If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. CONSENT FINAL ORDER

Respondent, Sara Shaw, and the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) agree that Mosby
this Consent Order resolves all of the issues between the parties in this case. The parties jointly stipulate to the following facts, conclusions of law, and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On January 27, 2017, a complaint was filed with the Commission alleging that Respondent violated Florida's election laws.
- 2. On May 31, 2019, the Commission entered an Order of Probable Cause finding there was probable cause to charge the Respondent with one count of violating Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, and one count of violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes.
- 3. Respondent has expressed a desire to enter into negotiations directed toward reaching a consent agreement.
 - 4. Respondent and staff stipulate to the following facts:
 - a. Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District
 - 43. She was eliminated in the primary election.

b. Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of being eliminated.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 5. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this cause, pursuant to Section 106.26, Florida Statutes.
- 6. The Commission staff and the Respondent stipulate that staff can prove the facts in paragraph four above by clear and convincing evidence and to the Commission's ability to impose a civil penalty in this case.

ORDER

- 7. The Respondent and the staff of the Commission have entered into this Consent Order freely and voluntarily.
- 8. The Respondent shall bear her own attorney's fees and costs that are in any way associated with this case.
 - 9. The Commission will consider this Consent Order at its next available meeting.
- 10. Respondent voluntarily waives the right to any further proceedings under Chapters 104, 106, and 120, Florida Statutes, and the right to appeal this Consent Order.
- 11. This Consent Order is enforceable under Sections 106.265 and 120.69, Florida Statutes. Respondent expressly waives any venue privileges and agrees that if enforcement of this Consent Order is necessary, venue shall be in Leon County, Florida, and Respondent shall pay all fees and costs associated with enforcement.
- 12. Payment of the civil penalty by cashier's check, or money order good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check, is a condition precedent to the Commission's

consideration of this Consent Order.

PENALTY

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission finds that the Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, on one occasion, and imposes a civil penalty in the amount of \$100.

Therefore it is

ORDERED that the Respondent shall remit to the Commission a civil penalty in the amount of \$100, inclusive of fees and costs. The civil penalty shall be paid by cashier's check, or money order good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check. The civil penalty shall be payable to the Florida Elections Commission and sent to 107 West Gaines Street, Collins Building, Suite 224, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-1050.

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on May 14, 2019, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On April 1, 2019, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 Termination Report listing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of being eliminated.

Count 2:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106 on the campaign's 2016 Termination Report.

The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.141(1) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes**, and **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on March 15, 2019, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

- 1. On January 27, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that Sara Shaw, ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 43. She was eliminated in the primary election.
- 3. By letter dated October 4, 2018, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 43, failed to timely file her 2016 Termination Report ("TR") reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 43, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in her 2016 TR, as required by Chapter 106.

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 43, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because she had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the 2016 termination reporting period.

- 4 On August 7, 2015, Respondent filed an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository form ("DS-DE 9") with the Division. Respondent appointed herself as her own campaign treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 2)¹
- 5. By letter dated August 10, 2015, Kristi Reid Bronson, Division of Elections, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Respondent that her DS-DE 9 was filed with the Division on August 10, 2015.² The letter also contained a sealed envelope containing Respondent's confidential PIN number to access the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 3)
- 6. Ms. Bronson's August 10, 2015, letter also informed Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on the Division's website, including Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter notified Respondent that it was her responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. (*Id.*)
- 7. On August 7, 2015, Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate form with the Division in which she acknowledged that she had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. (ROI Exhibit 8)
- 8. On November 28, 2016, Respondent's 2016 TR was due. However, Respondent failed to file it. On November 29, 2016, the Division sent Respondent written notification that the campaign's 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. (ROI Exhibit 4)
- 9. On January 11, 2017, the Division sent Respondent a letter marked "Final Notice" that the campaign's 2016 TR or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever was applicable, had not been filed. The final notice was delivered on January 14, 2017. (ROI Exhibit 5)
- 10. The investigation secured Respondent's campaign account records from her campaign depository, PNC Bank. The records revealed that there were multiple reportable financial transactions during the TR reporting period, which was from August 26, 2016, through November 28, 2016. The final transactions were two checks disposing of all remaining campaign funds. The checks both posted to the account on September 15, 2016.³ (ROI Exhibit 6)
- 11. Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, requires a candidate to dispose of the funds on deposit in his campaign account and file a report reflecting the disposition of all remaining funds within 90 days of withdrawing his candidacy, becoming an unopposed candidate, being eliminated as a candidate, or being elected to office.

