ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 17, 2015, in Tallahassee, Florida.

Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1

On or about September 12, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 12, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G1A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2

On or about September 19, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 19, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3

On or about September 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G2A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4

On or about October 3, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 3, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5

On or about October 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6

On or about October 17, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 17, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7

On or about October 24, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 24, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 8

On or about October 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 9

On or about October 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 10

On or about October 27, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 27, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 11

On or about October 28, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 28, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 12

On or about October 29, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 29, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 13

On or about October 30, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 30, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 14

On or about October 31, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 31, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 15

On or about November 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before November 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 M10 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 16

On or about December 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before December 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 M11 Report on the prescribed due date.


Count 17

On or about January 12, 2015, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before January 12, 2015, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 M12 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 18

On or about February 10, 2015, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before February 10, 2015, that Respondent would not be filing its 2015 M1 Report on the prescribed due date.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 11, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On March 17, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections, alleging that Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities, ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
2. Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Department of State, Division of Elections, and Michael Zuniga is listed as its chairperson and treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 1)¹
3. Complainant alleged that Respondent failed to notify its filing officer in writing that no reports would be filed on the applicable reporting date for the following reports: 2014 G1A, 2014 G2, 2014 G2A, 2014 G3, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, 2014 M10, 2014 M11, 2014 M12, and the 2015 M1 Reports.
4. By letter dated August 19, 2015, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no reports would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

5. Respondent filed its State of Florida Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository For Political Committees form (“DS-DE 6”), on March 6, 2014, and appointed Michael Zuniga as its campaign treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 2)

6. By letter dated March 7, 2014, the Division acknowledged receipt of Respondent's DS-DE 6 form, and indicated that Respondent's organization had been placed on the active committee list as a political committee. The letter advised Respondent that all political committees that file reports with the Division of Elections are required to use the electronic filing system (EFS), and provided Michael Zuniga, as chairperson and treasurer, with his user identification and initial password to access the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 3)

7. Ms. Bronson's letter also informed Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on its website. The letter advised Respondent to print a copy of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, *2014 Calendar of Reporting Dates*, and the *2014 Political Committee Handbook*. *Id.*

8. The *Political Committee EFS User's Guide* explained the process of filing a waiver-of-report using the electronic filing system (EFS). Listed on page 13 are specific instructions about checking the box next to "waiver" when there is no financial activity to disclose. (ROI Exhibit 25, pages 4-6)

9. In pertinent part, Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, state:

[A]ny candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter **shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.** (emphasis added)

11 As part of its investigation, Commission staff subpoenaed campaign account records from Mid-Florida Credit Union, which is listed as Respondent's campaign depository on its DS-DE 5 form. (ROI Exhibit 1) According to Bethany Castoreno, Research Manager, Custodian of Records, she was unable to locate any accounts in the name of Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities. Therefore, it appears that Respondent never opened a campaign depository and did not have any contributions or expenditures to report during the 18 reporting periods referenced in this referral. (ROI Exhibit 24)

12 Respondent was given multiple opportunities to respond to the Division's referral but has failed to provide a response or return Commission staff's phone calls. (See ROI, paragraphs 27, 28, and 29)

13 It appears that complainant is correct and Respondent has committed eighteen violations of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no reports would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds for the 2014 G1A, 2014 G2A, 2014 G3, 2014 G4, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, 2014 M10, 2014 M11, 2014 M12, and the 2014 M1 Reports (ROI Exhibit 26)

Alleged Violation: Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes

14 Because Respondent did not open a campaign depository and did not have any contributions or expenditures to report during the 2014 reporting cycle, Respondent has not falsely reported or failed include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, in violation of Section 106 19(1)(c), Florida Statutes.

