### ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

**THIS MATTER** was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on August 16, 2017, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On June 2, 2017, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

#### Count 1:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to dispose of the funds on deposit in his campaign account within 90 days of being eliminated.

#### Count 2:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of being eliminated.

#### Count 3:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106 on the campaign's 2016 TR.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. #### STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.141(1) and 106.19(1)(c)**, Florida **Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violation **Section 106.07(7)**, Florida **Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on April 18, 2017, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

- 1. On October 21, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that Tommy B. Hayfield ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 32. He failed to qualify.
- 3. By letter dated March 8, 2017, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, failed to timely file his 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in his 2016 Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.

- 4 On April 11, 2016, Respondent filed an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository form ("DS-DE 9") with the Division. Respondent appointed himself as his own campaign treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 1) 1
- 5. By letter dated April 12, 2016, Kristi Reid Bronson, Division of Elections, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Respondent that his DS-DE 9 was filed with the Division on April 11, 2016. The letter also contained a sealed envelope containing Respondent's confidential PIN number to access the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 2)
- 6. Ms. Bronson's April 12, 2016, letter also informed Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on the Division's website, including Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter notified Respondent that it was his responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. (*Id.*)
- 7. On April 19, 2016, Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate form with the Division in which he acknowledged that he had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. (ROI Exhibit 18)
- 8. On September 22, 2016, Respondent's 2016 Termination Report ("TR") was due since he failed to qualify. However, Respondent failed to file it. On September 23, 2016, the Division sent Respondent written notification that the campaign's 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. (ROI Exhibit 3)
- 9. On October 3, 2016, the Division sent Respondent a letter marked "Final Notice" that the campaign's 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. The final notice was delivered to Respondent on October 5, 2016, at the address provided on his DS-DE 9. (ROI Exhibits 4-5)
- 10. The investigation secured Respondent's campaign account records from his campaign depository, Wells Fargo Bank, N.A. The below table identifies Respondent's campaign finance activity during his 2016 TR reporting period of June 25, 2016, through September 21, 2016, and identifies the balance in his campaign depository. (ROI Exhibits 7-10)

Based upon Respondent's monthly bank statements, Respondent used a debit card for expenditures to his campaign account during the 2016 TR cover period as indicated in the table.

- 11. Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, requires a candidate to dispose of the funds on deposit in his campaign account and file a report reflecting the disposition of all remaining funds within 90 days of withdrawing his candidacy, becoming an unopposed candidate, being eliminated as a candidate, or being elected to office.
- 12. Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibits a candidate from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include any information required by Chapter 106.
- 13. Pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, in any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate is required to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.
- 14. Since a review of Respondent's bank records has revealed several reportable financial transactions that occurred during the 2016 TR reporting period, Respondent was required to timely file the campaign's 2016 TR reporting all transactions associated with disposition of all remaining campaign funds.
- 15. However, Respondent did not timely file the campaign's 2016 TR, and Division records show that as of May 30, 2017, Respondent had still not filed the campaign's 2016 TR. (Attachment A)
- 16. Respondent was offered multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff's investigation, but failed to do so. Therefore, Respondent did not provide an explanation for his failure to dispose of all funds on deposit in his campaign account and file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all such funds within 90 days of being eliminated. Respondent failed to disclose \$59.49 of expenditures that occurred during the 2016 TR reporting period. Further, as of September 22, 2016, the date that the 2016 TR was due, Respondent's campaign account remained open with a balance of \$1,440.08.
- 17. Based upon the information above, it appears that Respondent failed to dispose of all funds remaining on deposit in his campaign account and file the campaign's 2016 TR by the required due date, and Respondent failed to disclose numerous expenditures made during the 2016 TR reporting period.

- 18. "Probable Cause" is defined as a reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reason able man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 19. The above facts show that Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 32. He failed to qualify, and was thus eliminated from the race. Respondent failed to dispose of all funds on deposit in his campaign account and file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all such funds within 90 days of being eliminated. A review of Respondent's bank records revealed that as of the due date of the 2016 TR, the campaign account remained open with a substantial balance of funds. Further, the bank records showed several expenditures that occurred during the 2016 TR reporting period which Respondent did not disclose.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violation Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, and find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following:

#### Count 1:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to dispose of the funds on deposit in his campaign account within 90 days of being eliminated.

