A hearing will be held in this case before the Florida Elections Commission on, **May 18, 2016 at 9:00 am**, *or as soon thereafter as the parties can be heard*, at the following location: **Senate Office Building, 404 South Monroe Street, Room 110-S, Tallahassee, Florida 32399**

Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 18, 2016, in Tallahassee, Florida.

Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about September 12, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 12, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G1A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2:

On or about September 19, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 19, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3:

On or about September 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G2A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4:

On or about October 3, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 3, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5:

On or about October 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6:

On or about October 17, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 17, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7:

On or about October 24, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 24, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 8:

On or about October 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 9:

On or about October 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 10:

On or about October 27, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 27, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 11:

On or about October 28, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 28, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 12:

On or about October 29, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 29, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 13:

On or about October 30, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 30, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 14:

On or about October 31, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 31, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 15:

On or about November 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before November 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 M10 Report on the prescribed due date.

The Commission finds there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the complaint in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on August 3, 2015, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation.

1. On February 3, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Division of Elections ("Division") alleging that Equal Marriage Florida ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections. The Committee filed its Statement of Organization of Political Committee form ("DS-DE 5") with the Division on June 26, 2013. Vanessa Brito was identified as Respondent's chairperson and treasurer.¹ On June 24, 2013, Respondent filed an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form ("DS-DE 6") appointing Ms. Brito as the Committee's treasurer² (ROI Exhibit 1 and ROI Exhibit 2, page 4)³

3. On April 10, 2015, the Executive Director sent Respondent notification that Commission staff would investigate the following sections of law:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed on those dates because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2014 G1A
- 2014 G2
- 2014 G2A

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file reports on the prescribed reporting dates for the following reporting periods:

- 2014 G1A
- 2014 G2
- 2014 G2A
- 2014 G3
- 2014 G4
- 2014 G5
- 2014 G6
- 2014 D1
- 2014 D2
- 2014 D3
- 2014 D4
- 2014 D5
- 2014 D6
- 2014 G7
- 2014 M10

4. By letter dated June 27, 2013, Kristi Reid Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, notified Ms. Brito that the name of the Committee had been placed on the Division's active committee list as a political committee that supports issues. The letter advised Ms. Brito that all political committees filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system ("EFS") and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 1)

5. Ms. Bronson's June 27, 2013 letter further advised Ms. Brito that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were on its website. Additionally, the letter directed Ms. Brito to print a copy of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *2012 Political Committee*

Handbook (“Handbook”), and the *2013 Calendar of Reporting Dates*. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 3)

7. Investigator Oliver attempted to contact Respondent’s chairman on six occasions and left a voice message each time requesting Ms. Brito to return his call. However, Respondent’s chairman failed to return any of Investigator Oliver’s calls. (Attachment A, Phone Log Entries 1, 3, 5, 6, 7, and 8)

8. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, provides:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter **shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.** (Emphasis added)

9. Additionally, page 29 of the Handbook states that:

When there has been no activity in the campaign account during a reporting period (no funds expended or received) the filing of the report may be waived by notifying the filing office in writing that no activity has occurred. This notification must be made on the prescribed reporting date. (Section 106.07, F.S.)

All waivers filed with the Division of Elections must be filed electronically using the Division’s electronic filing system. (Section 106.0705, F.S.) (Attachment B)

10. Pages 12, 13, 45, and 46 of the Division’s Political Committee EFS User’s Guide (“EFS Guide”), provides step by step instructions for Political Committees to file Waiver’s using the Division’s electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 10)

11. Respondent closed its campaign account on July 8, 2014, prior to the prescribed filing dates for any of the reports at issue in this case. (ROI Exhibit 7, page 5-7)⁴

12. As of September 29, 2015, Respondent has not filed a waiver of report or campaign treasurer’s report for the reporting periods set forth in the following table:

⁴ Respondent’s DS-DE 5, June 24, 2013 DS-DE 6, and June 26, 2013 DS-DE 6 listed Wells Fargo Bank as its campaign depository. However, Respondent did not have a campaign account at Wells Fargo Bank. (Exhibit 1, Exhibit 2, pages 3 and 4, and Attachment A, Phone Log Entry 9)

13 Because Respondent closed its campaign account on July 8, 2014, and has not filed anything with the Division for the reporting periods in the table above, it appears that Respondent did not have any reportable financial transactions during the 2014 G1A, 2014 G2, 2014 G2A, 2014 G3, 2014 G4, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, and 2014 M10 reporting periods and failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed due dates that it would not be filing a report for the corresponding reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 7, pages 5-7 and Attachment C, page 2)

