A hearing will be held in this case before the Florida Elections Commission on **February 7, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the parties can be heard**, at the following location: **402 South Monroe Street, 12 HOB, Tallahassee, Florida 32399**. Due to heightened security access requirements, please bring only essential items into the building and plan to arrive early to allow for delays coming through security.

Failure to appear in accordance with this notice will constitute a waiver of your right to participate in the hearing. Continuances will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

This hearing will be conducted pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, which governs your participation as follows:

If you are the Respondent, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission. However, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless you request to be heard or the Commission requests that your case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, your case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are the Complainant, you may attend the hearing, but you will *not* be permitted to address the Commission. In addition, some cases (including those in which consent orders or recommendations for no probable cause are being considered) may be decided by an *en masse* vote and, unless the Respondent requests to be heard or the Commission requests that the case be considered separately on the day of the hearing, the case will *not* be individually heard.

If you are an Appellant, and you have requested a hearing, you may attend the hearing, and you or your attorney will have *5 minutes* to present your case to the Commission.

Please be advised that both confidential and public cases are scheduled to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission on this date. As an Appellant, Respondent or Complainant in one case, you will *not* be permitted to attend the hearings on other confidential cases.

The Commission will electronically record the meeting. Although the Commission's recording is considered the official record of the hearing, the Respondent may provide, at his own expense, a certified court reporter to also record the hearing.

Please refer to the information below for further instructions related to your particular hearing:

If this is a hearing to consider **an appeal from an automatic fine**, the Filing Officer has imposed a fine on you for your failure to file a campaign treasurer's report on the designated due date and, by filing an appeal, you have asked the Commission to consider either (1) that the report was in fact timely filed; or (2) that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure to file the report timely. You are required to prove your case. If the Commission finds that the report was filed timely or that there were unusual circumstances that excused the failure, it may waive the fine, in whole or in part. The Commission may reduce a fine after considering the factors in Section 106.265, Florida Statutes. If the Commission finds that the report was not timely filed and there were no unusual circumstances, the fine will be upheld.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order before a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed and become public. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the case will remain confidential, unless confidentiality has been waived.

If this is a hearing to consider a **consent order after a determination of probable cause has been made**, the Commission will decide whether to accept or reject the consent order. If the Commission accepts the consent order, the case will be closed. If the Commission rejects the consent order or does not make a decision to accept or deny the consent order, the Respondent will be entitled to another hearing to determine if the Respondent committed the violation(s) alleged.

If this is a **probable cause hearing**, the Commission will decide if there is probable cause to believe that the Respondent committed a violation of Florida's election laws. Respondent should be prepared to explain how the staff in its recommendation incorrectly applied the law to the facts of the case. *Respondent may not testify, call others to testify, or introduce any documentary or other evidence at the probable cause hearing.* The Commission will only decide whether Respondent should be *charged* with a violation and, before the Commission determines whether a violation has occurred or a fine should be imposed, Respondent will have an opportunity for another hearing at which evidence may be introduced.

If this is an **informal hearing**, it will be conducted pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes; Chapter 28 and Commission Rule 2B-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. At the hearing, the Commission will decide whether the Respondent committed the violation(s) charged in the Order of Probable Cause. The Respondent will be permitted to testify. However, the Respondent may not call witnesses to testify.

Respondent may argue why the established facts in the Staff Recommendation do not support the violations charged in the Order of Probable Cause. At Respondent's request, the Commission may determine whether Respondent's actions in the case were willful. The Respondent may also address the appropriateness of the recommended fine. If Respondent claims that his limited resources make him unable to pay the statutory fine, *he must provide the Commission with written proof of his financial resources* at the hearing. A financial affidavit form is available from the Commission Clerk.



SUMMARY: Brian Staver was a candidate for State Representative, District 54 in the 2022 elections. Sherri Staver was his treasurer.

Brain Staver is appealing the fine claiming that his report was late “due to unexpected family issues concerning [his] disabled daughter’s eviction (due to COVID issues) notice from ESSEX house in San Jose, CA”. According to Mr. Staver, they had to find a place for their daughter to live. He apologizes for the delay in filing the report.

Attorney Mark Herron appeared on behalf of the respondent and filed supplemental information. He stated Mr. Staver had difficulty obtaining information from ActBlue and his bank. He also notes that Mr. Staver was dealing with his daughter and parents’ medical issues while preparing for a hurricane.

