's 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, 2014 P3, and the 2014 P4 Reports had not been filed. The Final Notice letter included copies of the failure-to-file letters previously mailed by the Division, and the letter instructed Respondent to file each of the outstanding reports within 7 days of receipt of the "Final Notice" letter (ROI Exhibit 9)

16. During its investigation, Commission staff attempted to subpoen bank records from Respondent's campaign depository By letter dated February 19, 2015, Bethany Castoreno, Research Manager and Records Custodian, Mid-Florida Credit Union, informed Commission staff that she was unable to locate any campaign accounts for Michael Zuniga. Although Respondent listed Mid-Florida Credit Union as its campaign depository on its DS-DE 6 form, it appears that Respondent never opened a campaign depository. (ROI Exhibits 10 and 2)

17. In pertinent part, Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, states:

[I]n any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

18 According to Ms. Bronson, "The notice that no report will be filed is the waiver, which must be filed in the EFS. We do not require anything separate in writing" (ROI Exhibit 13)

19 On January 26, 2015, after having received seven written failure-to-file notices from the Division, as well as this complaint, Respondent filed waivers-of-report for the committee's 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, and the 2014 P4 Reports. However, Respondent still has not filed the committee's 2014 P3 Report. (ROI Exhibit 15, page 1)

20 "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v State, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

Staff Recommendation FEC 14-285

21. The facts set forth above show that Michael Zuniga is the Chairman and Treasurer for Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities political committee. Respondent failed to timely notify the filing officer that the committee had no reportable activity for the 2014 P2, 2014 P2A, 2014 P3, and 2014 P4 Reports. On January 26, 2015, Respondent filed waivers-of-report, indicating the committee had no financial activity, for three of the committee's outstanding reports, but the committee's 2014 P3 Report has yet to be filed.

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Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following statutory provisions:

Count 1:

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On or about July 11, 2014, Michael Zuniga violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 P2 Report covering June 28, 2014 through July 4, 2014.

<u>Count 2</u>:

On or about July 18, 2014, Michael Zuniga violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 P2A Report covering July 5, 2014 through July 11, 2014.

Count 3:

On or about July 25, 2014, Michael Zuniga violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 P3 Report covering July 12, 2014 through July 18, 2014.

<u>Count 4</u>:

On or about August 1, 2014, Michael Zuniga violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 P4 Report covering July 19, 2014 through July 25, 2014.

Count 5:

On or about July 25, 2014, Michael Zuniga violated Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when he failed to file the committee's 2014 P3 Report on the prescribed reporting date.

Pursuant to Section 106 25, Florida Statutes, on September 2, 2014, the Florida Elections Commission received information from the Division of Elections that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The Division's referral was mandated pursuant to Section 106 22(7), Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

> Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed; and

> Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

I. Preliminary Information:

1 Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections. Michael Zuniga is the chairman and treasurer. This political committee's special interest is "Legal Employment and hiring practices."

2 Complainant is the Division of Elections.

3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid-Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.

4. On March 6, 2014, Respondent filed a current Statement of Organization of Political Committee (DS-DE 5) form with the Division of Elections. The area, scope, and jurisdiction of the committee are listed as "Political committee formed to sponsor constitutional amendment." To view a copy of the DS-DE 5 form, refer to exhibit 1

5 On March 6, 2014, Respondent filed a current Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees (DS-DE 6) form with the Division of Elections This form appointed Michael Zuniga as treasurer. To view a copy of the current DS-DE 6 form, refer to exhibit 2.

6. On March 7, 2014, Ms. Kristi Reid Bronson sent Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as

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Respondent's treasurer—a letter acknowledging his appointment. This letter also informed Mr Zuniga of his confidential "PIN" number to access the Division of Election's electronic filing system (EFS) for submitting campaign treasurer's reports and waivers To view a copy of this March 7, 2014 acknowledgement letter, refer to exhibit 3

7. On September 2, 2014, the Commission received a referral from the Division alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed, for four reporting periods. Table 1 summarizes the failure-to-file notices mailed to Respondent informing them that their reports had not been received. Each notice was mailed to the address Respondent provided on their DS-DE 6 form (Exhibit 2) To view a copy of the sworn affidavit from Complainant, refer to exhibit 4 To view copies of the failure-to-file letters, please refer to exhibits 5 through 8

8. On August 8, 2014, Complainant mailed Respondent a certified letter marked "Final Notice" stating that Respondent's reports had not been filed (Table 1). This letter also included copies of the failure-to-file letters that were previously sent to Respondent. This letter was mailed to the address provided on the DS-DE 6 form (Exhibit 2). To review a copy of the "Final Notice" letter with delivery confirmation, refer to exhibit 9.