14. “Probable Cause” is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So.2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

15. The facts above show that Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division of Elections. At all times relevant to the issues in this case, Vanessa Brito was Respondent’s chairman and treasurer. Respondent closed its campaign account on July 8, 2014 and it appears that Respondent did not open or have another campaign account. As of September

29, 2015, Respondent has not filed a waiver of report or a campaign treasurer's report with the Division for the reporting periods identified in the table in paragraph 12. Although it appears that Respondent did not have any reportable financial transactions during the 2014 G1A, 2014 G2, 2014 G2A, 2014 G3, 2014 G4, 2014 G5, 2014 G6, 2014 D1, 2014 D2, 2014 D3, 2014 D4, 2014 D5, 2014 D6, 2014 G7, and 2014 M10 reporting periods, Respondent failed to notify its filing officer in writing on the prescribed due dates that it would not be filing a report for the corresponding reporting period.

Based on the foregoing, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following provisions of law:

Count 1:

On or about September 12, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 12, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G1A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 2:

On or about September 19, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 19, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 3:

On or about September 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before September 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G2A Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 4:

On or about October 3, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106 07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 3, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a G3 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 5:

On or about October 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G4 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 6:

On or about October 17, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 17, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G5 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 7:

On or about October 24, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 24, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G6 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 8:

On or about October 25, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 25, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D1 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 9:

On or about October 26, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 26, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 D2 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 10:

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On or about October 31, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before October 31, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 G7 Report on the prescribed due date.

Count 15:

On or about November 10, 2014, Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to notify the Division of Elections in writing on or before November 10, 2014, that Respondent would not be filing a 2014 M10 Report on the prescribed due date.


I further recommend the Commission find there is no probable cause to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes.

the filing officer within 5 days after the designated due date that was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service is deemed timely filed unless it has a postmark indicating the report was mailed after the designated due date. A certificate of mailing obtained from and dated by the U.S. Postal Service at the time of mailing or a receipt from an established courier company, which bears a date on or before the date on which the report is due, is proof of mailing in a timely manner. **Reports filed with the Division of Elections through the Electronic Filing System (EFS) are due no later than midnight, Eastern Time, of the due date.** (See Chapter 12, *Electronic Filing of Campaign Reports*)

(Sections 106.07, 106.0705 and 106.141, F.S.)

Penalty for Late Filing

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports due immediately prior to the primary and general elections, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

(Section 106.07(8), F.S.)

Waiver of Report

When there has been no activity in the campaign account during a reporting period (no funds expended or received) the filing of the report may be waived by notifying the filing officer in writing that no activity has occurred. This notification must be made on the prescribed reporting date.

(Section 106.07, F.S.)

All waivers filed with the Division of Elections must be filed electronically using the Division's electronic filing system.

(Section 106.0705, F.S.)

Special Election Reports

When a special election is called to fill a vacancy in office, all political committees and committees of continuous existence making contributions or expenditures to influence the results of the special election shall file campaign treasurers' reports with the filing officer on the dates set by the Department of State pursuant to Section 100.111, F.S.

When an election is called for an issue to appear on the ballot at a time when no candidates are scheduled to appear on the ballot, all political committees and committees of continuous existence making contributions or expenditures in support of or in opposition to such issue shall file reports on the 18th and 4th days prior to such election.

Committees are to include on the special election campaign treasurer's reports only expenditures related to the special election made by the committee during the special election reporting periods. All contributions received and all expenditures made not related to the special election during the current quarter should be filed on the next quarterly report. Once a committee has participated in the special election and has filed a special election campaign report, all other special election reports remaining must also be filed by the committee, even if there is no further special election activity.

(Section 106.07(1), F.S.)

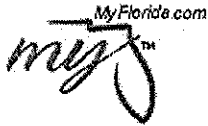

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, on February 3, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission received information from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. The Division's referral was mandated pursuant to Section 106.07(8)(d), Florida Statutes. Commission staff, therefore, investigated whether Respondent violated the following statutes:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, failure of a political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed; and

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person or organization from falsely reporting or deliberately failing to report information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

I. Preliminary Information:

1. Respondent is a political committee named Equal Marriage Florida. This political committee is registered with the Division of Elections. On June 27, 2013, the political committee was placed on the active committee list as a political committee that supports issues. This political committee supports marriage equality and religious freedom

2. Complainant is the Division of Elections

3. Respondent's filing officer is Kristi Reid-Bronson, Chief, Bureau of Election Records

4. On June 26, 2013, Respondent filed the Statement of Organization of Political Committee form (DS-DE 5) with the Division of Elections. Respondent's area, scope, and jurisdiction are listed as "Constitutional Amendment Initiative". The form also listed Vanessa Brito as Respondent's chairman and treasurer. To review a copy of the June 26, 2013 DS-DE 5 form, refer to exhibit 1.