The Report of Investigation shall be referred to herein as "ROI."

The DS-DE 9 is date-stamped received by the Division on August 7, 2015, so the August 10, 2015, date on the acknowledgment letter was likely a scrivener's error. (ROI Exhibits 2-3)

The first check, dated September 6, 2016, was in the amount of \$600 to Peter Sendtko for "campaign help;" the second check, dated September 10, 2016, was in the amount of \$270.83 to Voices for Osceola's' Children for "GAL." (Attachment A)

- 12. Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibits a candidate from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include any information required by Chapter 106.
- 13. Pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, in any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the candidate is required to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.
- 14. Since a review of Respondent's bank records revealed several reportable financial transactions that occurred during the 2016 TR reporting period, Respondent was required to timely file the campaign's 2016 TR reporting all transactions associated with disposition of all remaining campaign funds.
- 15. However, Respondent did not timely file the campaign's 2016 TR, and as of March 5, 2019, Respondent had still not filed the campaign's 2016 TR. (ROI Exhibit 7)
- 16. Respondent was offered multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff's investigation but failed to do so.
- 17. Based upon the information above, Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 TR showing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds by the required due date, and Respondent failed to disclose multiple financial transactions made during the 2016 TR reporting period.
- 18. "Probable Cause" is defined as a reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reason able man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).
- 19. The above facts show that Respondent was a 2016 candidate for State Representative, District 43. She was defeated in the primary election and was thus eliminated from the race. Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all remaining funds on deposit in her campaign account within 90 days of being eliminated. A review of Respondent's bank records revealed that, although all remaining campaign funds were disposed of during the TR reporting period, there were multiple financial transactions that should have been reported on the TR but were not disclosed by Respondent.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, and find probable cause to charge Respondent with the following:

Count 1:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to file the campaign's 2016 TR listing the disposition of all remaining campaign funds within 90 days of being eliminated.

Count 2:

On or about November 28, 2016, Respondent violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when Respondent deliberately failed to include information required to be reported by Chapter 106 on the campaign's 2016 TR.





On January 27, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. Commission staff investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate who did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed;

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate to file a termination report reflecting the disposition of all remaining funds in her campaign account within 90 days after she withdrew, became unopposed, was eliminated, or elected; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

I. Preliminary Information:

- 1. Respondent was a candidate for the office of State Representative, District 43 in the 2016 election. Respondent was defeated in her bid for election when she received 29.0 % of the vote during the Democratic Primary. Respondent was not a first-time candidate.
 - 2. Complainant is the Division of Elections.
 - 3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records.
- 4. On January 27, 2017, a DOE staff representative, Kristi Willis, submitted a sworn-affidavit alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed, for the 2016 TR reporting period. To view a copy of the sworn-affidavit from Complainant, refer to exhibit 1.
- 5. On August 7, 2015, Respondent filed her original Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) form with his filing officer. Respondent appointed herself as her own campaign treasurer. To view a copy of Respondent's

DS-DE 9 form, refer to exhibit 2.

- 6. On August 10, 2015, Complainant mailed Respondent a letter acknowledging receipt of her DS-DE 9 form and informing her that her name had been placed on the 2016 active candidate list. This letter also informed Respondent of her confidential "PIN" number to access the Division of Election's electronic filing system (EFS) for submitting campaign treasurer's reports and waivers. To view a copy of August 10, 2015 acknowledgement letter, refer to exhibit 3.
- 7. On November 29, 2016 Complainant mailed Respondent a failure-to-file letter informing Respondent that a 2016 TR Report had not been filed. This letter was sent to the address Respondent provided on her DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 2). To view a copy of the November 29, 2016 failure-to-file letter, refer to exhibit 4.
- 8. On January 11, 2017, Complainant mailed Respondent a certified mail "Final Notice" informing her that a 2016 TR Report still had not been filed. This letter was also sent to the address Respondent provided on her original DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 2). A delivery confirmation receipt verified that the letter was delivered to the address provided. To view a copy of the January 11, 2017 "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation receipt, refer to exhibit 5.
- 9. The allegations that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative, failed to notify the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed for the 2016 Termination Report (TR) period will be discussed in the following paragraphs.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