- The 2022 G5 Original Report covers the period from 10/08/22-10/21/22; it was due on 10/28/22.
- The 2022 G5 Queued Transaction Report shows that it was created on 10/31/22 and filed on 11/01/22.
- Brian Staver reported receiving 9 contributions, while making 10 expenditures.
- The Division of Elections provided one note pertaining to Brian Staver’s 2022 G5 report. On 12/07/22, DOE staff responded to an email sent from Mr. Staver, called, and provided information about the appeal process.

Appeal of Fines Imposed for Late-Filed Campaign Treasurer's Reports

Brian Staver, through undersigned counsel, submits this late-filed appeal of the fines imposed by the Division of Elections in connection with late filed campaign treasurer's reports. With respect to this appeal, Mr. Staver requests a hearing before the Florida Elections Commission ("FEC").

In support of this appeal and request for hearing, Mr. Staver states:

Treasurer's Report Due October 7, 2022

1. On or about October 24, 2022, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the campaign treasurer's report that was due on October 7, 2022, was filed on October 11, 2022 and that a late fine of \$400.00 had been assessed. (Exhibit 1.)

2. On or about January 20, 2023 10, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a second letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the campaign treasurer's report that was due on October 7, 2022, was filed on October 11, 2022 and that a late fine of \$400.00 had been assessed. (Exhibit 2.)

3. The Calendar of Reporting Dates for 2022 Candidates (other than statewide candidates) registered with the Division of Elections does not list a campaign treasurer's report that was due on October 7, 2022. (Exhibit 3.)

Treasurer's Report Due October 28, 2022

4. On or about November 17, 2022, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the 2022 G5 campaign treasurer's report that was due on October 28, 2022, was filed on November 1, 2022 and that a late fine of \$485.15 had been assessed. (Exhibit 4.)

5. On or about January 20, 2023, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a second letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the 2022 G5 campaign treasurer's report that was due on October 28, 2022, was filed on November 1, 2022 and that a late fine of \$485.15 had been assessed. (Exhibit 5.)

Treasurer's Report Due November 4, 2022

6. On or about November 7, 2022, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the campaign treasurer's report that was due on November 4, 2022, had not been filed. (Exhibit 6.)

7. On or about January 20, 2023, Donna Brown, Chief, Bureau of Elections Records, sent a letter to Mr. Staver indicating that the 2022 G6 campaign treasurer's report that was due on November 4, 2022, was filed on November 10, 2022 and that a late fine of \$1,199.82 had been assessed. (Exhibit 7.)

Communications With Undersigned Counsel

8. On January 27, 2023, Mr. Staver contacted undersigned counsel's office seeking representation in connection with these matters and, as a result of his conversation with staff, came away with the impression that undersigned counsel agreed to represent him in these matters. However, at that time undersigned counsel had not agreed to represent Mr. Staver.

9. On March 17, 2023, Mr. Staver again contacted undersigned counsel's office seeking representation in these matters and this time spoke with undersigned counsel who agreed to represent Mr. Staver in these matters.

Appeal of Fine Imposed

10. Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes, authorizes a candidate to appeal or dispute a fine imposed by the Division of Elections, based upon, but not limited to, unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file on the designated due date. The candidate may request and shall be entitled to a hearing before the FEC, which shall have the authority to waive the fine in whole

or in part. The FEC must consider the mitigating and aggravating circumstances contained in Section 106.265(2) when determining the amount of a fine, if any, to be waived.

11. During these reporting periods, Mr. Staver was having a very difficult time retrieving information from ActBlue and the bank that would need to be reported. Mr. Staver was also dealing with several issues concerning his eldest daughter who has both mental and physical issues requiring a great deal of my attention during this period and continuing to this day. These issues include Fibromyalgia, Gittelsmans syndrome, abusive mother, PTSD, rape, anxiety disorder, and arranging for her move from California to Florida. Mr. Staver can provide full medical documentation to verify the above. During this time, Mr. Staver was also running a campaign, preparing for a hurricane, and issues with his mother and father who are in their late 80s and are showing issues associated with Alzheimer's and dementia.

Conclusion

Based on the foregoing, Mr. Staver respectfully requests that the FEC take up this late-filed appeal, grant him hearing a hearing as requested, and waive the assessed fine, in whole or in part, based on the standards set out in Section 106.07(8)(c), Florida Statutes.