15 "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged *Schmitt v State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995)

16. The facts set forth above show that Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections, and Michael Zuniga is its treasurer. During the 2014 election cycle, Mr. Zuniga failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for the 2014 G1A, 2014 G2, 2014 G2A, 2014 G3, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, 2014 M10, 2014 M11, 2014 M12, and the 2015 M1 Reports because it had no financial activity to report.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following statutory provision:

Count 1:

On or about September 12, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 12, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G1A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2:

On or about September 19, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 19, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3:

On or about September 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before September 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G2A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4:

On or about October 3, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 3, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5:

On or about October 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6:

On or about October 17, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 17, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7:

On or about October 24, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 24, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 8:

On or about October 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or October 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 9:

On or about October 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 10:

On or about October 27, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 27, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 11:

On or about October 28, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 28, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 12:

On or about October 29, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 29, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 13:

On or about October 30, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 30, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 D6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 14:

On or about October 31, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before October 31, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 G7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 15:

On or about November 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before November 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 M10 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 16:

On or about December 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on or before December 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing its 2014 M11 Report on the prescribed due date.





Respondent: Citizens for Fair Employment Opportunities

Complainant: Division of Elections

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, on March 17, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission received information from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The Division's referral was mandated pursuant to Section 106.07(8)(d), Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes; and

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections
2. Complainant is the Division of Elections
3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid-Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.
4. On March 6, 2014, Respondent filed a Statement of Organization of Political Committee (DS-DE 5) form with the Division of Elections. Respondent's area, scope and jurisdiction are listed as "Political committee formed to sponsor constitutional amendment." The form also listed Michael Zuniga as Respondent's chairman. To view a copy of the DS-DE 5 form, please refer to Exhibit 1.
5. On March 6, 2014, Respondent also filed an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees (DS-DE 6) form appointing Mr. Zuniga as Respondent's treasurer.¹ To view a copy of the DS-DE 6 form, please refer to Exhibit 2.
6. On March 7, 2014, Ms. Bronson sent Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as

¹ Mr. Zuniga is also Respondent's registered agent and chairperson.

Respondent's chair—a letter acknowledging Respondent had been placed on the active committee list. The letter advised Mr. Zuniga that all committees filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (EFS). Mr. Zuniga was provided with a user identification number and initial password allowing Mr. Zuniga access to the EFS.

7. The letter also advised Mr. Zuniga that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Political Committee Handbook*, and the Calendar of Reporting Dates. The letter further advised Mr. Zuniga that it was his responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To view a copy of the acknowledgement letter, please refer to Exhibit 3.

8. On March 17, 2015, the Commission received a referral from the Division alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed, for 18 reporting periods. Table 1 summarizes the failure-to-file notices mailed to Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as Respondent's chair—informing him that Respondent's reports had not been received. Each notice was mailed to Mr. Zuniga at the address Respondent provided on their DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). To view copies of the failure-to-file letters, please refer to Exhibit 4 through 21.

9. On March 3, 2015, the Division also sent Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as treasurer and chair—a letter marked “Final Notice” stating Respondent’s reports had not been filed (Table 1). Copies of the failure-to-file letters previously provided as Exhibits 4 through 21 were included with the Final Notice. The Final Notice was mailed to Mr. Zuniga at the address provided on the committee’s DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1) and was delivered on March 6, 2015. To view copies of the Final Notice, without attachments, and delivery confirmation, please refer to Exhibit 22.

10. On March 3, 2015, the Division also sent Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as treasurer and chair—a letter marked “Final Notice” stating Respondent’s 2015 M1 Report had not been filed. Copies of the failure-to-file letters previously provided as Exhibit 21 were included with the Final Notice. The Final Notice was mailed to Mr. Zuniga at the address provided on the committee’s DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1) and was delivered on March 6, 2015. To view copies of the Final Notice, without attachments, and delivery confirmation, please refer to Exhibit 23.

11. The allegations that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed during the reporting periods listed in Table 1 will be discussed in the paragraphs that follow.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

12. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of election laws by failing to disclose campaign activity for 18 reporting periods beginning with the 2014 G1A report covering the period August 30 to September 5, 2014, and ending with the 2015 M1 report covering the period January 1 to January 31, 2015.