- 10. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not notifying the filing officer in writing, that no report would be filed due to not having any financial activity during the 2016 TR reporting period.
- 11. On October 22, 2018, I subpoenaed Respondent's campaign account records from PNC Bank, N.A., the campaign depository listed on her DS-DE 9 form (Exhibit 2). This account reflects numerous financial transactions occurring during the 2016 TR reporting period¹. To view a copy of the monthly bank statements from PNC Bank, N.A. reflecting financial activity, refer to exhibit 6.
- 12. Based upon a review of Respondent's campaign account records, it appears Respondent was not required to notify her filing officer in writing that no report would be filed for the 2016 TR reporting period; there was activity during this period. The campaign account records reflect that Respondent made five expenditures totaling \$1,118.67 during the TR reporting period². It appears that Respondent was required to disclose these transactions by filing a 2016 TR Report. As of the date of this report, a 2016 TR Report has not been filed. To view a copy of Respondent's filing history, refer to exhibit 7.

¹ The 2016 TR reporting period covers the time-period of August 26, 2016 through November 28, 2016.

² The withdrawal that disposed of the remainder of the campaign's funds was made on September 15, 2016.

13. There is no record that Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes:

- 14. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not filing her 2016 TR Report, due by November 28, 2016, that reflected a disposition of all remaining funds in her campaign account within 90 days after she was eliminated from the election.
- 15. To review the circumstances regarding Respondent's financial activity, refer to paragraphs 11 and 12 of this report.
- 16. There is no record that Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

IV. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

- 17. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when she failed to file a 2016 TR Report on the prescribed reporting date, disclosing all activity during the reporting period.
- 18. To review the circumstances regarding Respondent's financial activity, refer to paragraphs 11 and 12 of this report.
- 19. There is no record that Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

V. FEC History:

20. Respondent has been involved in four prior investigations. In <u>FEC 16-071</u>; no probable cause was found for alleged violation of 106.07(7); closed case on March 13, 2017. In FEC <u>16-428</u>; <u>16-533</u>; and <u>16-580</u>; these cases were all processed for automatic-default final orders and closed with no records of the automatic-fines being paid for any of the cases.

Conclusion:

- 21. Respondent was offered several opportunities to make comments regarding the findings of this investigation. Respondent did not respond to any of these attempts.
- 22. In the August 10, 2015 acknowledgement letter, Complainant informed Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on the Division of Elections' website. In the letter, Respondent was admonished as follows: It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook, Calendar of Reporting Dates, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida Administrative Code. To view a copy of the August 10, 2015 acknowledgement letter, refer to exhibit 3.

23. On August 7, 2015, Respondent filed her Statement of Candidate for State Representative, District 43 acknowledging that she had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. To view a copy of the Statement of Candidate, refer to exhibit 8.



Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update personal information. The enclosed sealed envelope contains your confidential pin numbers.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.


Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your termination report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was November 28, 2016.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as \$50 per day until you file your report. The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.



Dear Ms. Shaw:

On January 27, 2017, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for the House of Representatives, may have failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because she had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the termination reporting period.

Section 106.141(1), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2016 candidate for the House of Representatives, failed to timely file her Termination Report reflecting the disposition of all remaining campaign funds.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a 2017 special election candidate for the office of State Senate, District 40, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in her Termination Report, as required by Chapter 106.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will make a written recommendation (Staff Recommendation or SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge respondent with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount

of the fine to be imposed. You and the complainant will receive notice at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update personal information. The enclosed sealed envelope contains your confidential pin numbers.

Each candidate is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as What is your mother's maiden name?) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Please notify the Division if your credentials have been compromised.

Timely Filing

All reports filed must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. In the event that the EFS is inoperable on the due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any candidate failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first 3 days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your termination report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was November 28, 2016.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as \$50 per day until you file your report. The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.
- If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.


