NOTICE OF HEARING (INFORMAL HEARING)

A hearing will be held in this case before the Florida Elections Commission on, May 14, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., *or as soon thereafter as the parties can be heard*, at the following location: 412 Knott Building, Pat Thomas Committee Room, 404 South Monroe Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399.

Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 minutes to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have 5 *minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing*. The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

Mr. Lustig:

As you indicated, I sent you an email on January 25, 2024, regarding the language of the minor violation consent order. When you did not respond, my office provided you notice that a probable cause hearing was scheduled on February 7, 2024. Your client did not sign, and my office did not receive the partially executed consent order until February 8, 2024, the day after the hearing.

Therefore, this case is scheduled for an informal hearing on May 14, 2024. I understand that you do not agree with my position regarding the expiration of the offer and maintain that your client had a 120-day period in which to make payment. However, the minor violation consent order states that the funds must be good for at least 120 days, not that your client has 120 days in which to proffer payment.

Since the minor violation consent order was not entered into prior to the probable cause hearing, I can offer to enter into a post-probable cause consent order at this time. Please let me know if your client is interested. Additionally, my office received a letter and cashier's check directly from your client. I wanted to confirm that you are still representing HISPAC and whether the cashier's check should be returned to your client or to your law firm.

Ms. Cunningham

First of all, the consent Order was accepted by the Respondent and same was sent to you on February 8, 2024. The fact that my signature is not there, does not change the acceptance of the offer. Moreover, the Civil penalty addressed in paragraph 12 must be paid during a period of 120 days. That period has not expired yet. Nonetheless, the offer was accepted. Upon submission of the consent order, we did not hear back from you. In terms of your statements concerning the proposed changes, it took you weeks to get back to me concerning the proposed changes.

I asked you on October 30, 2023, to send me the consent order in word. You responded on November 7, 2023 and I followed up again the next day, asking for the document in word and on that day, you sent the word document.

The matter was continued in November based on a message we received on November 16. I followed up with you on January 22, 2024, concerning the proposed changes to the consent order. It was not until January 25, 2024, that you sent an email stating: "The minor violation consent order contains the softest language of any of the consent orders entered by the Elections Commission. The order does not require the Respondent to admit guilt, nor does it find a violation of the Election Code." We returned the signed accepted consent order from the Respondent on February 8, 2024. Therefore, based on the timing when you sent the consent order in January 2024, the lack of period stated for an acceptance, the open window for the Respondent to pay the civil penalty and my client's signature in the document and transmission of same, your position is legally inaccurate.

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Mr. Lustig:

This case was continued on November 15, 2023, to finalize settlement. My office did not receive the signed consent order and payment. The case was noticed for a probable cause hearing. On February 8, 2024, the day after the probable cause hearing, I received a partially executed consent order that was lacking your signature. No settlement funds were provided. As a courtesy, I offered the minor violation consent order again in October of 2023 as your client was not represented when first offered, prior to an investigation. I informed you that I did not believe the Commission would accept your proposed changes to the minor violation consent order. The staff recommendation was drafted in June of 2023 and the probable cause hearing has been delayed twice. The time for acceptance of the minor violation consent order has passed.

Pursuant to the administrative code, my client is entitled to due process. You set a hearing via zoom and now expect our office to travel 14 hours total, to present a position for a maximum amount of time of 5 minutes. If you find probable cause because my side is not represented due to the outrageous nature of the arbitrary change in the manner in which the hearing is conducted, your entire case will be tainted. It is completely unreasonable to change the hearing to in person, when you are dealing with an alleged minor violation, one which involves a reporting issue when the PAC did not even receive or expended funds.

Neither my client nor my office can attend the hearing in person, in Tallahassee. Given the posture of the case, and the fact that you and I have been going back and forth on the resolution of same, it is completely illogical not to move this matter forward, pending the resolution. Therefore, as much as we need this to be continued, you should be agreeing to the same continuance.

In Citizens of State v. Florida Pub. Serv. Com'n, 146 So. 3d 1143, 1154 (Fla. 2014) the court addresses that the "[t]he legislature may determine by what process and procedure legal rights may be asserted and determined provided that the procedure adopted affords reasonable notice and a fair opportunity to be heard before rights are decided." *Peoples Bank* of Indian River Cnty. v. State, Dep't of Banking & Fin., 395 So.2d 521, 524 (Fla.1981). In the administrative arena, due process requirements are found in chapter 120, Florida Statutes, the Florida Administrative Procedure Act ("APA")." Fla. Stat. § 120.68(1)(b) state: "(b) A preliminary, procedural, or intermediate order of the agency or of an administrative law judge of the Division of Administrative Hearings is immediately reviewable if review of the final agency decision would not provide an adequate

remedy."

