Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will ***not*** be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

MOTION TO VACATE FINAL ORDER AND RECONSIDER DETERMINATION

COMES NOW, the FLORIDA ELECTIONS COMMISSION (“Commission”) by and through the undersigned counsel, and files this Motion to Vacate Final Order and Reconsider Determination and, in support thereof, states as follows:

1. On February 28, 2024, Gabrielle M. Fox (“Appellant”) filed an appeal of a fine she was assessed by the filing officer for the late filing of her 2023 Q4 report. In her written appeal, Appellant listed her address as “3330 Fairchild Gardens Avenue, 33663, Palm Beach Gardens, FL 33410.” (Attachment A)
2. Appellant’s appeal was scheduled for the Commission’s meeting on August 13, 2024. Notice of the meeting was sent to Appellant’s address, but the notice omitted Appellant’s unit number, which was “33663.” (Attachment B)
3. Appellant’s appeal was considered by the Commission at its meeting on August 13, 2024. Appellant did not appear, and the Commission upheld the fine.
4. On August 22, 2024, the meeting notice sent to Appellant was returned to the Commission due to “insufficient address.” (Attachment C)
5. On August 29, 2024, a letter and copy of the Final Order entered against Appellant was sent to Appellant’s address, but the letter omitted Appellant’s unit number.
6. On September 15, 2024, the letter and Final Order were returned to the Commission due to “insufficient address.” (Attachment D)


7. On October 3, 2024, a second letter with the Final Order was sent to Appellant, but the unit number on the envelope was listed as “33683.” (Attachment E)

8. On March 19, 2025, the second letter and Final Order were returned due to being “Not deliverable as addressed.” (Attachment E)

9. Due to the meeting notice and letters with Final Order being returned due to address errors, Appellant did not receive notice of the August 2024 meeting and did not receive notice of her right to appeal the Final Order.

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing, the undersigned counsel requests that the Commission vacate the Final Order and reconsider its determination of Appellant’s appeal.

To Whom It May Concern,

This notice is to kindly request the fines assessed in regards to the 4th Qtr. 2023 report be removed. The reason for this request is the repeated attempts by the Filing Officer/Candidate to file/mail the DS-DE9 form starting in late December.

The Florida Division of Elections Office should have a record of the repeated calls to confirm receipt and to obtain the PIN needed to file the reports. Without this PIN, the filing was delayed and unable to be completed. The former Campaign Treasurer issued her resignation during the holidays, when perhaps the postal service was overwhelmed.

After failing to receive the DS-DE9 via USPS regular mail, and when I phoned the DOE office was told they would keep looking for it, on January 19, 2024 I then called the FL Division of Elections Office again* and was instructed to send the documents overnight. The documents were again* lost in transit and did not arrive Next Day Air as I had paid for. I called and filed cases with USPS and eventually on Friday, February 2, 2024, after many phone calls between USPS and the FL Division of Elections office, someone from the DOE was sent to the Post Office in Tallahassee to pick up the documents, as they were not delivered to the proper address. Again, the FL DOE office should have a record of this.

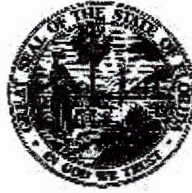
Upon filing the report after receiving the PIN from the Division of Elections office, they contacted me to state that the report had to be amended. I called and someone from the office walked me through the amending.

Although it is regrettable that the report was late, it was certainly not due to lack of effort, as I diligently attempted to file the DS-DE9, obtain the PIN, and file report starting in late December as soon as I was notified I had to do so. I respectfully ask the Florida Election Commission to please consider removing the fine, especially as it is a first time occurrence.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

(Although I did not save the Next Day Air receipt, I can try to contact the USPS customer service and have them send information regarding the cases filed, as they will have all the information.)