13. On August 21, 2015, I subpoenaed Respondent’s campaign account records from Mid-Florida Credit Union, Respondent’s campaign depository listed on their DS-DE 5 form (Exhibit 1). In a letter dated August 25, 2015, Bethany Castoreno, Research Manager and Custodian of Records, stated she was unable to locate any accounts in Respondent’s name. To view a copy of Ms. Castoreno’s letter, please refer to Exhibit 24.

14. Based upon Ms. Castoreno’s letter in response to the Commission’s subpoena, it appears that Respondent did not have any contributions or expenditures during 18 reporting periods beginning with the 2014 G1A report covering the period August 30 to September 5, 2014, and ending with the 2015 M1 report covering the period January 1 to January 31, 2015². Therefore, it appears there was no campaign activity for Respondent to disclose during those reporting periods.

15. No record of Respondent having previously violated this section of law was found.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

² The reporting periods covered the period beginning with the 2014 G1A report covering the period August 30 to September 5, 2014, and ending with the 2015 M1 report covering the period January 1 through January 31, 2015. The subpoena requested all deposit items and all checks drawn on the account, from the opening of the account through the present as well as signature cards and monthly bank statements. It appears Respondent has never opened a bank account.

16. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of election laws by failing to notify their filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed for 18 reporting periods beginning with the 2014 G1A report covering the period August 30 to September 5, 2014, and ending with the 2015 M1 report covering the period January 1 to January 31, 2015.

17. To review the circumstances regarding Respondent's contribution and expenditure activity, please refer to paragraphs 13 and 14 of this report.

18. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, states in part:

"Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. Any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date."

19. Page 3 of the acknowledgement letter (Exhibit 3) states, "An online instruction guide is available to you on the EFS to assist with navigation, data entry, and submission of reports." The letter also provides the telephone number for the Division's EFS Help Desk.

20. Pages 12, 13, 45, and 46 of the *Political Committee EFS User's Guide* discuss how to notify the Division on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed using the EFS. Specifically, page 13 instructs the user to click the box next to "waiver" if there is no activity to disclose. To view the relevant pages of the *Political Committee EFS User's Guide*, please refer to Exhibit 25.

21. In a telephone interview on April 2, 2015, Kristi Reid-Bronson clarified that once the waiver box is chosen and a new report is opened as shown on Page 12, the only available option on the report summary screen will be "Go To File Report" as shown on Page 13. Choosing "Go To File Report" will take the user directly to the screens where the candidate/treasurer PINS are entered as shown on Pages 45 and 46.

22. Based upon Ms. Castoreno's letter, because Respondent did not have any contributions or expenditures during 18 reporting periods beginning with the 2014 G1A report covering the period August 30 to September 5, 2014, and ending with the 2015 M1 report covering the period January 1 to January 31, 2015, it appears Respondent was required to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for those reporting periods by indicating on the Division's EFS that there was no activity to disclose.

23. According to Respondent's filing history, the notifications that no reports would be filed remain outstanding as of the date of this report. Table 2 summarizes the reporting periods and dates the notifications were due. To view a copy Respondent's filing history, please refer to Exhibit 26.

24 Respondent was found to have violated this section of law on one previous occasion. In FEC 14-143, the Commission imposed a \$1,000 fine for one count of violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes. To view a copy of the Final Order, please refer to Exhibit 27

IV. FEC History:

25 In addition to case number FEC 14-143, at its August meeting the Commission found probable cause on four counts that Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes; the case number is FEC 14-285.

Conclusion:

26 On June 11, 2015, the Commission sent Mr. Zuniga a letter via certified mail informing him that it received a referral from the Division alleging violations of Florida's election laws. The letter advised Mr. Zuniga he had 14 days to respond to the allegations in the referral and was delivered to Respondent's address on June 24, 2015. Mr. Zuniga did not provide a response on behalf of Respondent. To view a copy of the Commission's June 11, 2015 letter,

please refer to Exhibit 28.