This preliminary hearing is procedural in nature but it also affects my client's substantive rights. We ae therefore requesting the continuance of same, or a zoom link to appear via zoom for the hearing.

Pursuant to the administrative code, my client is entitled to due process. You set a hearing via zoom and now expect our office to travel 14 hours total, to present a position for a maximum amount of time of 5 minutes. If you find probable cause because my side is not represented due to the outrageous nature of the arbitrary change in the manner in which the hearing is conducted, your entire case will be tainted. It is completely unreasonable to change the hearing to in person, when you are dealing with an alleged minor violation, one which involves a reporting issue when the PAC did not even receive or expended funds. Neither my client nor my office can attend the hearing in person, in Tallahassee. Given the posture of the case, and the fact that you and I have been going back and forth on the resolution of same, it is completely illogical not to move this matter forward, pending the resolution. Therefore, as much as we need this to be continued, you should be agreeing to the same continuance.

In Citizens of State v. Florida Pub. Serv. Com'n, 146 So. 3d 1143, 1154 (Fla. 2014) the court addresses that the "[t]he legislature may determine by what process and procedure legal rights may be asserted and determined provided that the procedure adopted affords reasonable notice and a fair opportunity to be heard before rights are decided." Peoples Bank of Indian River Cnty. v. State, Dep't of Banking & Fin., 395 So.2d 521, 524 (Fla.1981). In the administrative arena, due process requirements are found in chapter 120, Florida Statutes, the Florida Administrative Procedure Act ("APA")." Fla. Stat. § 120.68(1) (b) state: "(b) A preliminary, procedural, or intermediate order of the agency or of an administrative law judge of the Division of Administrative Hearings is immediately reviewable if review of the final agency decision would not provide an adequate remedy."

This preliminary hearing is procedural in nature but it also affects my client's substantive rights. We ae therefore requesting the continuance of same, or a zoom link to appear via zoom for the hearing.

Pursuant to the administrative code, my client is entitled to due process. You set a hearing via zoom and now expect our office to travel 14 hours total, to present a position for a maximum amount of time of 5 minutes. If you find probable cause because my side is not represented due to the outrageous nature of the arbitrary change in the manner in which the hearing is conducted, your entire case will be tainted. It is completely unreasonable to change the hearing to in person, when you are dealing with an alleged minor violation, one which involves a reporting issue when the PAC did not even receive or expended funds. Neither my client nor my office can attend the hearing in person, in Tallahassee. Given the posture of the case, and the fact that you and I have been going back and forth on the resolution of same, it is completely illogical not to move this matter forward, pending the resolution. Therefore, as much as we need this to be continued, you should be agreeing to the same continuance.

In <u>Citizens of State v. Florida Pub. Serv. Com'n</u>, 146 So. 3d 1143, 1154 (Fla. 2014) the court addresses that the "[t]he legislature may determine by what process and procedure legal rights may be asserted and determined provided that the procedure adopted affords reasonable notice and a fair opportunity to be heard before rights are decided." *Peoples Bank of Indian River Cnty. v. State, Dep't of Banking & Fin.,* 395 So.2d 521, 524 (Fla.1981). In the administrative arena, due process requirements are found in chapter 120, Florida Statutes, the Florida Administrative Procedure Act ("APA")." Fla. Stat. § 120.68(1)(b) state: "(b) A preliminary, procedural, or intermediate order of the agency or of an administrative law judge of the Division of Administrative Hearings is immediately reviewable if review of the final agency decision would not provide an adequate remedy."

ORDER OF PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS MATTER was heard by the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 7, 2024, in Tallahassee, Florida.

On June 20, 2023, Staff recommended to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that the Florida Election Code was violated. The facts articulated in Staff's Recommendation are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. Based on the Complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff's Recommendation, and oral statements (if any) made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with the following violation(s):

Count 1:

On or about June 24, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P1 Report.

Count 2:

On or about July 1, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P1A Report.

Count 3:

On or about July 8, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P2 Report.

Count 4:

On or about July 15, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P2A Report.

Count 5:

On or about July 29, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P4 Report.

You have 30 days from the date the Order of Probable Cause is filed with the Commission to request such a hearing. If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing*. The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.

