If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

CONSENT FINAL ORDER

Voter Information Network (“Respondent”) and the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) agree that this Consent Order resolves all issues between the parties in this case. The parties jointly stipulate to the following facts, conclusions of law, and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On October 19, 2022, the Commission received a referral from the Florida Division of Elections (“Division”) alleging that Respondent violated Florida’s election laws.
2. On August 30, 2024, the Commission entered an Order of Probable Cause finding there was probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of violating Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes.
3. Respondent has expressed a desire to enter into negotiations directed toward reaching a consent agreement.
4. Respondent and staff stipulate to the following facts:
 - a. Respondent was a political committee registered with the Division.
 - b. Respondent did not notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P7A Report.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this cause, pursuant to Section 106.26, Florida Statutes.

6. The Commission staff and Respondent stipulate that staff can prove the facts in paragraph four above by clear and convincing evidence and to the Commission's ability to impose a civil penalty in this case.

ORDER

7. Respondent and the staff of the Commission have entered into this Consent Order freely and voluntarily.

8. Respondent shall bear its own attorney's fees and costs that are in any way associated with this case.

9. The Commission will consider this Consent Order at its next available meeting.

10. Respondent voluntarily waives the right to any further proceedings under Chapters 104, 106, and 120, Florida Statutes, and the right to appeal this Consent Order.

11. This Consent Order is enforceable under Sections 106.265 and 120.69, Florida Statutes. Respondent expressly waives any venue privileges and agrees that, if enforcement of this Consent Order is necessary, venue shall be in Leon County, Florida, and Respondent shall pay all fees and costs associated with enforcement.

12. Payment of the civil penalty by cashier's check, money order good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check is a condition precedent to the Commission's consideration of this Consent Order.

PENALTY


WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission finds that Respondent violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, and imposes a civil penalty in the amount of **\$50**.

Therefore, it is

ORDERED that Respondent shall remit to the Commission a civil penalty in the amount of **\$50**, inclusive of fees and costs. The civil penalty shall be paid by cashier's check, money order good for at least 120 days, or attorney trust account check. The civil penalty shall be payable to the **Florida Elections Commission** and sent to **107 West Gaines Street, Collins Building, Suite 224, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-6596**.



ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on August 14, 2024, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On April 24, 2024, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On August 26, 2022, Voter Information Network violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P7A Report.

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The Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A HEARING

As the Respondent, you may elect to resolve this case in several ways. First, you may elect to resolve this case by consent order where you and Commission staff agree to resolve the violation(s) and agree to the amount of the fine. The consent order is then presented to the Commission for its approval. To discuss a consent order, contact the FEC attorney identified in the Order of Probable Cause.

Second, you may request an informal hearing held before the Commission, if you do not dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. The date this order was filed appears in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the order. At the hearing, you will have the right to make written or oral arguments to the Commission concerning the legal issues related to the violation(s) and the potential fine. At the request of Respondent, the Commission will consider and determine willfulness at an informal hearing. Otherwise, live witness testimony is unnecessary.