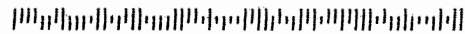

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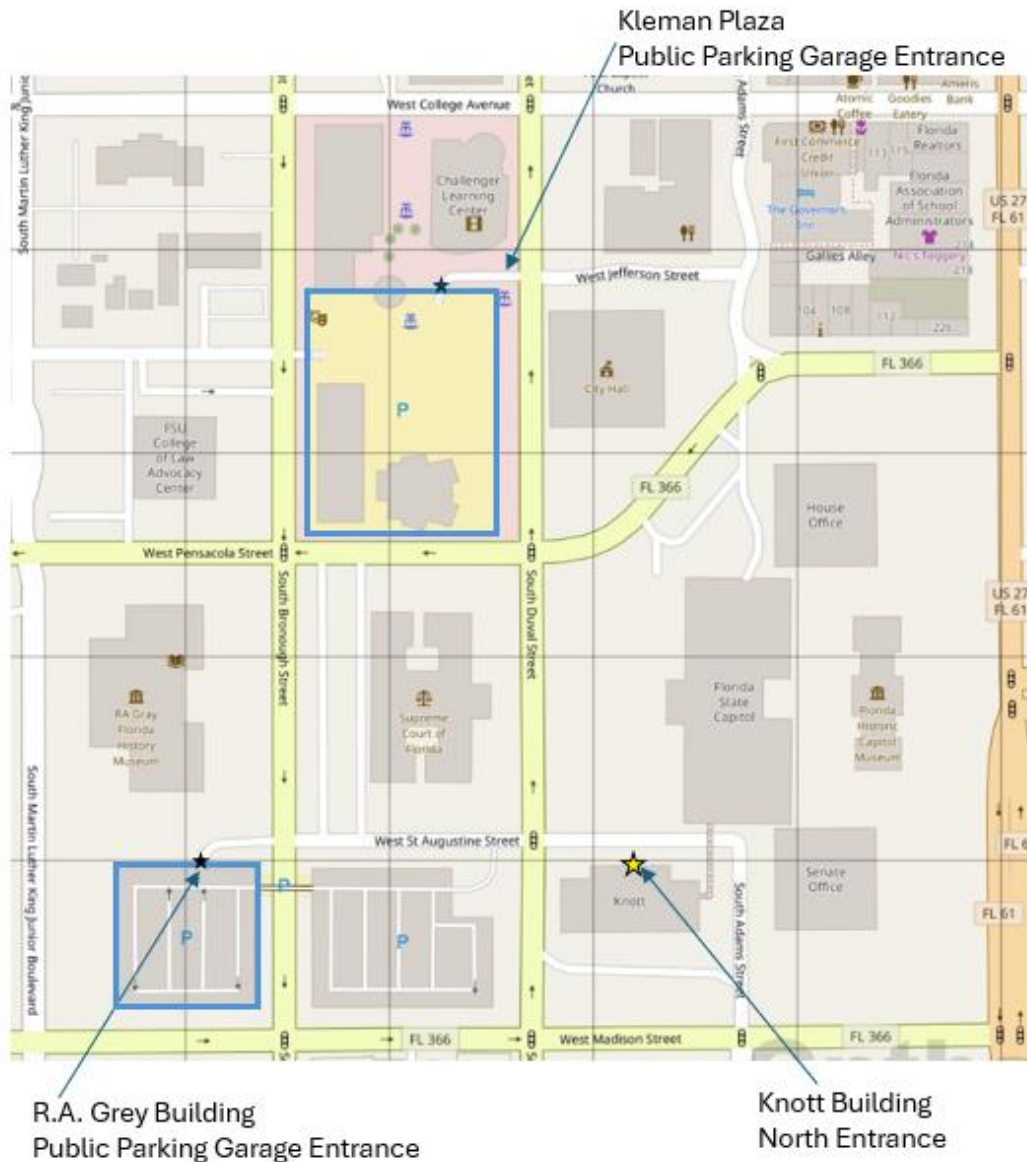

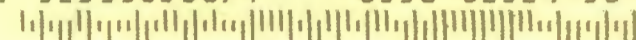

FINAL ORDER

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting held on August 13, 2024, in Tallahassee, Florida.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Commission is charged with enforcing Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, the campaign financing law.
2. Respondent's 2023 Q4 campaign treasurer's report was not filed with the filing officer on January 10, 2024, the designated due date. Instead, the report was filed twenty (20) days late on January 30, 2024.
3. The filing officer fined the Respondent \$370.69 for the late filing of the report. Respondent timely appealed, claiming that her former treasurer resigned during the holidays, and Respondent did not receive the pin numbers from the Division of Elections ("Division") despite submitting her paperwork multiple times and calling the Division. Upon receiving the credentials, Respondent filed the report and subsequently filed amendments with the assistance of Division staff.
4. Respondent was not present at the hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this case, pursuant to Section 106.07, Florida Statutes.