#### Count 2:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of being eliminated.

#### Count 3:

On or about September 22, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106 on the campaign's 2016 TR.

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, on October 21, 2016, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received information from the Division of Elections ("DOE") alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed;

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate to file a termination report reflecting the disposition of all remaining funds in his campaign account within 90 days after he withdrew, became unopposed, was eliminated, or elected; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

# I. Preliminary Information:

- 1. Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 32; he failed to qualify. Respondent appointed himself campaign treasurer, designated Wells Fargo Bank, N.A. as his campaign depository, and filed his Forms DS-DE 9 with the DOE on April 11, 2016, and June 3, 2016. (Note: Respondent changed his political party affiliation identified on his Form DS-DE 9 filed on June 3, 2016.) To review his Forms DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 1.
  - 2. Complainant is the DOE.
- 3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.
- 4. On April 12, 2016, Ms. Bronson sent Respondent a letter acknowledging his name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. The letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the DOE are required to use the electronic filing system ("EFS"), and provided

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Respondent with his user identification number and initial password allowing him access to the EFS. To review the letter, refer to Exhibit 2.

- 5. The letter also advised Respondent that all DOE publications and reporting forms are available on its website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. The letter further advised Respondent that it was his responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. (Note: the instructions appear in bold font.) To review the letter, refer to Exhibit 2.
- 6. On September 22, 2016, Respondent's 2016 Termination Report ("TR") was due since he failed to qualify. On September 23, 2016, the DOE mailed Respondent notification that his 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. To review the notification, refer to Exhibit 3.
- 7. On October 3, 2016, the DOE mailed Respondent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation that his 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. The final notice was delivered to Respondent at the address provided on his DS-DE 9 form. To review the final notification, refer to Exhibit 4. To review the delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 5.
- 8. On October 21, 2016, the Commission received a referral from the DOE alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity during his 2016 TR period, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. The allegations will be addressed in the paragraphs that follow.

## II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

- 9. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to notify the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed for the 2016 TR cover period.
- 10. On February 28, 2017, I secured Respondent's campaign account records from his campaign depository, Wells Fargo Bank, N.A. To review Respondent's campaign account application, refer to Exhibit 6.
- 11. Table 1 identifies Respondent's campaign finance activity during his 2016 TR cover period of June 25, 2016 through September 21, 2016, and identifies the balance in Respondent's campaign depository. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for June 11, 2016 July 13, 2016, refer to Exhibit 7. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for July 14, 2016 August 10, 2016, refer to Exhibit 8. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for August 11, 2016 September 13, 2016, refer to Exhibit 9. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for September 14, 2016 October 13, 2016, refer to Exhibit 10.

- 12. It appears that Respondent was required to file his 2016 TR based upon the campaign finance activity identified in Table 1. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statements for the 2016 TR cover period, refer to Exhibits 7 through 10.
- 13. Also, it appears Respondent failed to dispose of the remaining funds in his campaign account within 90 days of failing to qualify. Based upon the relevant monthly bank statement (Exhibit 10) from Respondent's campaign depository, as of September 22, 2016, the date Respondent's 2016 TR was due, Respondent's campaign account remained open with a balance of \$1,440.08.
- 14. And it appears Respondent had unreported campaign finance activity after his 2016 TR was due on September 22, 2016. In an apparent attempt to "zero out" his campaign account, Respondent transferred the remaining balance in his campaign account—in the amount of \$127.56—to his personal account on December 12, 2016. However, the same day, a \$10.00 monthly service fee was posted by the Bank, and the balance for Respondent's campaign account was overdrawn by \$10.00. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for October 14, 2016 November 10, 2016, refer to Exhibit 11. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for November 11, 2016 December 12, 2016, refer to Exhibit 12.
- 15. On December 13, 2016, the Bank completed a "Partial Monthly Service Fee Reversal" in the amount of \$5.00, and Respondent transferred \$5.00 from his personal account to

his campaign account. Respondent's campaign depository had an ending balance of \$0.00 on the monthly bank statement for December 13, 2016 through January 12, 2017. To review relevant pages of Respondent's monthly bank statement for December 13, 2016 through January 12, 2017, refer to Exhibit 13.