Third, you may request a formal hearing held before an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), if you dispute any material fact in the Staff Recommendation. You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. 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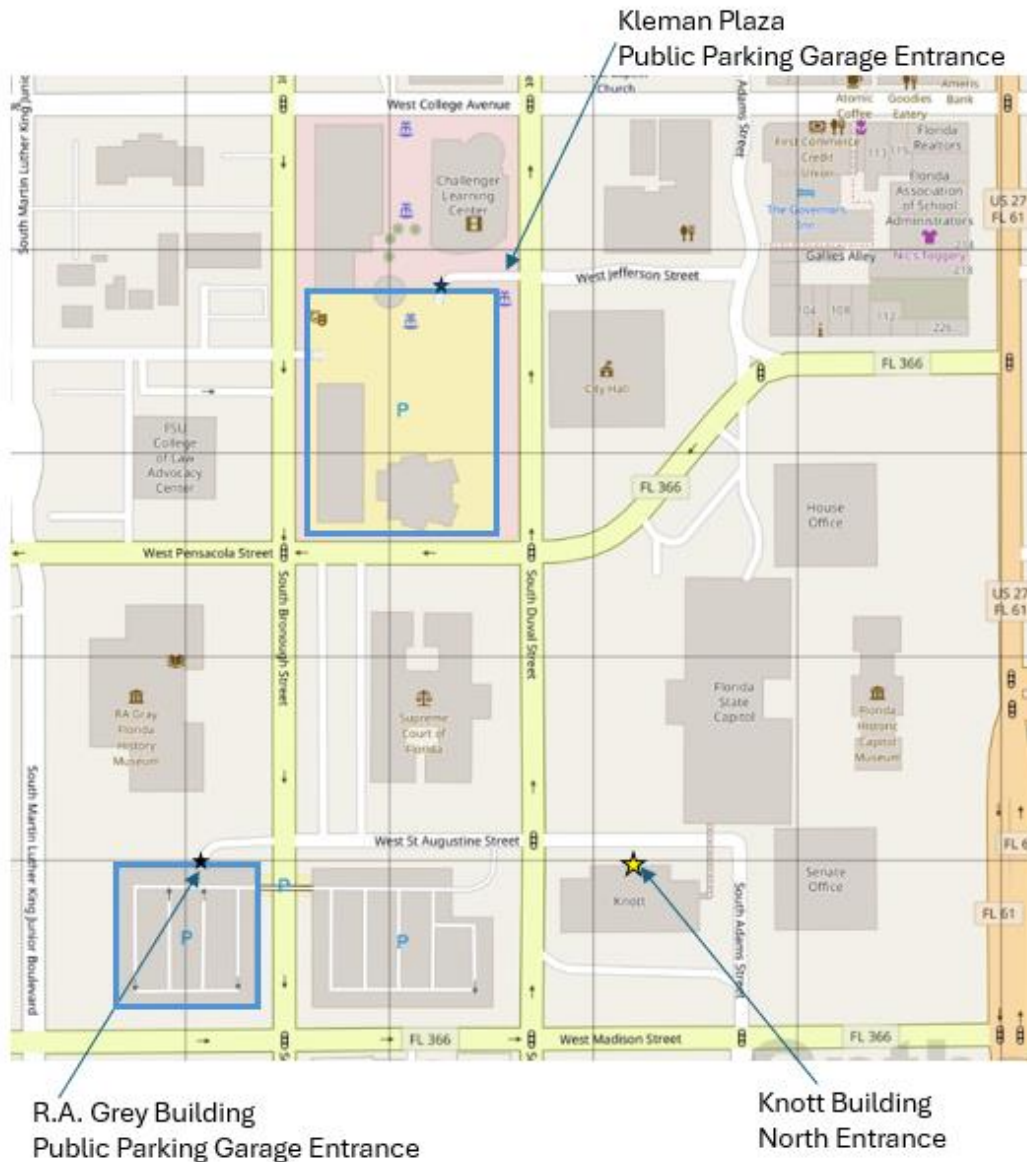

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes**, and that there is **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on January 16, 2024, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On October 19, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Florida Division of Elections (“Division” or “Complainant”) alleging that Voter Information Network (“Respondent”) violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent was a political committee registered with the Division. Greg Fink was appointed to serve as the committee’s chairperson and treasurer. (ROI Exhibit 2, page 1; ROI Exhibit 3, pages 1-2)¹ Respondent’s registration was canceled on April 25, 2023, for failing to file two or more consecutive reports. (ROI Exhibit 1, pages 1 & 3)

3. By letter dated March 17, 2023, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provisions:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during 2022 P7A reporting period.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during 2022 P7A reporting period.

4. By letter dated August 22, 2022, Donna S. Brown, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent a letter acknowledging that the Division had received its Statement of

Organization and Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees forms. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 1)

5. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all political committees filing reports with the Division are required to use the electronic filing system (“EFS”) and provided Respondent with a user identification number and initial password to grant access to the EFS. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 1) The letter further advised Respondent that all the Division’s publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the *Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 2)

6. Respondent’s 2022 P7A Report was due on August 26, 2022; however, Respondent failed to timely file the report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 1) By letters dated August 29, 2022, and September 23, 2020², the Division notified Respondent that the report had not been received. The letters also notified Respondent that it was still required to notify the Division if it had no reportable financial activity. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 1; ROI Exhibit 6, page 1) The final notification letter was confirmed delivered on September 28, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 2)