6. While the Division's records confirm the resignation of Respondent's former treasurer, there are no notes or records pertaining to Respondent's contact with the Division or issues with obtaining new credentials. However, Division records do confirm that Respondent's 2023 Q4 was created on January 17, 2024, but not filed until January 30, 2024.

7. Respondent's claim regarding the issues with obtaining the pin and password do not justify Respondent's failure to timely file the report.


8. In determining the amount of the fine, if any, to be waived, the Commission considered the mitigating and aggravating circumstances set forth in Section 106.265(3), Florida Statutes.

ORDER

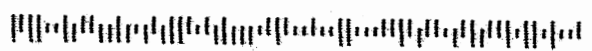
The Florida Division of Elections Office should have a record of the repeated calls to confirm receipt and to obtain the PIN needed to file the reports. Without this PIN, the filing was delayed and unable to be completed. The former Campaign Treasurer issued her resignation during the holidays, when perhaps the postal service was overwhelmed.

After failing to receive the DS-DEBashir9 via USPS regular mail, and when I phoned the DOE office was told they would keep looking for it, on January 19, 2024 I then called the FL Division of Elections Office again* and was instructed to send the documents overnight. The documents were again* lost in transit and did not arrive Next Day Air as I had paid for. I called and filed cases with USPS and eventually on Friday, February 2, 2024, after many phone calls between USPS and the FL Division of Elections office, someone from the DOE was sent to the Post Office in Tallahassee to pick up the documents, as they were not delivered to the proper address. Again, the FL DOE office should have a record of this.

Upon filing the report after receiving the PIN from the Division of Elections office, they contacted me to state that the report had to be amended. I called and someone from the office walked me through the amending.

Although it is regrettable that the report was late, it was certainly not due to lack of effort, as I diligently attempted to file the DS-DE9, obtain the PIN, and file report starting in late December as soon as I was notified I had to do so. I respectfully ask the Florida Election Commission to please consider removing the fine, especially as it is a first time occurrence.
Thank you for your attention to this matter.

She states that upon receiving the credentials, she filed the report and filed amendments with the help of DOE staff. Ms. Fox states that the Division should have a record of their communication.

- The 2023 Q4 Original Report covers the period from 10/01/23-12/31/23; it was due on 01/10/24.
- The 2023 Q4 Queued Transaction Report shows that it was created on 01/17/24 and filed on 01/30/24. The report was also amended on 02/01/24.
- Gabrielle M. Fox reported receiving 4 contributions, while making 9 expenditures.
- The Division of Elections does not have any notes that pertain to Gabrielle M. Fox's 2023 Q4 report.

To Whom It May Concern,

This notice is to kindly request the fines assessed in regards to the 4th Qtr. 2023 report be removed. The reason for this request is the repeated attempts by the Filing Officer/Candidate to file/mail the DS-DE9 form starting in late December.

The Florida Division of Elections Office should have a record of the repeated calls to confirm receipt and to obtain the PIN needed to file the reports. Without this PIN, the filing was delayed and unable to be completed. The former Campaign Treasurer issued her resignation during the holidays, when perhaps the postal service was overwhelmed.

After failing to receive the DS-DE9 via USPS regular mail, and when I phoned the DOE office was told they would keep looking for it, on January 19, 2024 I then called the FL Division of Elections Office again* and was instructed to send the documents overnight. The documents were again* lost in transit and did not arrive Next Day Air as I had paid for. I called and filed cases with USPS and eventually on Friday, February 2, 2024, after many phone calls between USPS and the FL Division of Elections office, someone from the DOE was sent to the Post Office in Tallahassee to pick up the documents, as they were not delivered to the proper address. Again, the FL DOE office should have a record of this.

Upon filing the report after receiving the PIN from the Division of Elections office, they contacted me to state that the report had to be amended. I called and someone from the office walked me through the amending.

Although it is regrettable that the report was late, it was certainly not due to lack of effort, as I diligently attempted to file the DS-DE9, obtain the PIN, and file report starting in late December as soon as I was notified I had to do so. I respectfully ask the Florida Election Commission to please consider removing the fine, especially as it is a first time occurrence.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

(Although I did not save the Next Day Air receipt, I can try to contact the USPS customer service and have them send information regarding the cases filed, as they will have all the information.)

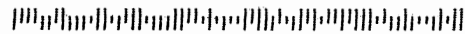



However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the candidate and campaign treasurer, and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.