9 The allegations that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed during the reporting periods listed in Table 1 will be discussed in the following paragraphs

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

10. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file treasurer's reports, or written notices to the filing officer that no reports would be filed due to the lack of reportable activity during the 2014 P2, P2A, P3, and P4 reporting periods, on the prescribed reporting dates.

11. On February 17, 2015, I subpoenaed Respondent's campaign account records from Mid-Florida Credit Union, the campaign depository listed on Respondent's current DS-DE 6 form (Exhibit 2). In a Business Records Declaration dated February 19, 2015, Bethany Castoreno, Research Manager/Custodian of Records, stated "Upon searching our database, we are unable to locate any campaign accounts for Michael Zuniga." To view a copy of the February 19, 2015 declaration, refer to exhibit 10.

12 On February 17, 2015, I also subpoenaed Respondent's campaign account records from J P Morgan Chase Bank N A. Respondent listed this bank as his depository on a previously filed DS-DE 6 form on February 26, 2014. In a Business Records Declaration dated February 27, 2015, Joan West, Document Review Specialist, stated "Based on the information you provided in the Subpoena Duces Tecum for the subject(s), a good faith search was conducted of our existing computer systems for any information or records related to the named subject(s) However, JPMorgan Chase Bank, N A. was unable to locate any information or records related to the named subject(s)". To view a copy of the February 26, 2014 DS-DE 6 form, refer to exhibit 11. To view a copy of the February 27, 2015 declaration, please refer to exhibit 12.

13. Based upon Ms. Castoreno's and Ms. West's declarations in response to the Commission's subpoenas, it appears that Respondent did not have any contributions or expenditures during the 2014 P2, P2A, P3, and P4 reporting periods.¹ Therefore, it appears there was no campaign activity for Respondent to disclose during those reporting periods.

14. Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

15. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to timely notify the filing officer, in writing, that no reports were being filed due to not receiving any contributions or making any expenditures during the 2014 P2, P2A, P3, and P4 reporting periods.

16 To review the circumstances regarding Respondent's contribution and expenditure activity, please refer to paragraphs 11 through 13 of this report.

17 Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, states in part:

"Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date."

18 In an e-mail dated April 2, 2014, Ms Bronson was asked to clarify the procedure

¹ The reporting periods covered the period beginning with the 2014 P2 report covering the period June 28, 2014 through July 4, 2014, and ending with the 2014 P4 report covering the period July 19, 2014 through July 25, 2014. The subpoenas requested all deposit items and all checks drawn on the account, from June 1, 2014 through August 1, 2014 as well as signature cards and monthly bank statements It appears Respondent never opened a bank account.

regarding how to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed. In her response, Ms. Bronson stated, "The notice that no report will be filed is the waiver, which must be filed in the EFS We do not require anything separate in writing." To view a copy of Ms. Bronson's e-mail, please refer to exhibit 13

19. Based upon Ms Castoreno's and Ms. West's declarations and Ms Bronson's email, because Respondent did not have any contributions or expenditures during the reporting periods beginning with the 2014 P2 report covering the period June 28 to July 4, 2014, and ending with the 2014 P4 report covering the period July 19, 2014 to July 25, 2014, it appears Respondent was required to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for those reporting periods by indicating on the Division's EFS that there was no activity to disclose.

20. According to Respondent's filing history, three of the waivers of reports were filed on January 26, 2015. As of the date of this report, the 2014 P3 Report has not been filed. Table 2 summarizes the reports and dates the notifications were due and filed. To view copies of the waivers for the 2014 P2, P2A, and P4 reporting periods, refer to Exhibit 14. To view a copy Respondent's filing history, please refer to exhibit 15.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update information. The enclosed sealed envelopes contain your confidential pin numbers.

Each political committee chairperson is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that the password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the chairperson and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106 07(5), Florida Statutes.





Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, or a person acting on its behalf, falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file reports on the prescribed reporting date for each of the following reporting periods:

You may file a response to the report <u>within 14 days from the date the report is mailed to you</u>. Based on the results of the investigation, legal staff will make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapter 104 or 106, Florida Statutes A copy of the Staff Recommendation will be mailed to you and you may file a response <u>within 14 days from the date the recommendation is mailed to you</u>. Your timely filed response(s) will be considered by the Commission when determining probable cause

The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence.

At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement.

The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, are <u>confidential</u> until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.