27. On August 19, 2015, the Commission sent Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as Respondent's chair—a letter informing him that the Division's referral was found to be legally sufficient and the Commission would be investigating Respondent's alleged failure to file 18 reports, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. The letter advised Mr. Zuniga he could file a notarized statement providing any information regarding the facts surrounding the allegation. Mr. Zuniga did not provide a notarized statement on behalf of Respondent. To view a copy of the Commission's August 19, 2015 letter, please refer to Exhibit 29.

28. On August 20, 2015, I mailed Mr. Zuniga—in his capacity as Respondent's chair—a questionnaire asking that he explain the reason why Respondent has not filed their reports or notified their filing officer that no reports would be filed. As of the date of this report, Respondent has not returned the questionnaire and the questionnaire has not been returned by the postal service as undeliverable. To view a copy of the affidavit, please refer to Exhibit 30.

29. On August 20, September 3 and September 8, 2015, I left voicemail messages asking Mr. Zuniga to return my call to discuss the allegations in the Division's referral. As of the date of this report, Mr. Zuniga has not returned my calls.

30. Because Mr. Zuniga has not returned my telephone calls during this investigation or any of the previous investigations against Respondent, I am unable to ascertain whether he has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Political Committee Handbook*.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update information. The enclosed sealed envelopes contain your confidential pin numbers.

Each political committee chairperson is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that the password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

