ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on January 24, 2023, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On October 12, 2022, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or around September 10, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 M8 Report.

Count 2:

On or around October 9, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 G4 Report.

Count 3:

On or about October 23, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing the campaign's 2020 G6 Report.

Count 4:

On or around October 30, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 G7 Report.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. 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STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the sworn complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.07(7)**, and **106.19(1)(c)**, **Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on September 16, 2022, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

- 1. On December 17, 2020, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a sworn complaint from Jeffrey Modarelli ("Complainant"), alleging that Kyle Gibson ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2. Respondent's Statement of Candidate form ("DS-DE 84") was filed on February 13, 2020. (ROI Exhibit 2)¹
- 3. By letter dated June 15, 2022, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2020 M8
- 2020 G4
- 2020 G6
- 2020 G7

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the following reporting periods:

- 2020 M8
- 2020 G4

¹ The Report of Investigation is referred to herein as "ROI."

- 2020 G6
- 2020 G7
- 4. On January 6, 2020, Respondent's filing officer provided Respondent with a weblink to Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2) On February 1, 2020, Respondent acknowledged that he had been provided access to read the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. (ROI Exhibit 2)
- 5. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida's election laws by failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed or by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the following reporting periods: 2020 M8, 2020 G4, 2020 G6, and 2020 G7.
- 6. Respondent's 2020 M8, 2020 G4, 2020 G6, and 2020 G7 reports were due to be filed by September 10, 2020, October 9, 2020, October 23, 2020, and October 30, 2020, respectively; however, Respondent failed to timely file the reports or notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. (ROI Exhibit 4) Respondent's filing officer sent five letters notifying Respondent that his reports had not been received.
- 7. A subpoena was issued to Respondent's designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the relevant reporting periods, i.e., August 1, 2020 August 31, 2020, September 1, 2020 October 2, 2020, October 3, 2020 October 16, 2020, and October 17, 2020 October 29, 2020. (ROI, p. 2, ¶6) Respondent's bank records show reportable financial activity during the 2020 M8, 2020 G4, and 2020 G7 reporting periods but do not show reportable financial activity during the 2020 G6 reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 6)
- 8. Respondent was given multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff's investigation but failed to do so. (ROI, p. 2, ¶¶7-8; ROI Exhibit 7)
- 9. Respondent failed to include information in his 2020 M8, 2020 G4, and 2020 G7 reports in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Respondent was required to notify the filing officer in writing that he would not be filing the campaign's 2020 G6 Report on the prescribed reporting date but failed to do so. Respondent was not a first-time candidate. (ROI, p.1, ¶1)
- 10. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. Schmitt v. State, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 11. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2020 candidate for Fort Lauderdale City Commission, District 2. Respondent failed to timely file his 2020 M8, 2020 G4, 2020 G6, and 2020 G7 reports or notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. Respondent

failed to include information in his 2020 M8, 2020 G4, and 2020 G7 reports in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Respondent was required to notify the filing officer in writing that he would not be filing the campaign's 2020 G6 Report on the prescribed reporting date but failed to do so.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or around September 10, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 M8 Report.

Count 2:

On or around October 9, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 G4 Report.

Count 3:

On or about October 23, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing the campaign's 2020 G6 Report.

Count 4:

On or around October 30, 2020, Kyle Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2020 G7 Report.

Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate or political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed or failure to file a campaign report to reflect financial activity.



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