5. On October 16, 2013, Respondent filed the current Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository form (DS-DE 6) with the Division of Elections. Ms. Vanessa Brito was also appointed as campaign treasurer. To review a copy of the October 16, 2013 DS-DE 6 form, refer to exhibit 2.

6 On June 27, 2013, Ms. Bronson sent Ms. Brito—in her capacity as Respondent’s Chairperson and treasurer—a letter acknowledging her appointment. This letter also informed Ms. Brito of her confidential “PIN” number to access the Division of Election’s electronic filing system (EFS) for submitting campaign treasurer’s reports and waivers. To review a copy of this June 27, 2013 acknowledgement letter, refer to exhibit 3.

7. On February 3, 2015, the Commission received a referral from the Division of Elections alleging that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the alternative failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed, for fifteen reporting periods. Table 1 summarizes the failure-to-file notices mailed to Respondent informing them that their reports had not been received. Each notice was mailed to the address Respondent provided on the DS-DE 6 form (Exhibit 2). To view copies of the failure-to-file letters, please refer to exhibit 4. To view a copy of the sworn affidavit from Complainant, refer to exhibit 5.

8 On December 3, 2014, Complainant mailed Respondent a letter marked “Final Notice” stating that Respondent’s reports had not been filed (Table 1). This letter also included copies of the failure-to-file letters that were previously sent to Respondent. This letter was mailed to the address Respondent provided on the DS-DE 6 form (Exhibit 2). To review a copy of the “Final Notice” letter with attachments and delivery confirmation, refer to exhibit 6.

9 The allegations that Respondent failed to report campaign activity, or in the

alternative, failed to notify the filing officer that no report would be filed during the reporting periods listed in Table 1 will be discussed in the following paragraphs.

II. Alleged Violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

10. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, when it failed to file a treasurer's report, or written notice to the filing officer that no report would be filed due to the lack of reportable activity during the reporting period, on the prescribed reporting dates

11. On October 7, 2014, Respondent's campaign account records were received as a result of a subpoena to US Century Bank, Respondent's campaign depository listed on their most recent DS-DE 6 form filed on October 16, 2013 (Exhibit 2). A review of these records reflects one debit from the account on July 8, 2014 totaling \$25 02¹. The description of this transaction was "Closing Account". To review a copy of the depository records that reflect this transaction, refer to exhibit 7

12. In a December 4, 2014 telephone interview with Ela Villar-Suris, depository legal department representative, I was advised that the depository was closed out on July 9, 2014. Ms Villar-Suris informed me that there has been no other activity involving this PC

13. Based upon Respondent's monthly bank statements provided in response to the FEC staff's subpoena, it appears that Respondent did not have any contributions or expenditures during the 2014 G1A, G2, G2A, G3, G4, G5, G6, D1, D2, D3, D4, D5, D6, G7, and 2014 M10 reporting periods. Therefore, it appears there was no campaign activity for Respondent to report during the aforementioned reporting periods. To review a copy of the depository records, refer to exhibit 7. To review a copy of Respondent's filing history, refer to exhibit 8.

14. Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws

III. Alleged Violation of Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:

15. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by failing to timely notify the filing officer, in writing, that no reports were being filed due to not receiving any contributions or making any expenditures during the 2014 G1A, G2, G2A, G3, G4, G5, G6, D1, D2, D3, D4, D5, D6, G7, and M10 reporting periods

16. Records from the Division of Elections reflect that a 2014 G1A Report was due on September 12, 2014; a 2014 G2 Report was due on September 19, 2014; a 2014 G2A Report was due on September 26, 2014; a 2014 G3 Report was due on October 3, 2014; a 2014 G4 Report was due on October 10, 2014; a 2014 G5 Report was due on October 17, 2014; a 2014 G6 Report was due on October 24, 2014; a 2014 D1 Report was due on October 25, 2014; a

¹ This transaction occurred on July 8, 2014 at approximately 3:36 pm. Per December 5, 2014 telephone interview with depository representative, I was advised that transactions occurring after 11:00 am are not posted until the following business day

2014 D2 Report was due on October 26, 2014; a 2014 D3 Report was due on October 27, 2014; a 2014 D4 Report was due on October 28, 2014; a 2014 D5 Report was due on October 29, 2014; a 2014 D6 Report was due on October 30, 2014; a 2014 G7 Report was due on October 31, 2014; and a 2014 M10 Report was due on November 10, 2014. No report was filed on the prescribed reporting dates. To review a copy of Respondent's filing history, refer to exhibit 8.

17. Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, states in part:

"Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived ...any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date."

18. In an e-mail dated April 2, 2014, Ms. Bronson was asked to clarify the procedure regarding how to notify the Division in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed. In her response, Ms. Bronson stated, "The notice that no report will be filed is the waiver, which must be filed in the EFS. We do not require anything separate in writing." To view a copy of Ms. Bronson's e-mail, please refer to exhibit 9.

19. Pages 12, 13, 45, and 46 of the *Political Committee EFS User's Guide* discuss how to notify the Division on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed using the EFS. Specifically, page 13 instructs the user to click the box next to "waiver" if there is no activity to disclose.² To view the relevant pages of the *Political Committee EFS User's Guide*, please refer to exhibit 10.

20. A review of the campaign account records for the fifteen reporting periods reflect that Respondent was required to notify their filing officer in writing that no reports were being filed due to not receiving any contributions or making any expenditures during the 2014 G1A, G2, G2A, G3, G4, G5, G6, D1, D2, D3, D4, D5, D6, G7, and M10 reporting periods. As of the date of this report of investigation, no waivers have been filed. To review a copy of Respondent's filing history, refer to exhibit 8.

21. Respondent has previously been investigated for violating this section of the election laws.

IV. FEC History

22. Respondent has established a pattern of being involved in FEC investigations. FEC 14-325/found PC for 106.07(7) and NPC for 106.19(1)(c); 14-286/found PC for 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c); 14-144/found PC for 106.19(1)(c) and NPC for 106.07(7); 14-078/found PC for 106.07(1); 14-035/found PC for 106.07(1); and 13-332/found PC for 106.07(1). FEC 14-290

will be heard during the August 2015 Commission meeting/staff recommended PC for 106 19(1)(c) but NPC for 106.07(7). FEC 15-248 will be heard during the November 2015 Commission meeting.

Conclusion:

23 Respondent was offered several opportunities to make comments regarding the findings of this investigation Respondent did not respond to any of these attempts

24. In the June 27, 2013 acknowledgment letter, Respondent was informed that all of the Division's publications were available online at the DOE's website. In the letter, Respondent was admonished as follows: **It is your responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. Therefore, please print a copy of the following documents: Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, 2012 Political Committee Handbook, 2013 Calendar of Reporting Dates, and Rule 1S-2.017, Florida Administrative Code**". To review a copy of the June 27, 2013 acknowledgment letter, refer to exhibit 3.

Pin Numbers

Pin numbers are confidential secure credentials that allow you to submit reports and update information. The enclosed sealed envelope provides a confidential pin number for the chairperson. By copy of this letter, a confidential pin number to access the EFS was sent to the treasurer.

Each political committee chairperson is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that the password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Timely Filing

All reports must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. On February 3, 2015, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more legally sufficient allegations. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

You may file a response to the report within 14 days from the date the report is mailed to you. Based on the results of the investigation, legal staff will make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapter 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. A copy of the Staff Recommendation will be mailed to you and you may file a response within 14 days from the date the recommendation is mailed to you. Your timely filed response(s) will be considered by the Commission when determining probable cause.

The Commission will then hold a hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe you have violated Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You and the complainant will receive a notice of hearing at least 14 days before the hearing. The notice of hearing will indicate the location, date, and time of your hearing. You will have the opportunity to make a brief oral statement to the Commission, but you will not be permitted to testify or call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence.


At any time before a probable cause finding, you may notify us in writing that you want to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a settlement via consent agreement.

The Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendation, and Notice of Hearing will be mailed to the above address as this letter. Therefore, if your address changes, you must notify this office of your new address. Otherwise, you may not receive these important documents. Failure to receive the documents will not delay the probable cause hearing.

Under section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, Commission investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 and 106, Florida Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the person filing the complaint. However, it does apply to you unless you waive confidentiality in writing. The confidentiality provision does not preclude you from seeking legal counsel. However, if you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.





Pin Numbers

Each political committee chairperson is required to provide the Division of Elections with confidential personal information that may be used to allow access in the event that the password is forgotten or lost. When you enter the campaign account screen, there will be a drop down box where you pick a question (such as *What is your mother's maiden name?*) and supply an answer. All passwords and answers to questions are stored as encrypted data and cannot be viewed by Division staff and given out over the phone. Timely Filing

All reports must be completed and filed through the EFS no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the due date. Reports not filed by midnight of the due date are late filed and subject to the penalties in Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes. 