The undersigned represents Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC). We just received a letter dated June 21, 2023, wherein the Agency Clerk attaches a "Staff Recommendation Following Investigation." According to the document, there are five counts alleging a violation of Fla. Stat. Sect. 106.07(7), which states:

(7) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, in any reporting period during which a candidate or political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed, and any candidate or political committee not reporting by virtue of this subsection on dates prescribed elsewhere in this chapter shall notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

Importantly, the filings made by my client are all waivers, as during the reporting period, HISPAC did not receive funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds. Nonetheless, the commission is requesting a finding of probable cause for violation of the above referenced statute when reports were filed indicating no financial activity. In that regard, we request that you take this response as the response to the Staff Recommendation Following Investigation, and request that you do not proceed with the presentation of the matter to the Commission. It appears, from review of the "Staff Recommendation Following Investigation" that the concern involves the no of days in which a report was filed late. However, that specific report was subject to a waiver. Hence, there is no reasonable grounds of suspicion to warrant HISPAC to believe that it would be committing the offense charged. See Schmitt v. State, 590 So.2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). In that regard, there is no sufficient information for a reasonable person to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. See Department of Highways Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

We are requesting that you provide our office with a copy of each and every single one of the filings discussed in the chart contained in paragraph 8 of the Staff Recommendation Following Investigation. Moreover, we request that you provide us with the identification of all persons who spoke to Mr. Sam Roman over the phone concerning the fine that the Commission was considering to issue. Moreover, we would like a copy of all logs, and the multiple calls made to the Commission and made by the Commission concerning this matter, as well as a copy of the entire investigation file. In addition, please provide the name of the filing officer of the Commission that was on duty on the prescribed reporting period.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to Section 106.25(4)(c), Florida Statutes, undersigned staff counsel files this written recommendation for disposition of the referral in this case recommending that there is **probable cause** to charge Respondent with violating **Section 106.07(7)**, **Florida Statutes**. Based upon a thorough review of the Report of Investigation submitted on March 14, 2023, the following facts and law support this staff recommendation:

1. On September 14, 2022, the Florida Elections Commission ("Commission") received a referral from the Department of State, Division of Elections ("Division" or "Complainant"), alleging that Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) ("Respondent") violated Chapter 106, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division. (ROI Exhibit 2)¹

3. By letter dated October 13, 2022, the Executive Director notified Respondent that Commission staff would investigate the following statutory provision:

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2022 P1
- 2022 P1A
- 2022 P2
- 2022 P2A
- 2022 P4
- 2022 P5

4. By letter dated February 12, 2020, Kristi Reid Willis, Chief, Bureau of Election Records, sent Respondent's chairperson and treasurer a letter acknowledging that the Division had received its Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Political Committees form. (ROI Exhibit 3)

Staff Recommendation FEC 22-340

¹ The Report of Investigation is referred to herein as "ROI."

5. The acknowledgment letter advised Respondent that all of the Division's publications and reporting forms were available on its website and directed Respondent to print out the *Calendar of Reporting Dates* as well as other relevant documents. (ROI Exhibit 3, page 2)

6. Pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, in any reporting period during which a political committee has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. However, the political committee is required to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

7. The *Political Committee Handbook* references the statutory requirement regarding written notification and directs political committees to notify the Division by way of the Division's electronic filing system. (ROI Exhibit 4, page 2) The *Political Committee EFS User's Guide* shows the process through which to notify the Division. The user's guide instructs political committees to select the relevant reporting period and place a checkmark in a box titled "Waiver" to indicate the lack of reportable financial activity. (ROI Exhibit 5, page 2)

8. Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for the following reporting periods, as set forth in the table below. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 1)

9. With regard to the Division's allegation that Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed for the 2022 P5 reporting period, the Division's records show that Respondent submitted the notice on August 4, 2022, one day prior to the designated due date. (ROI Exhibit 6, page 1; ROI Exhibit 8) Therefore, Respondent did not fail to timely notify the filing officer that no report would be filed for the 2022 P5 reporting period.

10. Respondent failed to respond to Commission staff's investigation. (ROI Exhibit 7; ROI, p. 2, ¶¶ 9-10)

11. "Probable Cause" is defined as reasonable grounds of suspicion supported by circumstances sufficiently strong to warrant a cautious person in the belief that the person has committed the offense charged. *Schmitt v. State*, 590 So. 2d 404, 409 (Fla. 1991). Probable cause

exists where the facts and circumstances, of which an [investigator] has reasonably trustworthy information, are sufficient in themselves for a reasonable man to reach the conclusion that an offense has been committed. *Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles v. Favino*, 667 So. 2d 305, 309 (Fla. 1st DCA 1995).