7. A subpoena was issued to Respondent’s designated campaign depository to ascertain whether any financial activity occurred during the relevant reporting period, i.e., August 19, 2022 – August 19, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 1) Bank records identified two accounts under Respondent’s name; however, neither account reflected financial activity during the identified reporting period. (ROI Exhibit 8, pages 2 & 4)

8. Greg Fink, chairperson and treasurer for Respondent, stated that the Division never gave him a valid password, and he never logged into EFS. Mr. Fink stated that he made at least four requests via email and telephone to reset the password. Mr. Fink stated that the committee had no money, currently has no money, and is not capable of paying any fines. Mr. Fink stated that he ran for office in 2006, served as the chairperson for a political committee, served as a treasurer in another state, read the *Political Committee Handbook* and Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and was very familiar with the contents of both. (ROI Exhibit 10, pages 1-2)

9. The Division’s records indicate that staff called and released credentials to Mr. Fink three days before the report at issue was due. (ROI Exhibit 9, page 1) Respondent requested a password via email on November 16, 2022. (ROI Exhibit 9, pages 2-3) In response to the email, Division staff called and left a voicemail for Mr. Fink about releasing the credentials. The Division’s records do not indicate that Respondent returned staff’s call. (ROI Exhibit 9, page 1)

10. As it appears that Respondent had no financial activity, Respondent was required to notify the filing officer in writing that it would not be filing its 2022 P7A Report on the prescribed reporting date but failed to do so. Thus, it does not appear that Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in its 2022 P7A Report as the report was waived due to a lack of reportable financial activity.

11. “Probable Cause” is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).


12. The facts set forth above show that Respondent was a political committee registered with the Division. Respondent failed to timely file its 2022 P7A Report or notify the filing officer that no report would be filed. It appears that Respondent had no financial activity during the relevant reporting period and, therefore, was required to notify the filing officer in writing that it would not be filing its 2022 P7A Report on the prescribed reporting date but failed to do so. Thus, it does not appear that Respondent falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information in its 2022 P7A Report as the report was waived due to a lack of reportable financial activity.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find **no probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes**, and find **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:


On August 26, 2022, Voter Information Network violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P7A Report.

Sections 106.07(7) and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes, failure of a candidate or political committee that did not receive any contributions or make any expenditures during a reporting period to notify timely the filing officer, in writing, that no report is being filed or failure to file a campaign report to reflect financial activity.

1. Respondent was a political committee formerly registered with the Division. To review the Final Order canceling Respondent's registration, refer to Exhibit 1.

2. An Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository (DS-DE 6) was filed on August 17, 2022. Greg Fink was appointed as campaign treasurer. To review the DS-DE 6, refer to Exhibit 2.

3. Respondent filed a Statement of Organization on August 18, 2022. To review the Statement of Organization, refer to Exhibit 3.

4. An acknowledgement letter was mailed to the address provided on the DS-DE 6 on August 22, 2022, advising Respondent that all political committees filing reports with the Division are required to file by means of the Division's electronic filing system (EFS). Respondent was provided with a user identification number and initial password allowing access to the EFS.

5. The acknowledgement letter also advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms are available on their website, including Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the *Political Committee Handbook*, and the *Calendar of Reporting Dates*. The letter further advised that it was Respondent's responsibility to read, understand, and follow the requirements of Florida's election laws. To review the acknowledgement letter, refer to Exhibit 4.

6. The Division sent correspondence to the address provided on the DS-DE 6 notifying Respondent that the following campaign report(s), or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed: 2022 P7A. The letter(s) included reference to the filing date(s) for the report(s). To review the failure to file correspondence, refer to Exhibit 5.

7. On September 23, 2022, the Division sent a letter marked "Final Notice" with delivery confirmation to the address provided on the DS-DE 6 notifying Respondent that the following campaign report(s), or the required notification that no reportable activity occurred, had not been filed: 2022 P7A. The letter was confirmed delivered on September 28, 2022. To review the letter marked "Final Notice" and delivery confirmation, refer to Exhibit 6.

II. Alleged Violation of Sections 106.07(7), and 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes:

8. I investigated whether Respondent violated these sections of the election laws either by not notifying the filing officer, in writing, that no report would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making expenditures during the following reporting period(s) or by not filing campaign report(s) to reflect financial activity for the reporting period(s). To review the filing history, refer to Exhibit 7.

