If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 23, 2021, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On January 5, 2021, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about September 20, 2018, Anika Omphroy violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when she failed to file the campaign's 2018 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days after becoming unopposed as a candidate.


Count 2:

On or around September 20, 2018, Anika Omphroy violated Section

106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when she deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach

any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.141(1)**, and **106.19(1)(c)**, **Florida Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, **Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on December 7, 2020, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On March 7, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections (“Division” or “Complainant”), alleging that Anika Omphroy (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95. Respondent’s Statement of Candidate form (“DS-DE 84”) was filed on March 12, 2018. (ROI Exhibit 2)¹

3. By letter dated April 5, 2019, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because she had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2018 termination reporting period.

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, failed to timely file her 2018 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in her 2018 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

¹ The Report of Investigation is referred to herein as “ROI.”

4. On March 12, 2018, Respondent filed her Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form (“DS-DE 9”) appointing herself as treasurer for her campaign. (ROI Exhibit 1, page 1)

5. By letter dated March 13, 2018, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received her DS-DE 9 and that her name was placed on the 2018 active candidate list. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 1)

6. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (“EFS”), and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 1) The letter further advised Respondent that all of the Division’s publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*, as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2)

Alleged Violation: Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes

7. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida’s election laws by failing to timely file the campaign’s 2018 Termination Report.

8. Respondent was unopposed as a candidate. (ROI, p. 1, ¶1) Respondent was required to dispose of the funds on deposit in her campaign account and file the campaign’s 2018 Termination Report within 90 days after becoming unopposed as a candidate.

9. On September 21, 2018, and February 21, 2019, the Division sent letters notifying Respondent that her report had not been received. (ROI Exhibits 4 & 5)

10. A subpoena was issued to Respondent’s designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the relevant reporting period, i.e., June 23, 2018 – September 20, 2018. Respondent’s bank records show seven or more contributions (including transfers from online fundraising platforms) totaling \$2,386.77, nineteen expenditures (including cash withdrawals) totaling \$2,710.44, seven bank fees (overdraft fees, returned item fees, and negative account balance fees) totaling \$288, one refund totaling \$36, and two charge off credits from the bank totaling \$258.31. (ROI Exhibit 7)

11. Respondent stated that she understood that she did not report some contributions and expenditures. She stated that the discrepancies between her report and bank records were for the most part true, that she paid her campaign manager with cash withdrawn, and that she had not reported all contributions and expenditures correctly. (ROI Exhibit 8, pages 2 & 3) On May 7, 2019, the report was filed. It was 229 days late. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 1) Respondent reported receiving zero contributions and making two expenditures totaling \$1,200. (ROI Exhibit 6, pages 3-7)

12. As it appears that Respondent had reportable financial activity during the relevant reporting period, Respondent was required to file the campaign's 2018 Termination Report within 90 days after becoming unopposed as a candidate, but failed to do so.

Alleged Violation: Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes

13. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report.

14. Based on the above analysis, Respondent had reportable financial activity during the relevant reporting period. Therefore, Respondent was required to disclose the financial activity on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report.

15. To date, Respondent has not disclosed the \$5,679.52 in financial activity but rather disclosed two expenditures which are not supported by Respondent's bank records. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 5; ROI Exhibit 7, pages 1 & 2) With regard to Respondent's deliberate failure to include information on the campaign's report, she may have failed to disclose the campaign's financial activity as the funds were not disposed of properly pursuant to sections 106.141(4)(a), and 106.11(5), Florida Statutes, but were spent at gas stations, restaurants, and other nonapproved vendors, as the campaign account was overdrawn in violation of section 106.11(4), Florida Statutes, as contributions were received after Respondent became unopposed in violation of section 106.08(3)(b), Florida Statutes, and as Respondent made cash withdrawals in violation of section 106.12(2), Florida Statutes. Respondent was not a first-time candidate. (Attachment A)

16. Respondent deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report.

Alleged Violation: Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes

17. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed for the 2018 Termination reporting period.

18. Based on the above analysis, the campaign was not required to submit a notice of no activity for the 2018 Termination reporting period as there was reportable financial activity that Respondent was required to disclose on her 2018 Termination Report.

19. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

20. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95. Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2018 Termination Report within 90 days after becoming unopposed as a candidate. Respondent deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report. Respondent was not required to notify the filing officer that she would not be filing her 2018 Termination Report because the campaign had reportable financial activity.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**, and find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about September 20, 2018, Anika Omphroy violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when she failed to file the campaign's 2018 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days after becoming unopposed as a candidate.

Count 2:

On or around September 20, 2018, Anika Omphroy violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when she deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2018 Termination Report.

Division of Elections (Division)

Referral Filed: March 7, 2019

Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate who did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during the TR reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no TR is being filed or failure to file a TR to reflect financial activity.

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent was a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95; she was unopposed in both the primary and general elections. Respondent was a first-time candidate.

2. An Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on March 12, 2018. Respondent appointed herself as campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 1.¹

3. Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate with the Division on March 12, 2018 in which she certified she had been provided access to read and understand Chapter 106, F.S. To review a copy of the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 2.

4. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 on March 13, 2018. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to file by means of the Division’s electronic filing system (EFS). Respondent was provided with a user identification number and initial password allowing her access to the EFS.

5. The acknowledgement letter also advised Respondent that all of the Division’s publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter further advised Respondent that it was her responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida’s election laws. To review the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 3.

¹ Respondent filed a second DS-DE 9 on June 22, 2018; she changed her depository but left herself treasurer.

6. The Division sent correspondence to Respondent notifying her that she had not filed either a termination report or notification that no reportable activity occurred and reminded her that the filing date was September 20, 2018. The correspondence was mailed to Respondent at the address provided on the DS-DE 9. To review the failure to file correspondence, refer to Exhibit 4.²

7. On February 21, 2019, the Division sent Respondent a letter marked “Final Notice” with delivery confirmation stating that her 2018 termination report, or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed. The letter was mailed to Respondent at an updated mailing address, and it was confirmed delivered on February 23, 2019. To review the letter marked “Final Notice” and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 5.

II. Alleged Violation of Sections 106.07(7), 106.141, and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

8. I investigated whether Respondent violated these sections of the election laws either by not notifying the filing officer, in writing, that no TR would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making expenditures during the TR reporting period or by not filing a TR to reflect financial activity during the TR reporting period. I also investigated whether Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, by not disposing of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of becoming unopposed. To review a copy of Respondent’s filing history, refer to Exhibit 6.

9. Campaign account records disclose that many expenditures transpired during the TR period in amounts varying from \$2.00 to \$360.00 for purposes such as gas, coffee, parking fees, and bank fees. Many deposits or credits were made during the TR period in amounts varying from \$36.00 to \$853.00.

10. On the date the TR was due, campaign account records reflect that the balance was \$0.00. To review the relevant bank statement, refer to Exhibit 7, page 5.

11. Respondent filed her 2018 TR on May 7, 2019. To review a copy of the TR, refer to Exhibit 6.

12. Respondent did not respond to the referral.

13. Respondent did not respond to a questionnaire-affidavit. Because the affidavit has not been returned, I am unable to ascertain whether she has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*.

² The letter was returned undelivered on October 25, 2018.

³ I subpoenaed Respondent’s campaign account records from the designated campaign depository.

14. On May 27, 2020, and November 9, 2020, I called Respondent for the purpose of reviewing the referral with her. Respondent stated she did not have a physical copy of the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* for 2020, but understood where to find it on the Division website and what my investigation encompassed, and believed she had a copy from her previous campaign in 2018. Respondent stated she has since filed outstanding CTRs.

Respondent stated she was the primary care giver for her grandmother while her grandmother faced medical issues from November 2019 to February 2020, including being admitted to the ICU. Respondent acknowledged that she was required to report her activity but failed to do so by the prescribed due date. To review a copy of the phone log, refer to Exhibit 8.

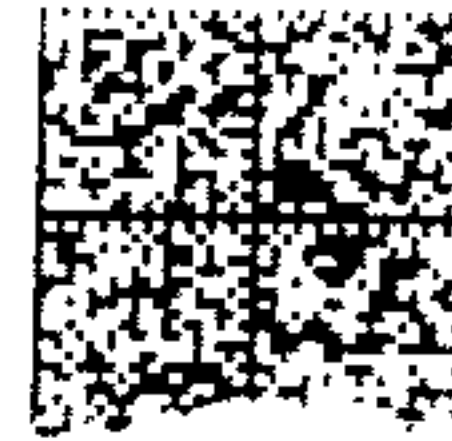

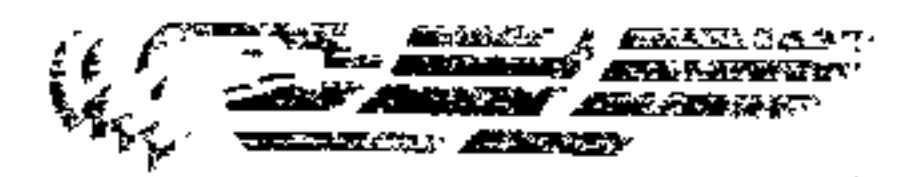

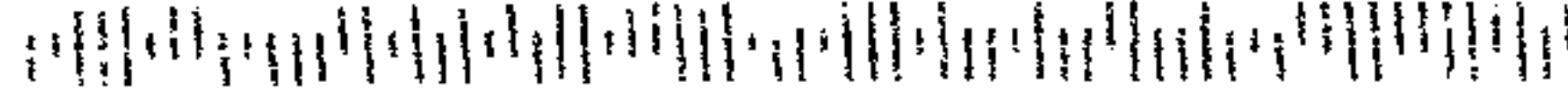

On March 7, 2019, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2018 termination reporting period.

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, failed to timely file her 2018 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2018 candidate for State Representative, District 95, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in her 2018 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will make a written recommendation (Staff Recommendation or SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge respondent with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold

one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed. You and the complainant will receive notice at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.




