Please accept this correspondence as a formal request for continuance of the above-styled matter. I am unable to appear for the hearing occurring February 26, 2019 as a result of my trial calendar in Daytona Beach, Florida. On February 18, we began jury selection in a 3-week, first degree murder and death penalty trial. Jury selection lasted 4 days and concluded late last night. Opening statements and testimony will be given on Monday, February 25. The trial is expected to conclude on March 8. As lead prosecutor for the State, I have been working this case for nearly six years and am personally responsible for its handling.

Please accept my sincere apology for this request and for any difficulty that a delay may cause. It has always been my intent to attend the hearing and discuss this matter with your Committee. However, I only received notice of the hearing on Friday, February 15. Our trial has been scheduled since October. There was no way to postpone the trial so I could appear in the above-styled matter.

In anticipation of my request for continuance, I have spoken with Eric Lipman and Wilson Brantley. Neither individual opposes the continuance or my absence from the proceeding. While I would ordinarily make this request in person, please understand that circumstances prevent my appearance. Further, I do not know anyone in Tallahassee that could appear on my behalf.

Dear Sir or Madam:

On September 26, 2018 I received the enclosed correspondence, assessing a fine for untimely filing of campaign finance documents. Please let me apologize for the late report and any difficulty that it caused. By way of this document, I acknowledge that the campaign finance report for August 24th was not timely filed and offer the following explanation. It is my hope that you will reduce or waive the fine levied, based upon these exceptional and unusual circumstances.

- Tuesday, August 21st: Received campaign contribution in the amount of \$96.80 from North Florida Lawyers, PLLC. The contribution was made on the campaign website www.ElectRyanWill.com
- Wednesday, August 22nd: Received an email stating that a contribution was made on the campaign website by North Florida Lawyers, PLLC.
- Friday, August 24th: Deadline for filing campaign finance report; personally

prepared and saved the campaign finance documents, but did not file with the Division of Elections. Sought legal advice as to whether the contribution could be accepted.

 August 23.

There is a rule that no judicial candidate may receive support from another political candidate. In the process of preparing the finance report on Friday, August 24th it

was discovered that one of the members of North Florida Lawyers, PLLC is currently seeking political office in St Johns County. Because I recognized this issue on Friday afternoon, I was unable to appropriately research the matter and receive legal advice before the filing deadline. Given the source of the contribution, there was some question as to whether it could be accepted, whether it must be returned, or whether it should be refunded in the next reporting cycle. Monday morning, I had the opportunity to speak with counsel, received an answer to the question, and immediately filed the report.

If this issue had been recognized a few hours earlier, it could have been cured during business hours, thereby allowing for a timely filing and avoiding the imposition of a hefty fine. Similarly, if this issue had occurred during <u>any</u> other reporting period, the fine would have been \$50 per day. Because it occurred during the reporting period immediately preceding the primary election, there was a corresponding fine of \$500 per day.

The imposition of a fine is a significant punishment to any candidate. Fines are a deterrent for bad conduct and meant to prevent intentional disregard for the rules regulating campaign finance. I recognize that there should be some action on the part of the Division of Elections. But, a fine of this magnitude is financially crippling. I was trying to do the right thing - in taking the time to appropriately research the acceptability of this contribution, I violated the reporting requirements of the Division of Elections. It was never my intent to show indifference for the financial requirements. But I wanted to be sure that I was in compliance with the ethical standards of judicial candidates. As a result, I have incurred a fine of \$1500. Both as a candidate and informed voter, I recognize the importance of filing deadlines and public transparency. In this particular circumstance, it was absolutely necessary to proceed with caution and be well-advised. I apologize for the delay in filing and ask for leniency from the review committee. It is the purpose of our system to ensure that candidates and voters know the source and supply of campaign contributions. Though late, the report was filed in the spirit of disclosure and prior to the August 28 primary election. Importantly, citizens were given the opportunity to know the finances of my campaign before casting a ballot.

This is my first time running for political office. And this has been my only indiscretion. As a result, I would ask the review committee to waive or significantly reduce the fine that has been levied. No matter the amount, this is an expensive lesson to learn. My family has already funded a significant portion of my campaign. A \$1500 penalty for late filing would cause substantial hardship.

Independent of your decision in this matter, please be advised that a check from the campaign account has been issued to North Florida Lawyers, PLLC in the amount of \$96.80 with instructions to please accept the refund of this contribution. It was probably advisable to immediately return the instrument, rather than taking the time to research the issue and risking additional penalty. Thank you for your time and consideration of this matter. It is my hope that you will agree that my transgression was marked by exceptional and unusual circumstances, worthy of relief. Please recognize that my actions were not an intentional disregard for the rules. If you desire additional information regarding this issue, please feel free to contact me.

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was August 24, 2018.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
 - \$50 per day for the first 3 days late
 - \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late
 - If the required report immediately precedes a primary and general election, the automatic fine is \$500 for each late day.

The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

• If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.