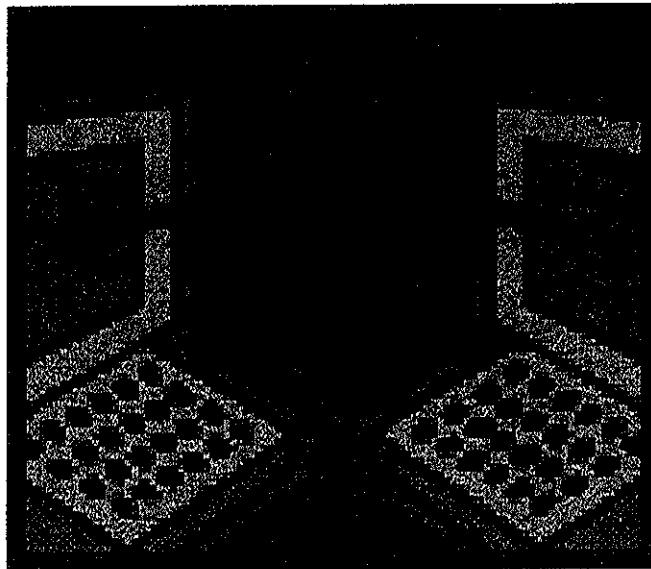

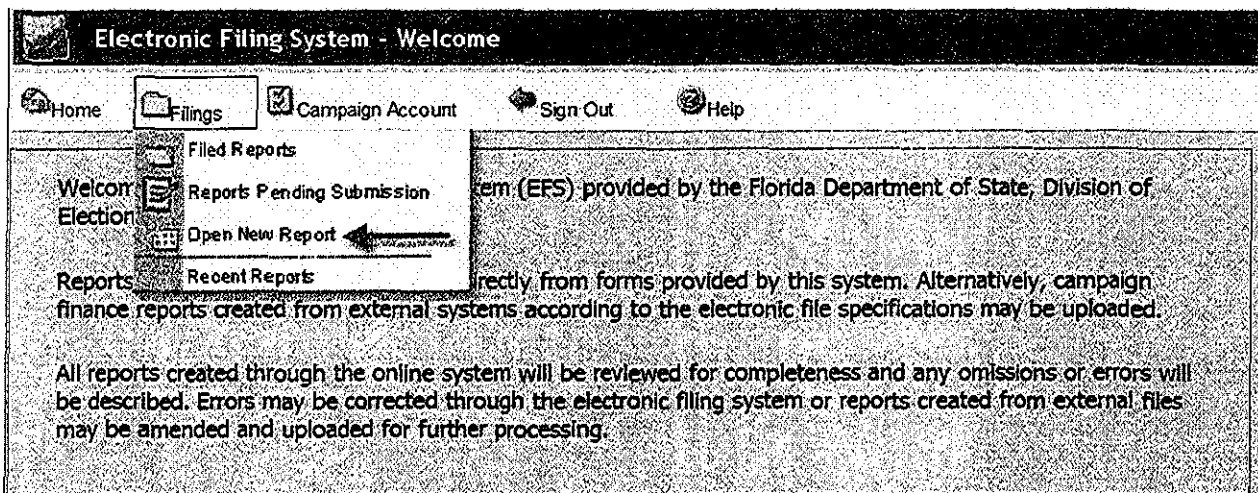

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

Whether Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, as alleged in the Order of Probable Cause.

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

On June 6, 2014, the Commission received a referral from the Division of Elections

alleging violations of Florida's election laws. Staff of the Commission conducted an investigation to determine whether the facts alleged in the complaint constituted probable cause to believe that Respondent violated the Florida Election Code.

On December 1, 2014, staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. On February 25, 2015, the Commission entered an Order of Probable Cause finding that there was probable cause to charge Respondent with the following violation:

Count 1:

On or about April 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 M3 Report, covering March 1, 2014 through March 31, 2014.

Respondent did not timely elect to have a formal administrative hearing before an administrative law judge from the Division of Administrative Hearings and, therefore, the matter was set for an informal hearing before the Commission. At the informal hearing, the Commission adopted the undisputed facts set forth in the Staff's Recommendation as its findings of fact.

Respondent testified before the Commission.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a political committee currently registered with the Division of Elections and Michael Zuniga is listed as its Chairman and Treasurer.

2. The committee's 2014 M3 Report was due on April 10, 2014; however, Mr. Zuniga failed to file the report.

3. The Division mailed letters to Mr. Zuniga on April 11, 2014, April 25, 2014, and

May 8, 2014, informing him that he committee's 2014 M3 Report had not been received.

4. Each of the three failure-to-file notices were sent to the address listed on Respondent's DS-DE 6 form

5. Despite having received three written reminders from the Division, Mr. Zuniga still has not filed the committee's 2014 M3 Report.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this cause, pursuant to Section 106.26, Florida Statutes

7. Respondent's conduct was willful. Respondent committed the acts while knowing that, or showing reckless disregard for whether, the acts were prohibited, or failed to commit an act while knowing that, or showing reckless disregard for whether, the acts were required.

8. Respondent committed 1 count of violating Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 M3 Report.

9. In determining the amount of the civil penalty, the Commission considered the mitigating and aggravating circumstances set forth in Section 106 265, Florida Statutes

ORDER

The Commission finds that Respondent has violated the following provisions of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and imposes the following fine:

A. Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, on 1 occasion for failing to timely notify the filing officer in writing that the committee had no reportable

activity and, therefore, would not be filing a report on the prescribed reporting date for the 2014 M3 Report. Respondent is fined \$1,000 for the violation

Therefore it is

ORDERED that Respondent shall remit a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000, inclusive of fees and costs. The civil penalty shall be paid to the Florida Elections Commission, Collins Building, Suite 224, 107 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399, within 30 days of the date this Final Order is filed with the Commission and must be paid by money order, cashier's check or attorney trust account check





The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing. The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing. You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral

statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence.


At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement

The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint. However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her



However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report

Your campaign treasurer's report, which was due January 12, 2015, has not been received.

Section 106 07(8)(b), Florida Statutes, requires that the filing officer immediately notify you of the failure to file this report and that a fine will be assessed of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter \$500 per day, although a fine cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

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Section 106 265(1), Florida Statutes, authorizes the Florida Elections Commission to impose a civil penalty up to \$1,000 per count for each willful violation of Chapter 106.