- 16. Respondent did not respond to the notice of the referral or to Ms. Toman's letter of legal sufficiency. I attempted to contact Respondent by telephone on four occasions to give him an opportunity to discuss the allegations in the referral. An affidavit-questionnaire was e-mailed to Respondent on March 3, 2017, and was provided my contact number and e-mail address. And a letter with an affidavit-questionnaire was mailed to Respondent on March 6, 2017. As of the date of this report of investigation ("ROI"), Respondent has not responded to the instant case, returned my phone calls, returned an affidavit-questionnaire nor has my correspondence been returned by the USPS. To review the phone log, refer to Exhibit 14. To review the e-mail to Respondent, refer to Exhibit 15. To review the affidavit-questionnaire, refer to Exhibit 16. To review the letter to Respondent, refer to Exhibit 17.
- 17. I found no record of previous complaints to indicate that Respondent has violated this section of Florida's election laws.

#### III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes:

- 18. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to file his 2016 TR reflecting the disposition of all remaining funds in his campaign account within 90 days of failing to qualify.
- 19. To review information regarding this section of the election laws, refer to paragraphs 11 through 16 in this report.
- 20. I found no record of previous complaints to indicate that Respondent has violated this section of Florida's election laws.

# IV. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

- 21. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to report campaign activity during the 2016 Termination-Report period.
- 22. To review information regarding this section of the election laws, refer to paragraphs 11 through 16 in this report.
- 23. I found no record of previous complaints to indicate that Respondent has violated this section of Florida's election laws.

#### V. FEC History:

24. Respondent has no history of additional complaints filed against him with the Commission at the time of this complaint.

#### Conclusion:

- 25. On April 13 and 17, 2017, I attempted to contact Respondent by telephone on three occasions to conduct a final interview by telephone, and give him an opportunity to respond to the information gathered during the investigation concerning the allegations made in the referral since he has not responded to my earlier attempts to reach him by telephone, and in writing (Exhibits 15 and 17). At the time of this ROI, Respondent has not returned my calls nor an affidavit-questionnaire (Exhibit 16). To review the phone log, refer to Exhibit 14, entry numbers 1, and 6 through 8.
- 26. As previously discussed in paragraph 5 of this ROI, on April 12, 2016, Ms. Bronson sent Respondent a letter (Exhibit 2) advising him that all DOE publications and reporting forms are available on its website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. The letter (Exhibit 2) further advised Respondent that it was his responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. (Note: the instructions appear in **bold** font.)
- 27. I have been unable to ascertain what information Respondent reviewed from the DOE since he has not returned my calls (Exhibit 14) or an affidavit-questionnaire (Exhibit 16). Respondent executed a Statement of Candidate (Form DS-DE 84) indicating he had "been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes." The form indicates he signed it on April 15, 2016, and it was filed with the DOE on April 19, 2016. To review a copy of Respondent's Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 18.
- 28. During my investigation of the allegations contained in the sworn referral, it appears Respondent notified the filing officer that no report would be filed by filing waivers-of-report indicating he had no campaign finance activity for three report cover periods covering April 1 through 30, 2016 (2016 M4 Report); May 1 through 31, 2016 (2016 M5 Report); and June 1 through 24, 2016 (2016 P1 Report). However, it appears there was campaign finance activity that should have been disclosed. Because these potential violations were not alleged in the complaint, I did not further investigate this information.



Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as What is your mother's maiden name?) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

#### **Timely Filing**

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

#### **Electronic Receipts**

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your termination report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was September 22, 2016.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as \$50 per day until you file your report. The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. #### **Timely Filing**

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

#### **Electronic Receipts**

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.
