Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 minutes to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an en masse vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will not be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will not be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an en masse vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will not be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 minutes to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will not be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

Notice of Appeal of Late Filing Fine for Filing Period August 2017

To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to Rule 2B-1.005 of the Florida Administrative Code (hereinafter F.A.C.) this constitutes my NOTICE OF APPEAL of the fine of \$893.75 as set forth in the attached letter dated October 11, 2017

The basis for my appeal is the **Unusual Circumstances** specifically contemplated under Rule 2B-1.0055 to wit: I was prevented from a timely filing of the required report due to preparations for an impending hurricane of such size and ferocity that the Governor of Florida declared a State of Emergency on September 4, 2017. The subsequent landing of Hurricane Irma on September 10th and its aftermath left the undersigned without any electrical power for 8 days, making it impossible to obtain usable Internet or computer related services for a like period of time and caused substantial damage to my home. Additionally, the storm disrupted other utilities, including landline and cellular telephone service making communication difficult for more than 10 days after the storm, a complication that was exacerbated by the delayed delivery of the U.S. Mails and other services for some days. My campaign Treasurer also sustained loss of electrical power for 5 days and attendant loss of services.

In addition to the foregoing, both I and my Treasurer had immediate family members who suffered health crisis's that required their hospitalization or institutionalization during the same time periods with my mother being placed in an extended care facility and my Treasurer's mother suffering a stroke that required her medical evacuation and hospitalization on September 18, 2017.

My 82 year old Mother had a heart attack on September 8th just two day's before Hurricane Irma and remained in hospital care until October 9th. My personal home was very heavily damaged due to the storm, we were without power for six day's and had to live in temporarily housing for three weeks following the storm. Our lives have been turned upside down and didn't realize how much time had went by due to trying to work on my house to make it where it was livable so I could get my handicap son back in his own environment so he could settle down. I beg for forgiveness this one time.

As for my Treasurer, who is the primary caregiver for his 87 year old mother, she remained hospitalized continuously until she was transferred to a rehabilitation center on September 22 2017. Thereafter she was allowed to return home for assisted rehabilitation on September 28 2017. Obviously my Treasurer who is her primary caregiver was occupied with the details of her illness and recovery to the exclusion of other obligations while also being preoccupied with Hurricane Irma recovery.

Immediate efforts to recover from the impacts of Hurricane Irma and the large scale damages it inflicted to my home and surrounding area; like hardships in my Treasurer's community and area and the immediate threats to the health of close family members for which we both had significant personal responsibilities as their immediate support were of higher priority and concern than the filing of the required report although the importance of its timely filing is and remains a high priority.

As it stands, even with the enlargement of time granted unilaterally by the State of Florida for the filing of the report, the expansion of time was inadequate given the special circumstances we encountered and I ask that the Commission consider these facts and the facts to be documented in advance of the Commission Hearing on this matter and waive the imposition of the financial penalty rendered.

Dear Mr. Fisher:

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was September 22, 2017.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
 - \$50 per day for the first 3 days late
 - \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late
 - If the required report immediately precedes a primary and general election, the automatic fine is \$500 for each late day.

The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

• If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.

Campaign Treasurer's Reports

Your first campaign treasurer's report will be due on March 10, 2017. The report will cover the period of February 1-28, 2017 (M2). All candidates who file reports with the Division of Elections are required to file by means of the Division's Electronic Filing System (EFS).

Credentials and Sign-ons

Below is the web address to access the EFS and your user identification number. The enclosed sealed envelope contains your initial password. Once you have logged in using the initial password, you will be immediately prompted to change it to a confidential sign-on. You, your campaign treasurer, and deputy treasurers are responsible for protecting this password from disclosure and are responsible for all filings using these credentials, unless the Division is notified that your credentials have been compromised.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update personal information. The enclosed sealed envelope contains confidential pin numbers for you. By copy of this letter, a confidential pin number to access the EFS was sent to your treasurer.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event this password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as What is your mother's maiden name?) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS not later than midnight of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

(Emergency Management/Elections - Hurricane Irma)

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2017, Governor Rick Scott issued Executive Order 17-235, declaring a state of emergency as a result of the threat posed to the State of Florida due to storm conditions forecast as a result of Hurricane Irma;

WHEREAS, on September 6, 2017, Governor Rick Scott issued Executive Order 17-236, authorizing, among other things, the Secretary of State to modify, amend, or suspend any deadline imposed pursuant to Chapters 97 through 106, Florida Statutes, to the extent those deadlines cannot be complied with by any county or candidate due to the emergency declared in Executive Order 17-235;

WHEREAS, on Sunday, September 10, 2017, Hurricane Irma initially made landfall in the Florida Keys as a Category 4 hurricane and then made a second landfall, hitting Florida's southwest coast as a Category 3 hurricane, before traveling north up the entire length of the Florida peninsula;

WHEREAS, the damage caused by Hurricane Irma is widespread throughout Florida, including, among other things, power outages affecting millions of Floridians;

WHEREAS, electronically filed campaign finance reports were due at the State, County and/or Municipal level on September 11, 2017, pursuant to chapter 106, Florida Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KEN DETZNER as Florida Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Executive Order Number 17-236, Section 6, the Florida

Elections Emergency Act, Sections 101.731-101.74, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Emergency Order, to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Based on the foregoing, I declare the circumstances resulting from Hurricane Irma have affected candidate and political entities from being able to comply with the campaign finance reports due to the Florida Department of State, Division of Elections, on September 11, 2017, pursuant to chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

Section 2. I, therefore, hereby extend the deadline for all campaign finance reports due to the Florida Department of State, Division of Elections, on Monday, September 11, 2017. The new deadline for filing all State campaign finance reports to the Florida Department of State, Division of Elections, is midnight (Eastern Time), Friday, September 22, 2017.
