**If you are the Complainant**, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

**If you are an Appellant**, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

**ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE**

**THIS MATTER** was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting held on August 20, 2025, at 1:00 p.m. via Zoom teleconferencing.

On September 20, 2024, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

**Count 1:**

On or about August 5, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2022 P5 Report.

**Count 2:**

On or about August 19, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2022 P7 Report.

**Count 3:**

On or about August 26, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2022 P7A Report.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING**

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-



hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to present evidence relevant to the violation(s) listed in this order, to cross-examine opposing witnesses, to impeach any witness, and to rebut the evidence presented against you.

If you do not elect to resolve the case by consent order or request a formal hearing at the DOAH or an informal hearing before the Commission within 30 days of the date this Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission, the case will be sent to the Commission for a formal or informal hearing, depending on whether the facts are in dispute. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION**

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on July 1, 2024, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On October 19, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections (“Division”), alleging that Kyle KC Gibson (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a 2022 candidate for Governor. Respondent’s Statement of Candidate form (“DS-DE 84”) was filed on October 16, 2018. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 1)<sup>1</sup> Respondent withdrew his candidacy on September 1, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 1)

3. By letter dated April 22, 2024, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

**Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2022 candidate for Governor, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods, as alleged in the complaint:

- 2022 P5
- 2022 P7
- 2022 P7A

**Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2022 candidate for Governor, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the following reporting periods, as alleged in the complaint:

- 2022 P5

- 2022 P7
- 2022 P7A

4. On October 16, 2018, Respondent filed his Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form (“DS-DE 9”) appointing himself as treasurer for his campaign. (ROI Exhibit 3)

5. By letter dated October 18, 2018, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division received the DS-DE 9 form and Respondent’s appointment as the campaign treasurer for his own campaign. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 1).

6. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (“EFS”) and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 1) The letter further advised Respondent that all of the Division’s publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*, as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 2)

7. Complainant alleged that Respondent violated Florida’s election laws by failing to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed or by falsely reporting or deliberately failing to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, for the following reporting periods: 2022 P5, 2022 P7, and 2022 P7A.

8. Respondent’s 2022 P5, 2022 P7, and 2022 P7A reports were due to be filed by August 5, 2022; August 19, 2022; and August 26, 2022, respectively; however, Respondent failed to timely file the reports or notify the filing officer that no reports would be filed. *See* Compl.

9. The Division sent six letters notifying Respondent that his reports had not been received. The letters also notified Respondent that he was still required to notify the Division if he had no reportable financial activity. (ROI Exhibits 6-8) The letters sent by certified mail were confirmed delivered on September 28, 2022 (ROI Exhibit 7, page 2; ROI Exhibit 8, page 3)

10. A subpoena was issued to Respondent’s designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the following relevant reporting periods:

- 2022 P5: July 23, 2022 – July 29, 2022
- 2022 P7: August 6, 2022 – August 18, 2022
- 2022 P7A August 19, 2022.

(ROI Exhibit 7, page 1; ROI Exhibit 8, pages 1-2)

11. Respondent's bank records show no reportable financial activity for the 2022 P7A reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 10, page 4) However, the bank records do show the following reportable financial activity during the 2022 P5 and 2022 P7 reporting periods:

- 2022 P5: Contributions totaling \$19.03 and expenditures totaling \$352.16 (ROI Exhibit 10, page 1)
- 2022 P7: Contributions totaling \$95.30 and expenditures totaling \$95.71 (ROI Exhibit 10, pages 1-4)

12. Respondent was given multiple opportunities to respond to Commission staff's investigation but failed to do so. (ROI Exhibit 11) Respondent was not a first-time candidate. (Attachment A)

13. As it appears that Respondent had financial activity during the 2022 P5 and 2022 P7 reporting periods, Respondent was required to report this activity but failed to do so. Since Respondent had no reportable financial activity during the 2022 P7A reporting period, Respondent was required to notify the filing officer in writing that he would not be filing his 2022 P7A report.

14. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

15. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a 2022 candidate for Governor. Respondent failed to timely file his 2022 P5, P7, and P7A reports or notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed. It appears that Respondent had financial activity during the 2022 P5 and 2022 P7 reporting periods. Therefore, Respondent deliberately failed to include information in his reports in violation of Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes. Additionally, it appears that Respondent had no financial activity during the 2022 P7A reporting period, and therefore was required to notify the filing officer in writing that he would not be filing his report on the prescribed reporting date but failed to do so.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

**Count 1:**

On or about August 5, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2022 P5 Report.


**Count 2:**

On or about August 19, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, when he deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, on the campaign's 2022 P7 Report.

**Count 3:**

On or about August 26, 2022, Kyle KC Gibson violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when he failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that he would not be filing his 2022 P7A Report.

Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate or political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed or failure to file a campaign report to reflect financial activity.

**Respondent:** Kyle KC Gibson**Respondent's Atty:** N/A**Division of Elections (Division)****Referral Filed:** October 19, 2022**Respondent Type:** Candidate**I. Preliminary Information:**

1. Respondent was a 2022 candidate for Governor; he withdrew on September 1, 2022. Respondent was not a first-time candidate. To review the withdrawal letter, refer to Exhibit 1. To review the Division's response to the withdrawal letter, refer to Exhibit 2.

2. An Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 9) was filed on October 16, 2018. Respondent appointed himself as his own campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 9, refer to Exhibit 3.

3. Respondent filed a Statement of Candidate with the Division on October 16, 2018, in which Respondent certified he had been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, F.S. To review the Statement of Candidate, refer to Exhibit 4.

4. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 on October 18, 2018, advising Respondent that all candidates filing reports with the Division are required to file by means of the Division's electronic filing system (EFS). Respondent was provided with a user identification number and initial password allowing access to the EFS.

5. The acknowledgement letter also advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter further advised that it was Respondent's responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To review the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 5.

6. The Division sent correspondence to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 notifying Respondent that the following campaign report(s), or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed: 2022 P5, 2022 P7, and 2022 P7A. The letter(s) included reference to the filing date(s) for the report(s). To review the failure to file correspondence, refer to Exhibit 6.

7. On September 26, 2022, the Division sent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 notifying Respondent that the following campaign report(s), or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed: 2022 P5. The letter was confirmed delivered on September 28, 2022. To review the letter marked "Final Notice" and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 7.

8. On September 23, 2022, the Division sent letters marked “Final Notice” with delivery confirmation to the address provided on the DS-DE 9 notifying Respondent that the following campaign report(s), or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed: 2022 P7 and 2022 P7A. The letters were confirmed delivered on September 28, 2022. To review the letters marked “Final Notice” and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 8.<sup>1</sup>

## **II. Alleged Violation of Sections 106.07(7), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:**

9. I investigated whether Respondent violated these sections of the election laws either by not notifying the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making expenditures during the following reporting period(s) or by not filing campaign report(s) to reflect financial activity for the reporting period(s). To review the filing history, refer to Exhibit 9.

10. Respondent did not respond to the referral.

11. I attempted to contact Respondent on three occasions for the purpose of providing an opportunity to discuss the allegations made in the referral. As of the date of this report, neither my telephone calls nor email have been returned. Therefore, I am unable to ascertain whether he has read Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and/or the *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook*. To review the phone log and email, refer to Exhibit 11.





On October 19, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

**Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2022 candidate for Governor, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because he had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods, as alleged in the complaint:

- 2022 P5
- 2022 P7
- 2022 P7A

**Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:** Respondent, a 2022 candidate for Governor, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during the following reporting periods, as alleged in the complaint:

- 2022 P5
- 2022 P7
- 2022 P7A

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will prepare and present a written Staff Recommendation (SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge you, the Respondent, with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission

will then hold one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed upon you. Notice will be mailed to you and the Complainant at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(i)3., Florida Statutes, the Commission may enter into a consent agreement with a Respondent to settle a complaint prior to a finding of probable cause. If you are interested in entering negotiations directed towards reaching a consent agreement to resolve this matter, please contact the Commission and request to speak with the attorney assigned to this case.

**Please note that all documents related to this matter will be mailed to the above address unless you notify us of a new address.**

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause, unless the Respondent files a written waiver of confidentiality with the Commission. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the Complainant or the Respondent.

Should you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.