9. Respondent did not respond to the referral.

10. I called Respondent's Treasurer, Greg Fink, for the purpose of providing an opportunity to discuss the allegations made in the referral. Mr. Fink stated that the Division never gave him a valid EFS password and that he was never able to log on to the EFS. Mr. Fink asserted that he requested numerous times to have the password reset. Mr. Fink further stated that Respondent never had any money. Mr. Fink stated he is familiar with Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and has read it several times. Mr. Fink indicated that he has read and is very familiar with the *Political Committee Handbook*. Division records show that EFS credentials were released to Mr. Fink by phone on August 23, 2022, which was before the due date of the 2022 P7A report. Division records further show that Mr. Fink filed an EFS credential request form with the Division on November 16, 2022. Division staff called Mr. Fink on November 18, 2022, and left a voice mail asking him to contact their office in order to receive new EFS credentials. FINAL ORDER

The Florida Department of State, Division of Elections (the "Division"), pursuant to Section 106.03(7), Florida Statutes, and Rule 1S-2.021, Florida Administrative Code, promulgated thereunder, hereby enters its Final Order canceling the registration of Voter Information Network ("Respondent") as a political committee in the State of Florida. The Division, being fully advised as to the premises, finds and orders as follows:

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Rule 1S-2.021, Florida Administrative Code, establishes procedures for the Division to cancel the registration of a political committee for, among other reasons, when "the committee or organization fails to file 2 or more consecutive reports."

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a registered political committee with the Division of Elections. Respondent's registration number is 83506.

2. On February 1, 2023, the Division mailed an Initial Notice of Intent to Cancel Registration (attached and incorporated by reference) to the most recent address on file for Respondent's chairperson and registered agent. The notice stated that Respondent had failed to file 2 or more consecutive reports. The Initial Notice of Intent to Cancel Registration informed Respondent of the opportunity to provide documentation to the Division to show why the Respondent's registration should not be canceled.

3. The Initial Notice of Intent was not returned as being undeliverable and Respondent did not respond to the Initial Notice of Intent to Cancel Registration.


4. On March 21, 2023, the Division mailed Respondent's registered agent a Final Notice of Intent to Cancel Registration (attached and incorporated by reference). The notice stated that Respondent had failed to file failed to file 2 or more consecutive reports, informed Respondent of the right to a hearing, and advised that if a request for a hearing was not made within 30 days of the date of the notice the right to a hearing would be waived and final action taken by the Division.

5. Respondent did not respond to the Final Notice of Intent to Cancel Registration or otherwise timely request a hearing.

CONCLUSION

Based upon the foregoing and a complete review of the record, it is ORDERED that Respondent's registration as a political committee with the Florida Department of State, Division of Elections, is hereby CANCELED.



If you want to appear personally in the hearing, you must ask to appear in the request for the hearing. If you fail to request a hearing, you waive your right to a hearing and a final order will be issued canceling the committee's registration.

You may still opt to terminate your committee's registration within 15 days of the Final Notice. You are still obligated for any fines or fees imposed automatically by law or by the FEC.

due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the chairperson and campaign treasurer, and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.



Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was August 26, 2022.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

On October 19, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission received a complaint alleging that your committee violated Florida's election laws. I have reviewed the complaint and find that it contains one or more **legally sufficient allegations**. The Commission staff will investigate the following alleged violations:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during 2022 P7A reporting period.

Section 106.19(1)(c), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, may have falsely reported or deliberately failed to include information required by Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, during 2022 P7A reporting period.

When we conclude the investigation, a copy of the Report of Investigation (ROI) will be mailed to you at the above address. Based on the results of the investigation, a staff attorney will prepare and present a written Staff Recommendation (SR) to the Commission as to whether there is probable cause to charge the Respondent with violating Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes. You will have an opportunity to respond to both the ROI and the SR. The Commission will then hold one or more hearings to determine whether the alleged violations occurred and, if so, the amount of the fine to be imposed upon your committee. Notice will be mailed to you and the Complainant at least 14 days before any hearing at which your case is to be considered.

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(i)3., Florida Statutes, the Commission may enter into a consent agreement with a Respondent to settle a complaint prior to a finding of probable cause. If you are