12. The facts set forth above show that Respondent is a political committee registered with the Division. Respondent failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting dates that no reports would be filed for the following reporting periods: 2022 P1, 2022 P1A, 2022 P2, 2022 P2A, and 2022 P4.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, I recommend that the Commission find probable cause to charge Respondent with violating the following:

Count 1:

On or about June 24, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P1 Report.

Count 2:

On or about July 1, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P1A Report.

Count 3:

On or about July 8, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P2 Report.

Count 4:

On or about July 15, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P2A Report.

Count 5:

On or about July 29, 2022, Hispanic Political Action Committee (HISPAC) violated Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes, when it

failed to notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that it would not be filing its 2022 P4 Report.

6. The *Political Committee Handbook* discusses filing a waiver when there is no activity to disclose. To review the relevant page of the *Handbook*, refer to Exhibit 4.

7. The *Political Committee EFS User's Guide* discusses how to notify the Division on the prescribed reporting date that no report will be filed using the EFS. Specifically, the *Handbook* instructs the user to click the box next to "waiver" if there is no activity to disclose. To review the relevant pages from the *EFS User's Guide*, refer to Exhibit 5.

8. I investigated whether Respondent violated this section of the election laws by not timely notifying the filing officer, in writing, that no report(s) would be filed due to not receiving any contributions or making expenditures during the following reporting period(s). due date, the report will be accepted as timely filed if filed no later than midnight, Eastern Standard Time, of the first business day the EFS becomes operable. No fine will be levied during the period the EFS was inoperable.

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date is subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater and general election, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

Electronic Receipts

The person submitting the report on the EFS will be issued an electronic receipt indicating and verifying the report was filed. Each campaign treasurer's report filed by means of the EFS is considered to be under oath by the chairperson and campaign treasurer, and such persons are subject to the provisions of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.

Instructions and Assistance

Any political committee required to file reports with a filing officer other than the Division must file reports on the 60th day immediately preceding the primary election and bi-weekly on each Friday thereafter through and including the 4th day immediately preceding the general election, with additional reports due on the 25th and 11th days before the primary election and the general election.

Unless the electronic filing requirements of Section <u>106.0705</u>, Florida Statutes, apply, reports shall be filed no later than 5 p.m. of the day designated. A report postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than midnight of the day designated is deemed timely filed. A report received by the filing officer within five days after the designated due date that was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service is deemed timely filed unless it has a postmark indicating the report was mailed after the designated due date. A certificate of mailing obtained from and dated by the U.S. Postal Service at the time of mailing or a receipt from an established courier company, which bears a date on or before the date on which the report is due, is proof of mailing in a timely manner.

Reports filed with the Division through the <u>Electronic Filing System</u> (<u>EFS</u>) are due no later than midnight, Eastern Time, of the due date.

(Sections <u>106.07</u>, <u>106.0705</u>, and <u>106.141</u>, Fla. Stat.; Chapter 11: Electronic Filing of Campaign Reports)

Penalty for Late Filing

Any political committee failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of \$50 per day for the first three days late and, thereafter, \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for the reports due immediately prior to the primary and general elections, the fine shall be \$500 per day for each late day, not to exceed 25 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the primary and general elections or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

(Section <u>106.07(8)</u>, Fla. Stat.)


When there has been no reportable activity in the campaign account during a reporting period (no funds expended or received) the filing of the report is waived. However, the political committee **must notify the filing officer in writing on or before the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date**. (A notice of no activity filed with the Division must be filed electronically using the <u>EFS</u>.) The next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed.

Section 106.07(7), Florida Statutes: As alleged in the complaint, Respondent, a political committee registered with the Division of Elections, failed to notify the filing officer on the prescribed reporting date that no report would be filed on that date because it had not received funds, made contributions, or expended reportable funds during the following reporting periods:

- 2022 P1
- 2022 P1A
- 2022 P2
- 2022 P2A
- 2022 P4
- 2022 P5

However, prior to an investigation, you have the option to <u>resolve your case now by</u> signing a minor violation consent order and <u>paying a fine of \$300</u>, per Rule 2B-1.003, Florida Administrative Code, <u>rather than the potential \$1,000 per violation</u> provided for in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes.
