## STAFF MEMORANDUM

This matter is scheduled as an appeal of an automatic fine imposed by the Division of Elections (“Division” or “Filing Officer”) against Gloria R. Walker (“Appellant”) following the late filing of the 2023 M4 Report pursuant to Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes.

Appellant was the incumbent candidate for Circuit Judge, Circuit 8, Group 8, in the 2024 elections. Appellant’s 2023 M4 Report was due on May 10, 2023. The Division mailed Appellant a letter on May 11, 2023, stating that no submission was received for the reporting period and instructing Appellant to file either a report or a “notification that no reportable activity occurred” (“waiver” or “notice of no report”). Appellant was informed that automatic fines would be assessed for reports, but no automatic fines would be assessed for notices alerting the Filing Officer as to no activity.

On May 16, 2023, Appellant submitted a waiver of the 2023 M4 Report pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Fla. Stat. On July 23, 2024, over one (1) year later, Appellant filed the 2023 M4 Report under Section 106.07(1), Fla. Stat. The report reflected one (1) cash contribution from Appellant totaling \$8,000.00. Pursuant to Section 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat., the Division assessed a fine of \$2,000.00 based on twenty-five (25) percent of the campaign’s receipts. Three (3) weeks later, Appellant modified the transaction’s date and contributor type.

The Division did not submit a separate referral to the Commission under Sections 106.07(8)(d) and 106.25(2), Fla. Stat., to examine the untimely waiver under Section 106.07(7), Fla. Stat., the excessive cash contribution under Section 106.09, Fla. Stat., or the report’s errors under Section 106.07(5), Fla. Stat. Therefore, the Commission does not have authority to examine the report’s contents at the automatic fine hearing.

The Commission’s objective for automatic fine appeals is to determine whether the aggrieved party’s report was timely filed and, if not, whether the party demonstrated unusual circumstances—or other circumstances beyond the party’s control—that directly caused the report to be late. Fla. Admin. Code R. 2B-1.005(3); § 106.07(8)(c), Fla. Stat.; *Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook* (2022), page 74. Unusual circumstances are rare or sudden events that directly prevented the party from timely filing. Fla. Admin. Code R. 2B-1.0055(1). Examples of unusual circumstances include natural disasters and emergencies; death, illness, disability, or necessary surgery of the candidate, treasurer, or immediate family thereof; and unanticipated technological failures. Most of the subsections enumerate corroborative evidence that the aggrieved party needs to provide for the claim, such as a newspaper article, death certificate, or a physician’s certification on professional letterhead. Fla. Admin. Code R. 2B-1.0055(1)(a)-(d). The Division’s Advisory Opinion, DE 91-02 (1991), specifies that, “before the FEC may label these occurrences as ‘unusual circumstances,’ the FEC must determine that the persons involved took all steps necessary to ensure that a timely report was filed.”


The submission at issue before the Commission is the 2023 M4 Report filed on July 23, 2024, which discloses one (1) contribution, rather than the notice of no report filed on May 16, 2023. Campaign reports contain all contributions received and all expenditures made during a reporting period. § 106.07(1) and (4), Fla. Stat. A candidate with no activity may waive the required report for a specified period under Section 106.07(7), Fla. Stat., but must notify the filing officer in writing that “no report is being filed.” *Handbook*, page 54. Candidates filing with the Division do so by selecting the “waiver” option in the Division’s Electronic Filing System (“EFS”). § 106.0705(2)(a); *Candidate EFS User’s Guide*, page 13; *Handbook*, page 54. A waiver filed pursuant to Section 106.07(7), Fla. Stat., is not a report but a notice stating that no report has

been filed due to no reportable activity; however, the Commission may choose to consider a party's reasons for filing a waiver under mitigating and aggravating circumstances as outlined in Section 106.265(3), Fla. Stat.

Rule 2B-1.005(2), Fla. Admin. Code, specifies that the appealing party has twenty (20) days from acceptance of the appeal to submit any documents supporting the appeal. The Commission accepted the appeal on December 9, 2024; however, as of July 31, 2025, no initial statement or documentation has been filed explaining why the 2023 M4 Report was untimely. Based on the documentation presented to the Commission via the Filing Officer, the report is not timely, and no unusual circumstances apply.

The Commission may assess Appellant's statements, if Appellant attends the hearing, under mitigating and aggravating circumstances as outlined under Section 106.265(3), Fla. Stat., and may choose to accept or reject any late documentation presented to substantiate Appellant's claim(s).

**SUMMARY:** The Honorable Gloria Walker was a candidate for Circuit Judge, Circuit 8, Group 8, in the 2024 elections. Judge Walker was her own treasurer.

Judge Gloria Walker submitted a Notice of Appeal stating, "Appellant shall make herself available for a hearing." No further details were provided with the appeal.

- The 2023 M4 Original Report covers the period from 04/10/23-04/30/23; it was due on 05/10/23.
- The 2023 M4 Queued Transaction Report shows that it was created and filed on 05/16/23.<sup>1</sup>
- Judge Walker reported receiving 1 contribution from herself while making zero expenditures.
- FEC staff was advised, "The candidate filed a notice of no activity (waiver) on 05/16/23. A waiver is not a report. On 07/23/24, the candidate filed a report showing \$8,000.00 of activity. The fine is based on 25% of the activity."
- The Division of Elections has two notes that pertain to Gloria Walker's 2023 M4 Report. The first entry on May 16, 2023, stated that Judge Walker was given the wrong reporting date of July 10, 2023, instead of May 10, 2023. The second entry on December 2, 2024, involved Division staff explaining to Judge Walker why a fine was assessed.

Dear Judge Walker:

The notification that you had no reportable activity for the report deadline of May 10, 2023, was not filed until May 16, 2023. Although the notification is late, no automatic fine is assessed because you had no receipts or expenditures during this reporting period.

However, to avoid potential issues in the future, please note that state law (s. 106.07(7), Fla. Stat.) requires you to file by the dates set out also in law, either a campaign finance report or if applicable, a notification that no reportable activity occurred for the reporting period. Failure to do may constitute a violation of sections 106.07(1) and 106.19(1)(c), Fla. Stat. The Division is required to notify the Florida Elections Commission of any apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat., or any failure to file a report or information required by chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If a matter is referred to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may assess a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation.

Dear Judge Walker:

Our records indicate that you have not filed either your campaign treasurer's report or notification that no reportable activity occurred, whichever is applicable. The filing date was May 10, 2023.

The law (s. 106.07(8)(b), Fla. Stat.) requires the filing officer to immediately notify you about the missed filing date and the automatic fines that will be assessed for late filing of a report, if a report was due.

- If reportable activity occurred and you have not filed a report, statutory fines are automatically assessed as follows until you file your report:
  - \$50 per day for the first 3 days late
  - \$500 per day for each day after the 3rd day late
  - If the required report immediately precedes a primary and general election, the automatic fine is \$500 for each late day.

The total fine for the untimely report cannot exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the cover period. Even if you end up filing your report late, we cannot waive the statutory fines. We will notify you of the specific amount of fines owed once you file your report. You have 20 days from the day you receive the notice to pay the fine or to appeal the fine to the Florida Elections Commission.

- If no reportable activity occurred for the report date(s), you are still required to notify us in writing, via the Division's Electronic Filing System, that no reportable activity occurred. No automatic fines are statutorily assessed.

However, in all cases, failure to file and/or untimely filing of a report of reportable activity, or if applicable, a notice that no reportable activity occurred, may constitute an apparent violation of chapter 106, Fla. Stat. If we refer such matter to the Florida Elections Commission, the Commission may subsequently impose a civil penalty for each violation under chapter 106.265(1), Fla. Stat.



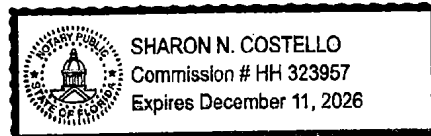


